At the Parks and Recreation Board meeting of September 9, 2014 the following list of park priority items was created by the Parks and Recreation Board for purposes of the joint workshop session with the City Commission on September 15, 2014. They are listed in no particular order.

Improvements to recreational assets:

- Manor Park Evaluate and consider alternate entrance location to relieve neighborhood impacts and increase usage.
- Poppleton Park Evaluate additional parking options and alternate entrance to relieve neighborhood impacts and accommodate baseball/soccer users.
- St. James Field improvements for baseball/soccer users.
- Adams Park Site improvements in consultation with Roeper School and neighborhood groups.
- Linn Smith/Linden Park Consideration of linking bridge.
- Soccer Sites Review all park spaces for opportunity for field improvements and to create additional field space.
- Trail Improvements Review and consider existing master plan options.
- Universally Accessible Playground Inclusive equipment and surface.

Working with donor community partners:

- Booth Park Consideration of Phase 3 corner plaza development.
- Barnum Park Consideration of remaining plan elements.
- Kenning Park Consideration of next phase review including walking path addition.

Other issues:

- Improve enforcement of park rules off leash dogs and dog waste.
- Mechanisms to enhance advertising and marketing efforts for all parks/properties increase awareness.

City of Birmingham Parks and Recreation Master Plan Public Workshop Summary – February 15, 2011

Approximately 37 people attended a Public Workshop held to discuss and gather input for the Parks and Recreation Master Plan for Birmingham. Connie Folk, Recreation Coordinator, opened the meeting, welcomed everyone, and thanked them for their attendance. Connie indicated the City is working on a new 5-Year Parks and Recreation Master Plan and are looking for input to use to develop an action plan for the next 5 years.

Leah Groya, Wade Trim, reviewed the agenda and discussed the goals for the meeting. Leah briefly reviewed the Master Planning process and timeline the City is undertaking. Leah described why the City was developing the 5-year plan as well as the MDNR guidelines and what the plan will include. The room was set up with attendees around one of five tables. Each group was asked to brainstorm their desires and concerns for the next 5 years. After 30 minutes, each group reported back to the large group. The ideas were noted on flip chart sheets and put around the room. At the end of the meeting, attendees were given 3 sticker dots and were asked to place them next to the items they felt should be highest priority.

All of the ideas are documented on the following pages. Where ideas were similar, they were combined into one entry. The number in the parenthesis indicates the number of votes (sticker dots) that were placed next to each item. Comments were categorized as either related to a facility, maintenance, coordination, program or other.
