2018 National Fitness Campaign:

Kenning Park:

Lauren stated that administration met with Johnson Hill regarding the Kenning Park Master Plan revision as it pertains to the fields and the easterly portion of the park layout.

Lauren stated that the information for the City Commission will include the donation agreement and revised master plan along with all cost estimates.

Carrie stated that the Engineering Department has approved a temporary construction easement for the homeowner at 1383 W. Lincoln for one year.

Carrie stated that due to constraints of the property (i.e. distance between the sides of the adjacent structures) and location of the addition, the homeowner has requested the ability to access the rear of their property via Fairway Park.

Therese asked why the Parks and Recreation Board did not review this request before the easement was approved as was the case for the Floyd project.

Lauren stated once the information was received from the Engineering Department it was then placed on the agenda as an informational item. The Floyd Street was originally a request for a permanent easement, while temporary easements are granted administratively.

PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT

On October 3, 2017, McKenna will be conducting another element of the Public Engagement Program for your 2018 Parks and Recreation Master Plan Update. To date, we have facilitated meaningful significant public engagement, as follows:

- 1. **Farmers Market "Field Day**" On Sunday, September 17th, your administrative team and McKenna conducted public engagement during the Harvest Festival Farmers Market. Our teams were on-site from 9:00AM until 2:00PM to facilitate quick, fun engagement exercises with visitors to the market. You will receive a summary of this input during our planning process.
- Online and Hard Copy Surveys We have launched online and hard copy surveys related to the City's overall parks and recreation program, and the Ice Arena and Golf Courses specifically. Links to the surveys can be found at www.bhamgov.org/parksrecplan; surveys may be returned by October 15, 2017.
- 3. **Roundtable Discussions** On September 21, 22, and 26, 2017, we conducted Roundtable Discussions with a number of stakeholders (see attached program).

The progress public engagement results are being summarized now, and will ultimately be incorporated into the draft 2018 Parks and Recreation Master Plan document. The results will also be provided to the plan Sub-Committee in advance of the draft.

On October 3rd, McKenna will be conducting an Open House from 5:30PM until the start of your regular meeting at 6:30PM. The Open House exercises will be the same as during the Field Day at the Farmers Market, and we will also have a comment card for attendees to write down their open-ended input. The City is in receipt of your letter and signature pages provided by your association concerning Adams Park. Given this information was received on the Friday before this week's Commission meeting it will be included as a communication for their next meeting on October 16th. In recognition of your ongoing interest and support for seeking improvements to Adams Park, I appreciate your letter and desire to seek prioritization for this project.

As you have correctly noted, a conceptual plan for Adams Park was completed and accepted in October of 2016. This is the initial step in pursuing a physical improvement to the property. The next step is to have final construction documents developed, obtain revised costs estimates and budget based on funding availability in accordance with other project demands. Discussions are currently ongoing for evaluating our parks through the Parks Master Plan update.
