







STRAY INTAKES COMPARED 2020,2021




INTAKES BY WARD




WARDS COMPARED 2019, 2020, 2021 CATS NOT INCLUDING FERALS




WARDS COMPARED 2019, 2020, 2021 DOGS



FERAL CAT INTAKE CONTINUED...





TRAP NEUTER RETURN PROGRAM NUMBERS 2020-2021


- Stats provided by Big Bend Pets
- Chart shows 2020 and 2021
- Total cats in 2020: 173
- Total cats in 2021: 197
- Most TNR is being done in Wards 2 and 4





SURRENDERS

- We had 96 surrenders
- 8 cats and 88 dogs
- 32 dogs were a result of a hoarder case
- 4 dogs were a result of bite incidents



RETURNED TO OWNER

Out of 361 stray intakes 220 were returned to their owner. Out of 123 cats, Only 35 were reclaimed and out of 236 dogs 185 were reclaimed.


3 dogs were returned after quarantine

6 dogs and 1 cat returned after hearing

4 dogs returned to friend or family after owner passed away

15 dogs returned to owner or relative after owner arrest

5 dogs returned after being held for search warrant



ADOPTIONS

- We had 124 adoptions
- 77 cats
- 47 dogs
- 1 chicken
- 5 animals were returned after adoption 1 cat and 4 dogs











TRANSPORTS

• We transported 98 animals to other rescues

-20 cats


•78 dogs



OTHER OUTCOMES

- Died in care: 4 puppies due to parvo, 1 cat due to illness, 1 kitten from seizure warrant due to medical issues, 1 kitten due to medical issues, 3 kittens due to illness
- Euthanized: 1 cat for medical reasons, 1 dog from county due to bite incident, 3 dogs due to bite incident, 1 dog due to aggressive behavior, 1 dog due to surrender after aggressive behavior and past bites in the home, 1 kitten due to illness, 1 senior cat due to failure to thrive.





MICROCHIPPING

- 8 cats and 29 dogs




ANIMAL BITES THIS YEAR

FOODS

- Alcohol
- Bones
- Candy
- Citrus and pits
- Coffee
- Raw eggs
- Grapes and raisins
- Leaves and stems
- Nuts
- Onions
- Salt

Keep trash hidden or in a secure container at all times.
