# Memorandum

**Re:** **2026 Board and Commission Appointments**

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The enclosed materials are compiled to support your recommendations for board and commission appointments.

## **MEMBER ROSTER**

This is a chart of all current members showing term expiration dates and vacancies. Current members who are not reapplying and existing vacancies are highlighted in blue. Current members who have reapplied are highlighted in yellow. For commissions with special membership requirements, member type is indicated by R (resident), NR (non-resident), and/or B (business community).

## **2026 APPLICANT MATRIX**

This is a matrix of all applicants showing their placement preferences (ranked 1 through 10). The matrix also indicates which current members have applied for reappointment, as well as the number of term expirations and the number of vacancies for each commission. Special membership requirements for specific commissions are described in the document.

Please note the following as you consider and discuss the applicants:

- The Design & Review Board/Historic Preservation Commission requires three members to be representatives of the business community, and at least three members who are Maplewood residents. Currently, the five-person board has three business community representatives and four residents (with Dana Valenti and Nikki Bisel each fulfilling both requirements). DJ Howard has applied for reappointment.
- Special Business District Tax Advisory Commission appointees must own property or operate a licensed business within the SBD boundaries. There are two term expirations (Gautam Gatla and August Schlafly are not reapplying, and Karmen Rayburn has applied for reappointment). Two eligible applicants have applied: Karmen Rayburn (incumbent) and Eliza Coriell (former member).
- The Sustainability Commission requires five Maplewood residents and two individuals who work in Maplewood. There is one existing vacancy for a resident member. One eligible applicant (Kevin Kern, resident) has applied.
- The Civil Service Commission only meets when the City Manager receives an appeal to an employee termination, demotion, or disciplinary action. The commission has not met in recent memory. However, it needs to remain staffed in case an appeal is received. There are two term expirations (Jeanenne Dallas and Linda Robinson, both of whom have agreed to reappointment) and two existing vacancies. With the proposed reappointment of incumbents Dallas and Robinson (who have confirmed their willingness to continue serving but were not asked to submit new applications), the commission has two vacancies produced by individuals who have moved out of Maplewood. Individuals who

are appointed to an active board or commission may also be appointed to the Civil Service Commission, and the Council should consider any new applicant who has indicated a willingness to serve on the Civil Service Commission for a dual appointment with an active board or commission. As discussed previously, staff will be working with legal counsel this year to revise and update the ordinances governing the Civil Service Commission as they are out of date and will not conform with updates to the personnel code.

- There are also vacancies on the Human Services Commission (5), Library Board (4), Parks & Recreation Commission (3), and Plan & Zoning Commission (4) that will need to be filled by incumbents and/or new members.

### **COMMISSION SIZE CONSIDERATION**

Staff will introduce legislation later this calendar year to propose reducing the number of seats from nine to seven on both the Human Services Commission and Parks and Recreation Commission. This reduction would support more efficient operations and help ensure a quorum is regularly achieved at meetings. The proposed changes would be implemented through natural attrition in future appointment cycles.

### **RECOMMENDED ACTION**

Council should review the attached applicant matrix and member roster and provide direction to the Mayor on appointments. Formal appointment resolutions will be prepared for the May 26 regular meeting based on Council's direction tonight.

# Memorandum



**To:** Mayor and City Council

**Re:** **Amending Chapter 50 of the Code of Ordinances to Regulate Alternative Vehicles**

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The City Council discussed alternative vehicle regulations at the April 14, 2026 work session, at which Council provided direction to staff on the framework to pursue. Following the work session, Council Members Homa and Wiley provided additional feedback and suggestions that have been incorporated into the proposed amendments. The proposal has since been reviewed by legal counsel, whose revisions are reflected in the enclosed mark-up.

The amendments modify existing helmet requirements in Section 50-94 and add a new Section 50-98 establishing comprehensive regulations for alternative vehicles in Maplewood. The proposed Section 50-98 includes the following key provisions:

- Definitions are established for all regulated vehicle types, including bicycles, Class 1, 2, and 3 electric bicycles, electric scooters, electric micromobility transportation devices, electric personal assistive mobility devices, hoverboards, motorized alternative vehicles, non-motorized alternative vehicles, all-terrain vehicles, and utility task vehicles.
- Three restricted corridors are designated on which most alternative vehicles other than bicycles and electric bicycles are prohibited: Big Bend Boulevard, Hanley Road, and Manchester Road between Big Bend Boulevard and Hanley Road. Bicycles and electric bicycles of all classes may be operated on restricted corridors as roadway users but not on restricted corridor sidewalks.
- High-pedestrian business districts are designated along Manchester Road between Big Bend Boulevard and the St. Louis city boundary and along Sutton Avenue between Manchester Road and Greenwood Avenue. No alternative vehicle may be operated on sidewalks within these areas.
- Class 1 and 2 electric bicycles are permitted on sidewalks and shared-use paths throughout the city, except within high-pedestrian business districts. Class 3 electric bicycles are prohibited on all sidewalks and shared-use paths and require the operator to be at least 16 years of age, consistent with Section 307.194, RSMo.
- Electric scooters require a valid driver's license for street use, are limited to motors of not more than 250 watts and speeds of not more than 12 miles per hour, and are prohibited on restricted corridors but permitted on sidewalks and shared-use paths including the Deer Creek Greenway.

