PAB BRANDING & AWARENESS

Goal: To both increase public awareness of the PAB & the promotion of Birmingham art through the development of marketing materials and having a 'presence' at citywide events.

Meeting Summary: It seemed clear that the Board wants to develop promotional materials - such as a poster featuring PAB art pieces - with Monica Neville, Anne Ritchie & Barbara Heller (?) taking lead. In addition, Rabbi Cohen & Anne Ritchie hope to meet with Social Media Manager Keven Burns to discuss PAB posts on city pages. Another idea discussed but needing coordination was the steady submission of "news" items for Joe Valentine's monthly video, city emails, etc.

WORKS BY LOCAL ARTISTS

Goal: To move away from art-on-loan in favor of works by local artists, promoting 'organic' Birmingham artists & artisans, potentially reducing costs and allowing for long-term placement of works produced.

Meeting Summary: We discussed how this approach may give aspiring (or amateur) artists (or art students) a way to showcase their talent (the art pieces would be gifted to the city, with the artists gaining from the honor and exposure). The Board seemed drawn to the idea of approaching local schools in search of the next great artiste. Also discussed was the library's

plans to solicit art proposals to replace a recently sold sculpture – with the suggestion that perhaps this solicitation should be coordinated with the PAB broader solicitation. (Generally, we have already identified several open spaces in the city for art placement. Our invitation for “art” could include not only sculptures, but landscaping, gardens, meditation spaces, game tables, etc. - for example, showing spaces and asking, ‘How Would You Use this Space?’)
