WHEREAS, Town Law §63 provides that the Town Board may determine the rules of its procedure; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the following Rules of Order of the Town Board of the Town of Chatham, New York.

- A. The Supervisor shall preside at all meetings of the Board and shall preserve order and decorum in debate.
- B. The Supervisor, immediately following the opening of every regular meeting of the Board, shall proceed to the regular order of Town business as follows: reception of petitions and other communications addressed to the Town Board, reports of committees, reports of officers and departments and introduction of resolutions and motions.

- C. Public Hearings: It shall be the duty of the Supervisor to preside at all general or special business hearings to instruct all persons addressing the Board to state their names and addresses. At such hearings, the Board may by special rules prescribe the time to be allotted to each speaker and the number of times each speaker may speak.
- D. At the close of the public hearing as provided for in paragraph "3" above, the Supervisor may grant any member of the public in attendance at such meeting a reasonable opportunity to be heard on any question or subject in which the Town or its government is concerned.
- E. Every resolution or motion must be seconded before being put to a vote by the Supervisor and all resolutions or motions shall be recorded in their entirety in the official minutes of the Town Board.
- F. The Supervisor may offer or second a resolution or a motion and need not relinquish the chair for such purpose.
- G. No motion or resolution may be brought to a vote except by the majority consent of those present, unless printed or typewritten copies thereof are presented to each member of the Board prior to the opening of the meeting at which such motion or resolution is offered.
- H. When a question is under debate, no motion shall be entertained unless (a) for an adjournment or recess, (b) for the previous question to lay on the table, (c) to postpone to refer to committee, or (d) to amend. These latter motions are neither amendable nor debatable.
- I. No motion shall be made to offer any amendment to an amendment already before the Board on any proposition.
- J. A majority vote of all the members of the Board shall be required to suspend these rules of order. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum.
- K. If the above stated rules are, or become at any time, in conflict with the statutory law, the statutory law shall take precedence.
- L. No member of the public shall disrupt the formality of a town board meeting.
- M. Any persons speaking to the Board with the consent of the Supervisor shall address their remarks to the Board, unless permitted by the Supervisor or whoever is presiding over the meeting.

FURTHERMORE, in an effort to keep the Town Board apprised of various particulars of the Supervisor's work, the Supervisor shall send memos to the Town Board members regarding such issues as employment changes, financial approvals of import or any other weighty matters. For more general issues, the Supervisor shall give a monthly report during a regular Town Board meeting summarizing the issues he/she dealt with. Furthermore, the monthly report should include an update containing pertinent information from the County Board of Supervisors and any County Committees our Supervisor sits on, and

FURTHERMORE, as the Town Supervisor is a de facto member of all Citizen Advisory Committees and in light of the significant amount of input from such Committees that aid the Board in the governance of the Town, it is suggested that the Supervisor attend Citizen Advisory Committee meetings when the Supervisor believes his/her attendance will move the work of the committee forward or when an Advisory Committee has requested that attendance would be beneficial. The Board strongly encourages the Supervisor to perform these duties as the Supervisor acts as the central coordinator for all town government activities. As needed, the Supervisor may ask the Deputy Supervisor, Board members, staff and /or advisory committees to help with various projects or engagements. However, with this said, a town board may not abdicate or surrender its basic statutory responsibilities to the Supervisor, and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Chatham Town Board authorizes and delegates to the Town Supervisor the power and duties listed above.