- Non-motorized alternative vehicles are prohibited on all public streets, roads, and highways but are permitted on sidewalks, shared-use paths, city parks, and the Deer Creek Greenway, subject to restrictions on high-pedestrian business districts.
- Gas-powered and electric-powered mini-bikes, mini-motorcycles, pocket bikes, and go-karts are prohibited on all public streets, sidewalks, shared-use paths, multi-use trails, and in city parks. These vehicles are permitted on private property only.
- All-terrain vehicles and utility task vehicles are prohibited on all public streets, sidewalks, shared-use paths, multi-use trails, and in city parks, with an exception for government-owned vehicles operated for official purposes. This provision reinforces the existing state law prohibition under Section 304.013, RSMo, while extending the City's parental responsibility and impoundment provisions to these vehicle types. The City's fire department operates a UTV for emergency and operational use, and that use is explicitly preserved.
- The Deer Creek Greenway is addressed as a distinct category, permitting bicycles, Class 1 and 2 electric bicycles, non-motorized alternative vehicles, EPAMDs, electric scooters, and motorized play vehicles for young children.
- Helmet requirements are consolidated and expanded. All persons operating or riding as a passenger on any alternative vehicle must wear a properly fitted and fastened helmet. This requirement applies regardless of age or vehicle type and does not apply to alternative vehicles operated entirely on private property.
- Parental responsibility provisions make it unlawful for a parent or guardian to knowingly permit a child under 17 to operate any alternative vehicle in violation of this section. Officers may issue citations directly to parents or guardians, and written notice constitutes prima facie evidence of knowledge of the child's propensity to violate the section.
- Enforcement is guided by a community-oriented approach that prioritizes education and voluntary compliance before citation.
- All-terrain vehicles and utility task vehicles are prohibited on all public streets, sidewalks, shared-use paths, multi-use trails, and in city parks, with an exception for government-owned vehicles operated for official purposes. Missouri law already prohibits ATV operation on public roads under Section 304.013, RSMo, but does not extend the City's parental responsibility and impoundment tools to these vehicles. The ordinance reinforces the state prohibition locally while adding those enforcement mechanisms. Utility task vehicles are addressed explicitly, as they fall outside the state ATV definition, ensuring both vehicle types are subject to the same local framework. The City's fire department operates a UTV for emergency and operational use, and that use is preserved by the governmental exception.

Staff requests Council's direction on any further changes to these proposed regulations before the ordinance is brought forward for a vote.

## Chapter 50 TRAFFIC AND MOTOR VEHICLES

### ARTICLE III. ADDITIONAL TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

#### Sec. 50-94. Helmet required for users of bicycles and certain other devices.

- (a) The regulations in this section apply to persons operating or riding upon bicycles, inline skates, roller skates, or skateboards when such devices are operated upon any highway, roadway, alleyway, sidewalk or upon any path available for the use of such devices. The provisions of this section regarding helmet requirements for bicycles, electric bicycles, and scooters are superseded by Section 50-98 of this chapter, which governs helmet requirements and all related obligations for all alternative vehicles as defined therein. The bicycle passenger safety provisions of subsections (d) and (f) of this section shall continue to apply to all bicycles and electric bicycles.
- (b) The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this section, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this subsection, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning. The definitions of Bicycle and Scooter set forth below apply solely for purposes of the bicycle passenger safety provisions in subsections (d) and (f) of this section. For all other purposes, including helmet requirements, the definitions in Section 50-98 govern.

*Bicycle* means a vehicle with two wheels tandem, handlebars for steering, a saddle seat, and pedals by which it is propelled.

*Helmet* means a piece of headgear which meets or exceeds the impact standard for protective bicycle helmets set by the U.S. Consumer Products Safety Commission federal safety standards, those developed by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI), the Snell Memorial Foundation, or the American Society of Testing and Materials (ASTM). [See Section 50-98(n)(4) for equivalent standard applicable to all alternative vehicles.]

*Scooter* means a device that typically has one front and one rear wheel with a low footboard between, is steered by a handlebar, and is propelled either by pushing one foot against the ground while resting the other foot on the footboard or by a motor. A scooter may have more than two wheels.

- (c) Helmet requirements for persons under the age of 17 years operating or riding as a passenger on a bicycle, electric bicycle, or scooter, or using inline skates, roller skates, or a skateboard are governed by Section 50-98(n) of this chapter.
- (d) No person operating a bicycle shall allow anyone under the age of 17 years to ride as a passenger unless the passenger is wearing a bicycle helmet; or else is in an enclosed trailer or other device which meets or exceeds current nationally recognized standards of design and manufacture for the protection of the passenger's head from impacts in an accident without the need for a helmet.
- (e) Parental responsibility for permitting a person under the age of 17 years to operate or ride as a passenger on a bicycle, electric bicycle, or scooter without a helmet is governed by Section 50-98(p) of this chapter.
- (f) No person operating a bicycle shall allow anyone who is either four years old or younger or weighing 40 pounds or less, to ride as a passenger on the bicycle other than in a seat, which shall adequately retain the passenger in place, and protect the passenger from the bicycle's moving parts.

- (g) Any operator of or passenger on equipment described in this section found to be in violation of this section may be issued an equipment violation notice as prescribed on a Missouri Uniform Complaint and Summons. The person responsible for payment of the violation may have the violation dismissed, if the person submits a receipt for a proof of purchase of a bicycle helmet along with the helmet, to the city police department within five calendar days of the date of the violation notice.
- (h) Fines assessed to juvenile violators (under the age of 17 years) will be the legal responsibility of the violator's parent, custodian or legal guardian; therefore, any summons issued as a result of a violation committed by such a juvenile shall be issued to said violator's parent, custodian or legal guardian.
- (i) This section shall not apply to bicycles, inline skates, roller skates or skateboards operated on private residential property. Alternative vehicles regulated under Section 50-98 are subject to the private property exemption set forth in that section.

## **Sec. 50-98. Alternative Vehicles.**

**(a) Definitions.** As used in this section, the following terms shall mean:

*All-terrain vehicle* means any motorized vehicle manufactured and used exclusively for off-highway use which is fifty inches or less in width, with an unladen dry weight of one thousand five hundred pounds or less, traveling on three or more low-pressure or non-pneumatic tires, with a seat designed to be straddled by the operator, and handlebars for steering control, as defined in Section 301.010, RSMo. *Alternative vehicle* includes bicycles, electric bicycles, electric micromobility transportation devices, electric personal assistive mobility devices, electric scooters, hoverboards, motorized alternative vehicles, and non-motorized alternative vehicles.

*Bicycle* means every vehicle propelled solely by human power upon which any person may ride, having two tandem wheels, or two parallel wheels and one or two forward or rear wheels, all of which are more than 14 inches in diameter, except scooters and similar devices.

*Deer Creek Greenway* means the paved shared-use path running adjacent to Deer Creek within the corporate limits of the City of Maplewood.

*Electric bicycle, or electrically assisted pedal cycle, or electrically powered assisted cycle*, means a bicycle with an integrated electric motor used to assist propulsion, in one of the following three classes:

- (1) *Class 1*: Pedal assisted, no assistance without pedaling with a maximum speed of 20 mph
- (2) *Class 2*: Throttle assisted, can be ridden without pedaling, maximum speed of 20 mph
- (3) *Class 3*: Pedal assisted/optional throttle, no assistance without pedaling, maximum speed of 28 mph. Must be sixteen (16) years of age or older to operate, consistent with RSMo 307.194.

