



Sign is not blocking Right-of-Way

Sign Regulations

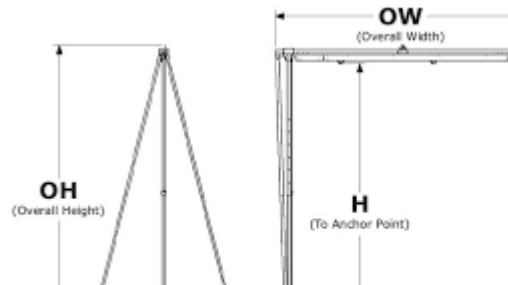
- No more than one per business. Any additional sandwich board sign will require a permit fee and additional registration. Two signs maximum for each business.
- Shall not exceed 4'feet in height, measured from grade to the highest point of the sign
- Shall not exceed 30" inches in width at its widest point
- Shall not be located in any median
- Shall be removed from the right-of-way at the close of every business day
- Shall be located in front of the business for which it advertises

Rules for placing A-frame signs in City of Alpine

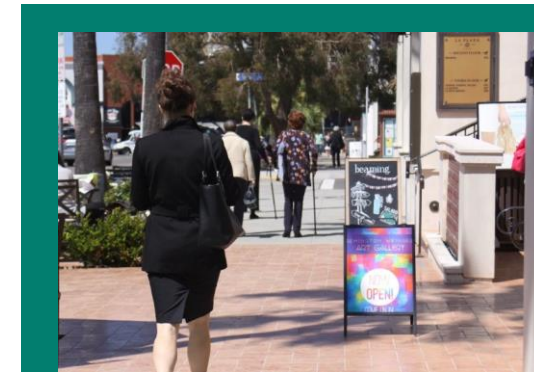
Signs may not be placed in parking spaces, pedestrian pathways, street corners, transient stop, ADA accessways and ramps, at building exits or fire escapes, in any portion of the street, or impede the vision of drivers.

Allowed hours of placement

- Everyday 8:00am-11:00p.m.

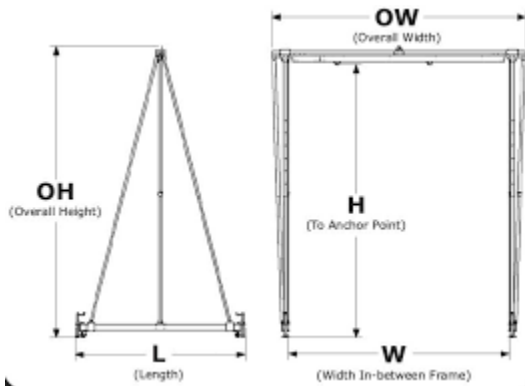

Correct placement of signs

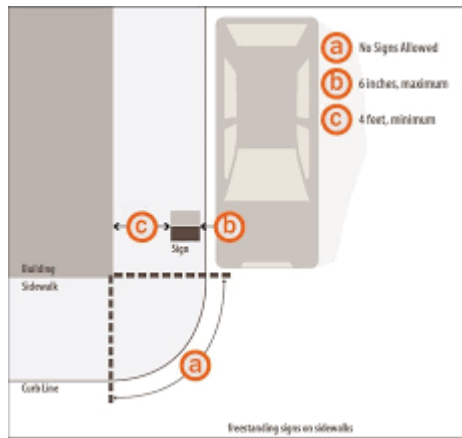
- Must be outside of pedestrian way, so as to protect the free flow of pedestrians along the sidewalk



4' feet OH x 30" inches OW x 24" L
Maximum

A-Frame Sign

Design must be an A-frame sandwich design made of wood, plastic or metal. Be portable. Not illuminated. Be no larger than 6 feet square per side



Correct location of signs

Register your A-frame sign

The City of Alpine requires registration of A-Frame signs. Please provide a photo of your sandwich board sign and fill out the required Right-of-Way sign permit. Code Enforcement will assign a number to your sign. If you do not have a registered numbered sign and permit, code enforcement may write you a citation.
