City of Birmingham to Unveil New Public Art Sculpture

BIRMINGHAM, MI, October 7, 2021 – A new sculpture, *Dynamic Tension*, has been gifted to the City of Birmingham by award-winning artist Lois Teicher, and has recently been installed at the intersection of West Maple and Henrietta Street. The community is invited to attend an unveiling ceremony by the sculpture on Friday, October 15 at 2:00 p.m.

According to the artist, "Dynamic Tension refers to opposing forces which are characterized by constant change, activity or progress. These forces producing motion are in constant tension. This sculpture refers to this concept, in visual form." Themes used in Teicher's work flow directly from the artist's search to understand and connect to the universe. Her intention with public and private sculptures is to express ideas in the visual language, hoping that the viewer will notice, reflect upon, become aware of, and share in the experience.



Teicher has had a number of sculptures commissioned locally at locations such as the Scarab Club in Detroit and Bishop International Airport in Flint, as well as around the country in locations such as Kansas City, Missouri and Hoboken, New Jersey.