*Electric micromobility transportation device or Electric MTD* means a small, lightweight, electric-powered transportation device designed for short-distance travel, including electric skateboards and one-wheel self-balancing electric skateboards, electric bicycles, electric scooters, and hoverboards. The term also includes

motorized play vehicles, meaning low-speed battery-powered ride-on vehicles designed primarily as toys for young children.

*Electric personal assistive mobility device* or *EPAMD* means a self-balancing, two non-tandem wheeled device designed to transport only one person, with an electric propulsion system with an average power of 750 watts (one horsepower), whose maximum speed on a paved level surface, when powered solely by such propulsion system while ridden by an operator who weighs 170 pounds, is less than 20 miles per hour.

*Electric scooter* means any two- or three-wheeled device upon which the rider typically stands, equipped with an electric motor with a power output of not more than 250 watts and is capable of propelling the device at a maximum speed of not more than 12 miles per hour on level ground.

*High-pedestrian business district* shall include the following areas:

(1) Manchester Road between Big Bend Boulevard and the City of St. Louis corporate boundary (approximately the 7100 through 7400 blocks of Manchester Road); or

(2) Sutton Avenue between Manchester Road and Greenwood Avenue.

*Hoverboard* means a self-balancing, two-wheeled, battery-powered personal transportation device that the rider stands upon and controls by shifting body weight, also known as a self-balancing scooter or self-balancing board.

*Motor vehicle* means a mechanical device on wheels designed primarily for use on public rights-of-way and required by Missouri law to be licensed, but not including any motorized alternative vehicle or electric personal assistive mobility device as defined in this section.

*Motorized alternative vehicle* means a coaster, play vehicle, scooter, or similar vehicle, including mini-motorcycles, pocket bikes, motorized go-karts, and motorized minibikes, having an electric motor or a gas engine with a cylinder capacity of not more than 50 cubic centimeters, which produces less than three gross brake horsepower and is capable of propelling the device at a minimum speed of five miles per hour. This term does not include motorized wheelchairs or other similar motorized devices designed for and primarily used by persons with physical disabilities.

*Non-motorized alternative vehicle* means any device or mechanism with wheels designed for transportation or recreation that is not a motor vehicle or motorized alternative vehicle, including roller skates, roller blades, skateboards, and kick scooters, or any similar non-motorized devices, but not including bicycles.

*Public right-of-way* means a road, street, or highway designed primarily for the use of motor vehicles, excluding sidewalks and shared-use paths.

*Residential street* means any public street within the city that is not a restricted corridor as defined in this section.

*Restricted corridor* means any of the following:

(1) Big Bend Boulevard (entire length within the city);

(2) Hanley Road (entire length within the city); or

(3) Manchester Road between Big Bend Boulevard and Hanley Road.

*Roadway* means the portion of a street or highway ordinarily used for vehicular travel, exclusive of the berm or shoulder.

*Shared-use path* means any paved or unpaved path, trail, or greenway designed for joint use by pedestrians and non-motorized or lower-speed alternative motor vehicles, including the Deer Creek Greenway.

*Sidewalk* means any sidewalk, paved or unpaved, designed primarily for use by pedestrians, other than a shared-use path.

*Utility task vehicle* means a motorized vehicle designed for off-road use, with side-by-side seating, a steering wheel, and a roll cage or overhead protective structure, that is not a golf cart or low-speed vehicle as defined in Section 50-97.

**(b) Rights and duties of bicycle and electric bicycle riders.** Every person riding a bicycle or electric bicycle upon a street shall be granted all of the rights and shall be subject to all of the duties applicable to the driver of a vehicle as provided by Chapter 304, RSMo., and this Title, except as to special regulations in this Chapter, and except as to those provisions of Chapter 304, RSMo., and this Title, which by their nature can have no application.

**(c) Riding to right – required for bicycles and electric bicycles.** Every person operating a bicycle or electric bicycle at less than the posted speed or slower than the flow of traffic upon a street shall ride as near to the right side of the roadway as safe, exercising due care when passing a standing vehicle or one proceeding in the same direction, except when making a left turn, when avoiding hazardous conditions, when the lane is too narrow to share with another vehicle, or when on a one-way street. Bicyclists may ride two abreast when not impeding other vehicles.

**(d) Bicycle to operate on the shoulder adjacent to roadway, when.** A person operating a bicycle or electric bicycle at less than the posted speed or slower than the flow of traffic upon a street or highway may operate as described in subsection (e) of this Section or may operate on the shoulder adjacent to the roadway. A bicycle or electric bicycle operated on a roadway, or the shoulder adjacent to a roadway, shall be operated in the same direction as vehicles are required to be driven upon the roadway.

**(e) Bicycle required to give hand or mechanical signals.** The operator of a bicycle or electric bicycle shall signal as required in Section 304.019 RSMo, except that a signal by the hand and arm need not be given continuously if the hand is needed to control or operate the bicycle.

**(f) Electric bicycles – rights and privileges; label, requirements, modifications; safety standards authorized to ride, where, exceptions; class 3 electric bicycles, special provisions.**

(1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, every person riding an electric bicycle shall be granted all of the rights and shall be subject to all of the duties applicable to the operator of a bicycle. An electric bicycle shall be considered a vehicle to the same extent as a bicycle.

(2) An electric bicycle or person operating an electric bicycle is not subject to provisions of law applicable to motor vehicles, all-terrain vehicles, off-road vehicles, off-highway vehicles, motor vehicle rentals, motor vehicle dealers or franchises, or motorcycle dealers or franchises, including vehicle registration, certificates of title, driver's licenses, and financial responsibility requirements.

(3) Manufacturers and distributors of electric bicycles shall apply a permanent label to each electric bicycle in a prominent location containing the classification number, top assisted speed, and motor wattage of the electric bicycle, consistent with state law. No person shall tamper with or modify an electric bicycle so as to change the motor-powered speed capability or engagement of an electric bicycle without replacing the label with a new label indicating the new classification.

(4) An electric bicycle shall comply with the equipment and manufacturing requirements for bicycles adopted by the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission under 16 CFR 1512.

(5) An electric bicycle shall operate in a manner so that the electric motor disengages or ceases to function when the rider stops pedaling or when the brakes are applied.

