- Updated information will be posted at Municipal Court Building and website

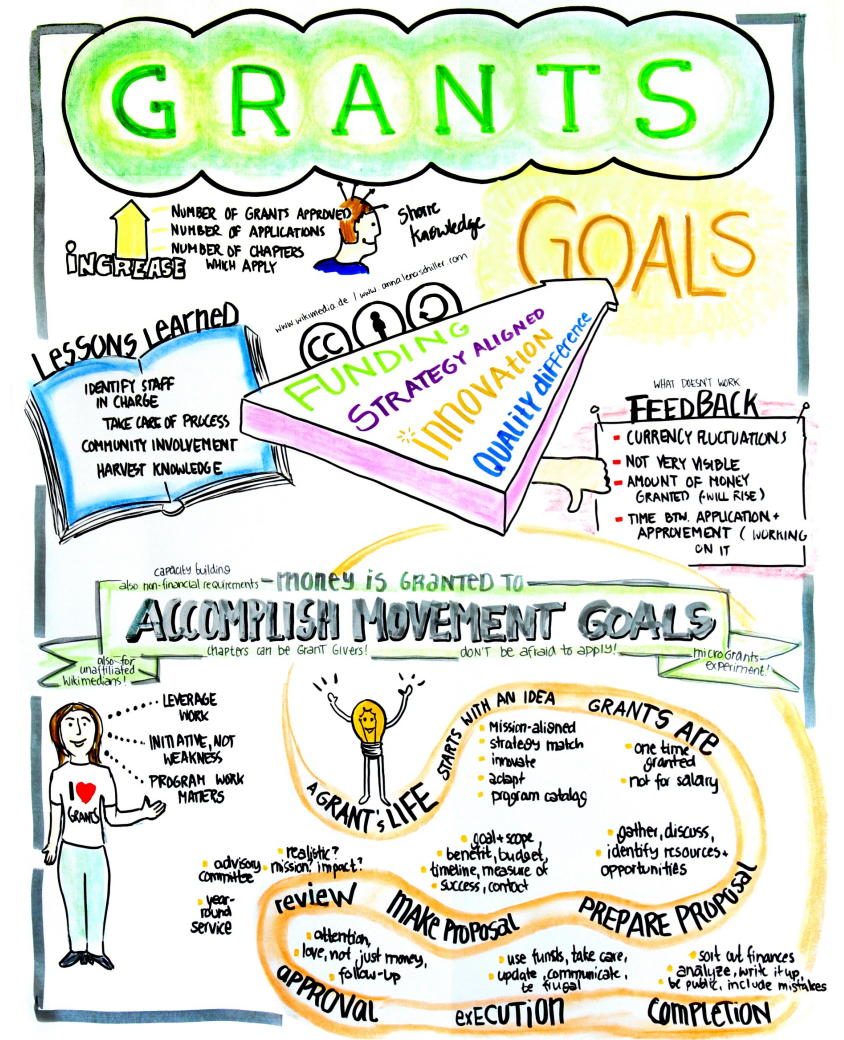

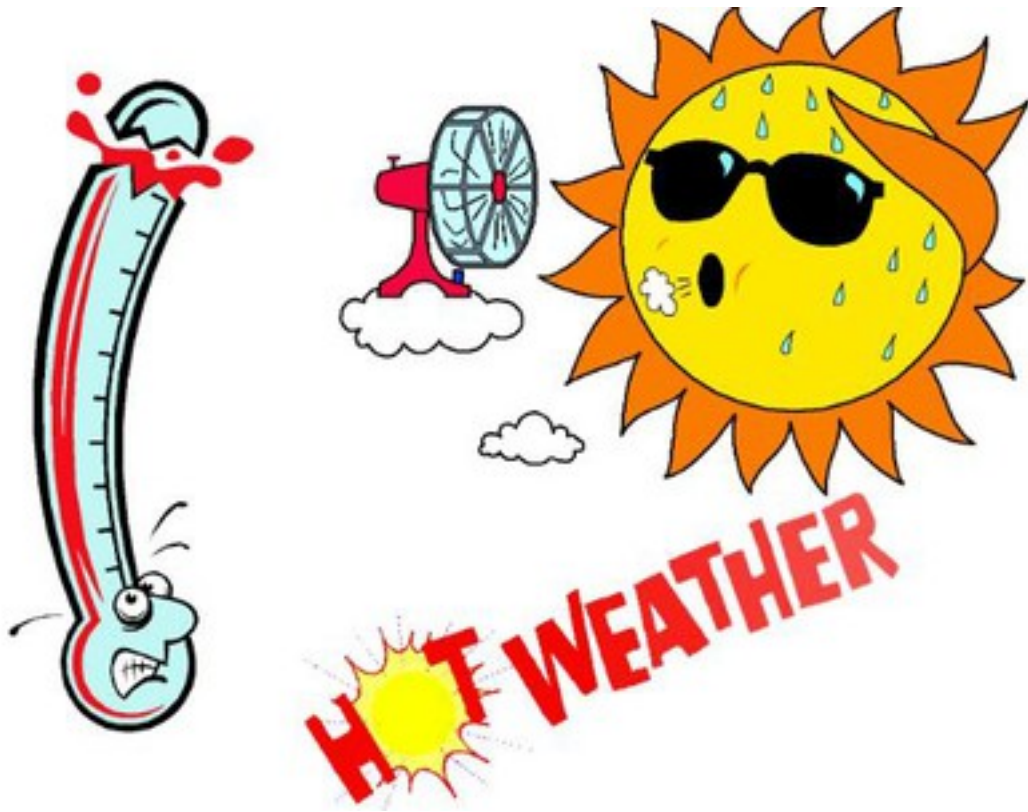

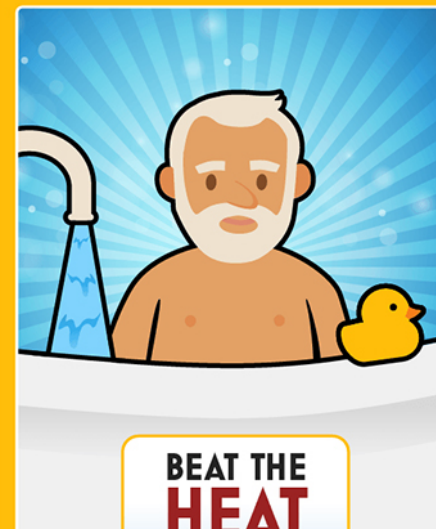