(6) An electric bicycle may be ridden where bicycles are permitted to travel, subject to the following provisions:

a. Class 1 and Class 2 electric bicycles may be ridden on bicycle or multi-use paths where bicycles are permitted, including the Deer Creek Greenway.

b. Class 1 and Class 2 electric bicycles may be ridden on sidewalks, however they may not be used on any sidewalk within the high-pedestrian business district as defined herein.

c. Class 3 electric bicycles may not be operated on any sidewalk or shared-use path within the city.

d. Following notice and a public hearing, the City may prohibit the operation of Class 1 and/or Class 2 electric bicycles on sidewalks and/or shared use paths within the City if it finds that such restriction is needed for safety reasons or compliance with other laws or legal obligations.

e. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to a trail that is specifically designated as non-motorized.

(7) The use of Class 3 electric bicycles shall be subject to the following provisions:

a. All Class 3 electric bicycles shall be equipped with a speedometer capable of displaying the speed the electric bicycle is traveling in miles per hour.

b. No person under the age of 16 may operate a Class 3 electric bicycle. A person under the age of 16 may ride as a passenger on a Class 3 electric bicycle that is designed to accommodate passengers.

**(g) Motorized alternative vehicles, electric MTDs, EPAMDs, non-motorized alternative vehicles – regulations.**

(1) The permitted and prohibited operation of the various types of alternative vehicles is set forth in this chapter and in Table 1 as appended hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

(2) No person shall operate any motorized alternative vehicle on any highways, streets, or roads within the city without a valid driver's license to operate a motor vehicle.

(3) No person shall operate any non-motorized alternative vehicle on any highways, streets, or roads within the city.

(4) No person shall operate or use an electric MTD, EPAMD, motorized alternative vehicle or non-motorized alternative vehicle on any restricted corridor, except while crossing a street at a crosswalk, and when so crossing such person shall be subject to all laws applicable to pedestrians. Bicycles and electric bicycles may be operated on any restricted corridor as roadway users subject to all other provisions of this Section and applicable state law.

(5) Bicycles, Class I and Class II electric bicycles, electric MTDs, EPAMDs, and non-motorized alternative vehicles may be operated on paved sidewalks, city parks, and shared use paths within the city, except on any paved sidewalks in the high pedestrian business district.

(6) A person may operate or use bicycles, electric bicycles, electric MTDs, EPAMDs, and non-motorized alternative vehicles on private property with the permission of the owner.

(7) Any person who shall use, operate, or permit to be used or operated any bicycle, electric bicycle, electric MTD, EPAMD, or non-motorized alternative vehicle shall do so in a careful and prudent manner and not in a manner so as to cause or be likely to cause danger to any person or property.

(8) Any person operating a bicycle or electric bicycle on any public right-of-way is granted all the rights and is subject to all the laws applicable to the driver of a motor vehicle, except as otherwise provided in this Chapter and except further as to any laws which by their nature can have no application.

(9) Notwithstanding the above, gas and electric powered minibike, gas-powered and motorized mini-motorcycles, motorized pocket bikes, and gas and electric go-karts shall not be operated on the roads, highways, streets, sidewalks, shared-use paths, multi-use trails, or in any city parks. Such vehicles are permitted on private property only.

(10) Notwithstanding the above, hoverboards shall not be operated on the roads, highways, streets, sidewalks, shared use paths, multi-use trails, or in any city parks. Such vehicles are permitted on private property only.

**(h) Electric scooters – operated where.** No person shall operate an electric scooter on any street, road, or highway within the city without a valid driver's license. Electric scooters may be operated on sidewalks, shared-use paths, and the Deer Creek Greenway, subject to the restrictions on high-pedestrian business districts set forth in subsection (g) above.

**(i) Riding bicycle on sidewalks – limitations – motorized bicycles prohibited.** No person shall ride a bicycle upon a sidewalk within the high pedestrian business district. Whenever any person is riding a bicycle upon a sidewalk, such person shall yield the right-of-way to any pedestrian and shall give audible signal before overtaking and passing such pedestrian. No person shall ride a motorized bicycle, moped, gas powered mini-bike or gas-powered go-kart upon a sidewalk..

**(j) Deer Creek Greenway -- permitted uses.** All persons operating any alternative vehicle on the Deer Creek Greenway shall yield the right-of-way to pedestrians, operate at a speed that is safe and reasonable for conditions, and give an audible signal before overtaking and passing a pedestrian. The following alternative vehicles are permitted on the Deer Creek Greenway: bicycles, Class 1 and Class 2 electric bicycles, non-motorized alternative

vehicles, EPAMDs, electric scooters, and motorized play vehicles. The following alternative vehicles are not permitted on the Deer Creek Greenway: Class 3 electric bicycles, electric MTDs other than those expressly permitted above, hoverboards, motorized alternative vehicles, gas-powered minibikes, and gas-powered or electric go-karts.

**(k) All-terrain vehicles and utility task vehicles.**

(1) No person shall operate an all-terrain vehicle or utility task vehicle on any public street, road, highway, sidewalk, shared use path, multi-use trail, or in any city park within the city.

(2) The prohibition in subsection (1) shall not apply to all-terrain vehicles or utility task vehicles owned by a governmental entity and operated for official governmental purposes.

(3) The parental responsibility provisions of subsection (n) and the impoundment provisions of subsection (o)(4) shall apply to any person under the age of 17 years operating an all-terrain vehicle or utility task vehicle in violation of this subsection (k).

**(l) Equipment requirements.**

(1) Every bicycle and electric bicycle shall be equipped with brakes capable of stopping the vehicle within 25 feet from a speed of 10 miles per hour on dry, level, clean pavement.

(2) Every bicycle and electric bicycle when in use on a public street during the period from one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise shall be equipped with:

- a. A front-facing lamp on the front or carried by the rider that emits a white light visible at night under normal atmospheric conditions at 500 feet on a straight, level, unlighted roadway;
- b. A rear-facing red reflector with at least two square inches of reflective surface area, or a rear-facing red lamp which shall be visible at night under normal atmospheric conditions on a straight, level, unlighted roadway when viewed by a vehicle driver under the lower beams of vehicle headlights at 600 feet;
- c. Reflective material and/or lights on any part of the bicyclist's pedals, crank arms, shoes, or lower leg, visible from the front and rear at night under normal atmospheric conditions on a straight, level, unlighted roadway when viewed by a vehicle driver under the lawful lower beams of vehicle headlights at 200 feet; and
- d. Reflective material and/or lights visible on each side of the bicycle or bicyclist and visible at night under normal atmospheric conditions on a straight, level, unlighted roadway when viewed by a vehicle driver under the lawful lower beams of vehicle headlights at 300 feet. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to motorized bicycles which comply with National Highway Traffic and Safety Administration regulations relating to reflectors on motorized bicycles.

(3) No person shall operate a moped or gas-powered scooter on any highways, streets or roads in the city unless it is equipped in accordance with the minimum requirements for construction and equipment of

MOPEDs, Regulation VESC-17, approved July 1977, as promulgated by the Vehicle Equipment Safety Commission.

**(m) Helmet requirements.**

(1) Every person operating or riding as a passenger on any alternative vehicle shall wear protective headgear that properly fits and is fastened securely upon the head of the operator or passenger.

(2) It shall be unlawful for any parent or guardian to permit a child under the age of 17 years to operate or be a passenger on any alternative vehicle unless the child shall wear a properly fitted and securely fastened helmet.

(3) The helmet or headgear required under this subsection shall meet or exceed the impact standards for protective bicycle helmets established by the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission, the American National Standards Institute, the Snell Memorial Foundation, or the American Society of Testing and Materials.

(4) This subsection shall not apply to alternative vehicles operated entirely on private property.

(5) Any operator found in violation of this subsection may be issued an equipment violation notice. The violation may be dismissed if the person provides a receipt for the purchase of a compliant helmet to the police department within five calendar days of the date of the violation notice.

**(n) Parental responsibility.**

(1) It shall be unlawful for any parent or guardian to knowingly permit or allow a child under the age of 17 years to operate any alternative vehicle in violation of this section.

(2) Any police officer finding a child under the age of 17 years violating any provision of this section may issue a written citation to the parent or guardian of such child, giving notice of the violation and advising of the parent's or guardian's responsibilities under this section. A record of any such citation shall be maintained by the police department.

(3) Written notice issued pursuant to this subsection shall be prima facie evidence of a presumption of knowledge on the part of the parent or guardian of the child's propensity to operate or use an alternative vehicle in violation of this section.

**(o) Enforcement and penalties.**

(1) Enforcement of this section shall prioritize education and voluntary compliance. Police officers are encouraged to utilize written warnings, informational materials, and referral to city resources as primary tools before issuing citations, consistent with the city's community-oriented policing approach.

(2) Any person 17 years of age or older who violates any provision of this section is guilty of an ordinance violation and, upon conviction, shall be punished as provided in Section 1-11 of the Code of Ordinances.

(3) Any person violating this section who is not subject to the jurisdiction of the Maplewood Municipal Court by reason of age may be referred to the St. Louis County Juvenile Court.

(4) If any person under the age of 17 violates any provision of this section in the presence of a police officer, the officer may impound the alternative vehicle involved for a period not to exceed five days upon issuance of a receipt to the child or to the vehicle's owner.

## Chapter 50 TRAFFIC AND MOTOR VEHICLES

### ARTICLE III. ADDITIONAL TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

#### Sec. 50-94. Helmet required for users of bicycles and certain other devices.

- (a) The regulations in this section apply to persons operating or riding upon bicycles, ~~scooters~~, inline skates, roller skates, or skateboards when such devices are operated upon any highway, roadway, alleyway, sidewalk or upon any path available for the use of such devices. [The provisions of this section regarding helmet requirements for bicycles, electric bicycles, and scooters are superseded by Section 50-98 of this chapter, which governs helmet requirements and all related obligations for all alternative vehicles as defined therein. The bicycle passenger safety provisions of subsections \(d\) and \(f\) of this section shall continue to apply to all bicycles and electric bicycles.](#)
- (b) The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this section, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this subsection, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning: ~~-. The definitions of Bicycle and Scooter set forth below apply solely for purposes of the bicycle passenger safety provisions in subsections (d) and (f) of this section. For all other purposes, including helmet requirements, the definitions in Section 50-98 govern.~~

*Bicycle* means a vehicle with two wheels tandem, handlebars for steering, a saddle seat, and pedals by which it is propelled.

*Helmet* means a piece of headgear which meets or exceeds the impact standard for protective bicycle helmets set by the U.S. Consumer Products Safety Commission federal safety standards, those developed by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI), the Snell Memorial Foundation, or the American Society of Testing and Materials (ASTM). [\[See Section 50-98\(n\)\(4\) for equivalent standard applicable to all alternative vehicles.\]](#)

*Scooter* means a device that typically has one front and one rear wheel with a low footboard between, is steered by a handlebar, and is propelled either by pushing one foot against the ground while resting the other foot on the footboard or by a motor. A scooter may have more than two wheels.

- (c) [Helmet requirements for persons under the age of 17 years operating or riding as a passenger on a bicycle, electric bicycle, or scooter, or using inline skates, roller skates, or a skateboard are governed by Section 50-98\(n\) of this chapter. Every person under the age of 17 years operating or being a passenger on a bicycle, or using a scooter, inline skates, roller skates or a skateboard shall wear a bicycle helmet of good fit, fastened securely upon the head with the straps of the helmet.](#)
- (d) No person operating a bicycle shall allow anyone under the age of 17 years to ride as a passenger unless the passenger is wearing a bicycle helmet; or else is in an enclosed trailer or other device which meets or exceeds current nationally recognized standards of design and manufacture for the protection of the passenger's head from impacts in an accident without the need for a helmet.
- (e) [Parental responsibility for permitting a person under the age of 17 years to operate or ride as a passenger on a bicycle, electric bicycle, or scooter without a helmet is governed by Section 50-98\(p\) of this chapter. No parent, custodian or legal guardian of a person under the age of 17 years shall knowingly permit said person](#)

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~~to operate or be a passenger on a bicycle, or to use a scooter, inline skates, roller skates and skateboards without wearing a bicycle helmet.~~

- (f) No person operating a bicycle shall allow anyone who is either four years old or younger or weighing 40 pounds or less, to ride as a passenger on the bicycle other than in a seat, which shall adequately retain the passenger in place, and protect the passenger from the bicycle's moving parts.
- (g) Any operator of or passenger on equipment described in this section found to be in violation of this section may be issued an equipment violation notice as prescribed on a Missouri Uniform Complaint and Summons. The person responsible for payment of the violation may have the violation dismissed, if the person submits a receipt for a proof of purchase of a bicycle helmet along with the helmet, to the city police department within five calendar days of the date of the violation notice.
- (h) Fines assessed to juvenile violators (under the age of 17 years) will be the legal responsibility of the violator's parent, custodian or legal guardian; therefore, any summons issued as a result of a violation committed by such a juvenile shall be issued to said violator's parent, custodian or legal guardian.
- (i) This section shall not apply to bicycles, ~~scooters~~, inline skates, roller skates or skateboards operated on private residential property. [Alternative vehicles regulated under Section 50-98 are subject to the private property exemption set forth in that section.](#)

## Sec. 50-98. Alternative Vehicles.

**(a) Definitions.** As used in this section, the following terms shall mean:

*All-terrain vehicle* means any motorized vehicle manufactured and used exclusively for off-highway use which is fifty inches or less in width, with an unladen dry weight of one thousand five hundred pounds or less, traveling on three or more low-pressure or non-pneumatic tires, with a seat designed to be straddled by the operator, and handlebars for steering control, as defined in Section 301.010, RSMo.

*Alternative vehicle* includes bicycles, electric bicycles, electric micromobility transportation devices, electric personal assistive mobility devices, electric scooters, hoverboards, motorized alternative vehicles, and non-motorized alternative vehicles.

*Bicycle* means every vehicle propelled solely by human power upon which any person may ride, having two tandem wheels, or two parallel wheels and one or two forward or rear wheels, all of which are more than 14 inches in diameter, except scooters and similar devices.

*Deer Creek Greenway* means the paved shared-use path running adjacent to Deer Creek within the corporate limits of the City of Maplewood.

*Electric bicycle, or electrically assisted pedal cycle, or electrically powered assisted cycle,* means a bicycle ~~equipped with fully operable pedals, a saddle or seat for the rider, and an electric motor of less than 750 watts, in one of the following three classes~~ with an integrated electric motor used to assist propulsion, in one of the following three classes:

~~(1) Class 1 *electric bicycle*: means an electric bicycle equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling and that ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 20 miles per hour. Pedal assisted, no assistance without pedaling with a maximum speed of 20 mph~~

~~(2) Class 2 *electric bicycle* means an electric bicycle equipped with a motor that may be used exclusively to propel the bicycle and that is not capable of providing assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 20 miles per hour. Throttle assisted, can be ridden without pedaling, maximum speed of 20 mph~~

~~(3) Class 3: *electric bicycle* means an electric bicycle equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling and that ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 28 miles per hour. Pedal assisted/optional throttle, no assistance without pedaling, maximum speed of 28 mph. Must be No person under the age of sixteen (16) years of age or older to operate may operate a Class 3 electric bicycle, consistent with RSMo 307.194.~~

*Electric micromobility transportation device* or *Electric MTD* means a small, lightweight, electric-powered transportation device designed for short-distance travel, including electric skateboards and one-wheel self-balancing electric skateboards, ~~but not including~~ electric bicycles, electric scooters, and hoverboards, ~~or electric personal assistive mobility devices as separately defined in this section.~~ The term also includes motorized play vehicles, meaning low-speed battery-powered ride-on vehicles designed primarily as toys for young children.

*Electric personal assistive mobility device* or *EPAMD* means a self-balancing, two non-tandem wheeled device designed to transport only one person, with an electric propulsion system with an average power of 750 watts (one horsepower), whose maximum speed on a paved level surface, when powered solely by such propulsion system while ridden by an operator who weighs 170 pounds, is less than 20 miles per hour.

*Electric scooter* means any two- or three-wheeled device upon which the rider typically stands, equipped with an electric motor with a power output of not more than 250 watts, and is capable of propelling the device at a maximum speed of not more than ~~20~~ 12 miles per hour on level ground.

*High-pedestrian business district* ~~means either of~~ shall include the following areas:

(1) Manchester Road between Big Bend Boulevard and the City of St. Louis corporate boundary (approximately the 7100 through 7400 blocks of Manchester Road); or

(2) Sutton Avenue between Manchester Road and Greenwood Avenue.

*Hoverboard* means a self-balancing, two-wheeled, battery-powered personal transportation device that the rider stands upon and controls by shifting body weight, also known as a self-balancing scooter or self-balancing board.

*Motor vehicle* means a mechanical device on wheels designed primarily for use on public rights-of-way and required by Missouri law to be licensed, but not including any motorized alternative vehicle or electric personal assistive mobility device as defined in this section.

*Motorized alternative vehicle* means a coaster, play vehicle, scooter, or similar vehicle, including mini-motorcycles, pocket bikes, motorized go-karts, and motorized minibikes, having an electric motor or a gas engine with a cylinder capacity of not more than 50 cubic centimeters, which produces less than three gross brake horsepower and is capable of propelling the device at a minimum speed of five miles per hour. This term does not include motorized wheelchairs or other similar motorized devices designed for and primarily used by persons with physical

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disabilities, ~~or electric bicycles, electric scooters, electric MTDs, hoverboards, or EPAMDs as separately defined in this section.~~

*Non-motorized alternative vehicle* means any device or mechanism with wheels designed for transportation or recreation that is not a motor vehicle or motorized alternative vehicle, including roller skates, roller blades, skateboards, and kick scooters, or any similar non-motorized devices, but not including bicycles ~~or electric bicycles.~~

*Public right-of-way* means a road, street, or highway designed primarily for the use of motor vehicles, excluding sidewalks and shared-use paths.

*Residential street* means any public street within the city that is not a restricted corridor as defined in this section.

*Restricted corridor* means any of the following:

- (1) Big Bend Boulevard (entire length within the city);
- (2) Hanley Road (entire length within the city); or
- (3) Manchester Road between Big Bend Boulevard and Hanley Road.

*Roadway* means the portion of a street or highway ordinarily used for vehicular travel, exclusive of the berm or shoulder.

*Shared-use path* means any paved or unpaved path, trail, or greenway designed for joint use by pedestrians and non-motorized or lower-speed alternative motor vehicles, including the Deer Creek Greenway.

*Sidewalk* means any sidewalk, paved or unpaved, designed primarily for use by pedestrians, other than a shared-use path.

*Utility task vehicle* means a motorized vehicle designed for off-road use, with side-by-side seating, a steering wheel, and a roll cage or overhead protective structure, that is not a golf cart or low-speed vehicle as defined in Section 50-97.

**(b) Rights and duties of bicycle and electric bicycle riders.** Every person riding a bicycle or electric bicycle upon a street shall be granted all of the rights and shall be subject to all of the duties applicable to the driver of a vehicle as provided by Chapter 304, RSMo., and this Title, except as to special regulations in this Chapter, and except as to those provisions of Chapter 304, RSMo., and this Title, which by their nature can have no application.

**(c) Riding to right – required for bicycles and electric bicycles.** Every person operating a bicycle or electric bicycle at less than the posted speed or slower than the flow of traffic upon a street shall ride as near to the right side of the roadway as safe, exercising due care when passing a standing vehicle or one proceeding in the same direction, except when making a left turn, when avoiding hazardous conditions, when the lane is too narrow to share with another vehicle, or when on a one-way street. Bicyclists may ride two abreast when not impeding other vehicles.

**(d) Bicycle to operate on the shoulder adjacent to roadway, when.** A person operating a bicycle or electric bicycle at less than the posted speed or slower than the flow of traffic upon a street or highway may operate as described in subsection (e) of this Section or may operate on the shoulder adjacent to the roadway. A bicycle or electric

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bicycle operated on a roadway, or the shoulder adjacent to a roadway, shall be operated in the same direction as vehicles are required to be driven upon the roadway.

(e) Bicycle required to give hand or mechanical signals. The operator of a bicycle or electric bicycle shall signal as required in Section 304.019 RSMo, except that a signal by the hand and arm need not be given continuously if the hand is needed to control or operate the bicycle.

(f) Electric bicycles – rights and privileges; label, requirements, modifications; safety standards authorized to ride, where, exceptions; class 3 electric bicycles, special provisions.

(1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, every person riding an electric bicycle shall be granted all of the rights and shall be subject to all of the duties applicable to the operator of a bicycle. An electric bicycle shall be considered a vehicle to the same extent as a bicycle.

(2) An electric bicycle or person operating an electric bicycle is not subject to provisions of law applicable to motor vehicles, all-terrain vehicles, off-road vehicles, off-highway vehicles, motor vehicle rentals, motor vehicle dealers or franchises, or motorcycle dealers or franchises, including vehicle registration, certificates of title, driver's licenses, and financial responsibility requirements.

(3) Manufacturers and distributors of electric bicycles shall apply a permanent label to each electric bicycle in a prominent location containing the classification number, top assisted speed, and motor wattage of the electric bicycle, consistent with state law. No person shall tamper with or modify an electric bicycle so as to change the motor-powered speed capability or engagement of an electric bicycle without replacing the label with a new label indicating the new classification.

(4) An electric bicycle shall comply with the equipment and manufacturing requirements for bicycles adopted by the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission under 16 CFR 1512.

(5) An electric bicycle shall operate in a manner so that the electric motor disengages or ceases to function when the rider stops pedaling or when the brakes are applied.

(6) An electric bicycle may be ridden where bicycles are permitted to travel, subject to the following provisions:

a. Class 1 and Class 2 electric bicycles may be ridden on bicycle or multi-use paths where bicycles are permitted, including the Deer Creek Greenway.

b. Class 1 and Class 2 electric bicycles may be ridden on sidewalks, however they may not be used on any sidewalk within the high-pedestrian business district as defined herein.

c. Class 3 electric bicycles may not be operated on any sidewalk or shared-use path within the city.

d. Following notice and a public hearing, the City may prohibit the operation of Class 1 and/or Class 2 electric bicycles on sidewalks and/or shared use paths within the City if it finds that such restriction is needed for safety reasons or compliance with other laws or legal obligations.

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e. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to a trail that is specifically designated as non-motorized.

(7) The use of Class 3 electric bicycles shall be subject to the following provisions:

a. All Class 3 electric bicycles shall be equipped with a speedometer capable of displaying the speed the electric bicycle is traveling in miles per hour.

b. No person under the age of 16 may operate a Class 3 electric bicycle. A person under the age of 16 may ride as a passenger on a Class 3 electric bicycle that is designed to accommodate passengers.

**(g) Motorized alternative vehicles, electric MTDs, EPAMDs, non-motorized alternative vehicles – regulations.**

(1) The permitted and prohibited operation of the various types of alternative vehicles is set forth in this chapter and in Table 1 as appended hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

(2) No person shall operate any motorized alternative vehicle on any highways, streets, or roads within the city without a valid driver's license to operate a motor vehicle.

(3) No person shall operate any non-motorized alternative vehicle on any highways, streets, or roads within the city.

(4) No person shall operate or use an electric MTD, EPAMD, motorized alternative vehicle or non-motorized alternative vehicle on any restricted corridor, except while crossing a street at a crosswalk, and when so crossing such person shall be subject to all laws applicable to pedestrians. Bicycles and electric bicycles may be operated on any restricted corridor as roadway users subject to all other provisions of this Section and applicable state law.

(5) Bicycles, Class I and Class II electric bicycles, electric MTDs, EPAMDs, and non-motorized alternative vehicles may be operated on paved sidewalks, city parks, and shared use paths within the city, except on any paved sidewalks in the high pedestrian business district.

(6) A person may operate or use bicycles, electric bicycles, electric MTDs, EPAMDs, and non-motorized alternative vehicles on private property with the permission of the owner.

(7) Any person who shall use, operate, or permit to be used or operated any bicycle, electric bicycle, electric MTD, EPAMD, or non-motorized alternative vehicle shall do so in a careful and prudent manner and not in a manner so as to cause or be likely to cause danger to any person or property.

(8) Any person operating a bicycle or electric bicycle on any public right-of-way is granted all the rights and is subject to all the laws applicable to the driver of a motor vehicle, except as otherwise provided in this Chapter and except further as to any laws which by their nature can have no application.

(9) Notwithstanding the above, gas and electric powered minibike, gas-powered and motorized mini-motorcycles, motorized pocket bikes, and gas and electric go-karts shall not be operated on the roads, highways, streets, sidewalks, shared-use paths, multi-use trails, or in any city parks. Such vehicles are permitted on private property only.

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(10) Notwithstanding the above, hoverboards shall not be operated on the roads, highways, streets, sidewalks, shared use paths, multi-use trails, or in any city parks. Such vehicles are permitted on private property only.

**(h) Electric scooters – operated where.** ~~(1)~~No person shall operate an electric scooter on any street, road, or highway within the city without a valid driver's license. Electric scooters may be operated on sidewalks, shared-use paths, and the Deer Creek Greenway, subject to the restrictions on high-pedestrian business districts set forth in subsection (g) above.

**(i) Riding bicycle on sidewalks – limitations – motorized bicycles prohibited.** No person shall ride a bicycle upon a sidewalk within the high pedestrian business district. Whenever any person is riding a bicycle upon a sidewalk, such person shall yield the right-of-way to any pedestrian and shall give audible signal before overtaking and passing such pedestrian. No person shall ride a motorized bicycle, moped, gas powered mini-bike or gas-powered go-kart upon a sidewalk.

**(j) Deer Creek Greenway -- permitted uses.** All persons operating any alternative vehicle on the Deer Creek Greenway shall yield the right-of-way to pedestrians, operate at a speed that is safe and reasonable for conditions, and give an audible signal before overtaking and passing a pedestrian. The following alternative vehicles are permitted on the Deer Creek Greenway: bicycles, Class 1 and Class 2 electric bicycles, non-motorized alternative vehicles, EPAMDs, electric scooters, and motorized play vehicles ~~as described in subsection (i)(2)~~. The following alternative vehicles are not permitted on the Deer Creek Greenway: Class 3 electric bicycles, electric MTDs other than those expressly permitted above, hoverboards, motorized alternative vehicles, gas-powered minibikes, and gas-powered or electric go-karts.

**(k) All-terrain vehicles and utility task vehicles.**

(1) No person shall operate an all-terrain vehicle or utility task vehicle on any public street, road, highway, sidewalk, shared use path, multi-use trail, or in any city park within the city.

(2) The prohibition in subsection (1) shall not apply to all-terrain vehicles or utility task vehicles owned by a governmental entity and operated for official governmental purposes.

(3) The parental responsibility provisions of subsection (n) and the impoundment provisions of subsection (o)(4) shall apply to any person under the age of 17 years operating an all-terrain vehicle or utility task vehicle in violation of this subsection (k).

**(l) Equipment requirements.**

(1) Every bicycle and electric bicycle shall be equipped with brakes capable of stopping the vehicle within 25 feet from a speed of 10 miles per hour on dry, level, clean pavement.

(2) Every bicycle and electric bicycle when in use on a public street during the period from one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise shall be equipped with:

- a. \_\_\_\_\_ A front-facing lamp on the front or carried by the rider that emits a white light visible at night under normal atmospheric conditions at 500 feet on a straight, level, unlighted roadway ~~under normal atmospheric conditions~~;

- b. \_\_\_\_\_ A rear-facing red reflector with at least two square inches of reflective surface area, or a rear-facing red lamp which shall be visible at night under normal atmospheric conditions on a straight, level, unlighted roadway when viewed by a vehicle driver under the lower beams of vehicle headlights, visible at 600 feet under normal atmospheric conditions when viewed by a vehicle driver under the lower beams of vehicle headlights;
- c. \_\_\_\_\_ Reflective material and/or lights on any part of the bicyclist's pedals, crank arms, shoes, or lower leg, visible from the front and rear at night under normal atmospheric conditions on a straight, level, unlighted roadway when viewed by a vehicle driver under the lawful lower beams of vehicle headlights at 200 feet under normal atmospheric conditions; and
- d. \_\_\_\_\_ Reflective material and/or lights visible on each side of the bicycle or bicyclist and visible at night under normal atmospheric conditions on a straight, level, unlighted roadway when viewed by a vehicle driver under the lawful lower beams of vehicle headlights at 300 feet under normal atmospheric conditions. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to motorized bicycles which comply with National Highway Traffic and Safety Administration regulations relating to reflectors on motorized bicycles.

(3) No person shall operate a moped or gas-powered scooter on any highways, streets or roads in the city unless it is equipped in accordance with the minimum requirements for construction and equipment of MOPEDs, Regulation VESC-17, approved July 1977, as promulgated by the Vehicle Equipment Safety Commission.

**(m) Helmet requirements.**

(1) Every person operating or riding as a passenger on any motorized alternative vehicle, electric bicycle, or electric scooter, shall wear protective headgear that properly fits and is fastened securely upon the head of the operator or passenger.

~~(2) Every person under the age of 17 operating or riding as a passenger on any alternative vehicle on any public street, sidewalk, shared use path, or in any city park or on any multi-use trail shall wear a properly fitted helmet fastened securely.~~

~~(23) No It shall be unlawful for any parent or guardian shall knowingly to permit a child under the age of 17 years to operate or be a passenger on any alternative vehicle without unless the child shall wearing a properly fitted and securely fastened helmet.~~

(34) The helmet or Hheadgear required under this subsection shall meet or exceed the impact standards for protective bicycle helmets established by the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission, the American National Standards Institute, the Snell Memorial Foundation, or the American Society of Testing and Materials.

(45) This subsection shall not apply to alternative vehicles operated entirely on private residential property.

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(56) Any operator found in violation of this subsection may be issued an equipment violation notice. The violation may be dismissed if the person provides a receipt for the purchase of a compliant helmet to the police department within five calendar days of the date of the violation notice.

~~(e) Age requirements.~~ The following minimum age requirements apply in addition to any age requirements established elsewhere in this section:

~~(1) No person under the age of 16 may operate a Class 3 electric bicycle on any public street, sidewalk, or shared-use path.~~

~~(2) No person under the age of 16 may operate an electric scooter on any public street, road, or highway.~~

~~(3) No person under the age of 16 may operate any motorized alternative vehicle on any public street, road, or highway.~~

~~(n)~~ **Parental responsibility.**

(1) It shall be unlawful for any parent or guardian to knowingly permit or allow a child under the age of 17 years to operate any alternative vehicle in violation of this section.

(2) Any police officer finding a child under the age of 17 years violating any provision of this section may issue a written citation to the parent or guardian of such child, giving notice of the violation and advising of the parent's or guardian's responsibilities under this section. A record of any such citation shall be maintained by the police department.

(3) Written notice issued pursuant to this subsection shall be prima facie evidence of a presumption of knowledge on the part of the parent or guardian of the child's propensity to operate or use an alternative vehicle in violation of this section.

~~(o)~~ **Enforcement and penalties.**

(1) Enforcement of this section shall prioritize education and voluntary compliance. Police officers are encouraged to utilize written warnings, informational materials, and referral to city resources as primary tools before issuing citations, consistent with the city's community-oriented policing approach.

(2) Any person 17 years of age or older who violates any provision of this section is guilty of an ordinance violation and, upon conviction, shall be punished as provided in Section 1-~~118~~ of the Code of Ordinances.

(3) Any person violating this section who is not subject to the jurisdiction of the Maplewood Municipal Court by reason of age may be referred to the St. Louis County Juvenile Court.

(4) If any person under the age of 17 violates any provision of this section in the presence of a police officer, the officer may impound the alternative vehicle involved for a period not to exceed five days upon issuance of a receipt to the child or to the vehicle's owner.
