A Message from the Mayor



ard work, long hours, and much love has been put into "MOVING THE MISSION FOR-WARD" FY2023 despite many extreme obstacles we have made successful strides towards community unity and efforts to diversify the community programming. Several opportunities have been actioned by the Mayoral Office to support Annapolis driven legislation to address the food needs of our community and across the state of Maryland. Respectfully legislation HB0628 (SB0557) Primary and Secondary Education – Breakfast and

Lunch Programs – Universal Expansion also, House Bill HB0514 (Senate Bill SB0559) Education - Maryland Meals for Achievement In-Classroom Breakfast Program - Annual Appropriation, each seeing to it that Prince George's County student enrollment: 131,146 (as of September 30, 2022) receives access to healthy and free breakfast and lunch meals with an added bonus legislation which makes provisions for breakfasts in the classroom to support students who sometimes have late morning bus arrival times.

Testifying during the Prince George's County House Delegation Late File Bill Hearing, I am honored to support the movement to pressure County and State legislators to not allow any new liquor stores coming into the vicinity of Glenarden. Relative to those already in place establishments supported legislation which restricted those establishments to only to serve beer, wine, and liquor by the glass or by the bottle for on-premises consumption only and NO open containers to be carried off the property under PG-302-23 // HB0436 - Prince George's County - Alcoholic Beverages - Class B Beer, Wine, and Liquor Licenses, Entertainment Permits, Inspections and Publication of Penalties. Applying certain provisions relating to a certain entertainment permit allowed to contracted promoters equally under these bills, a local licensing board, an authorized agent of the licensing board, or a peace officer may immediately suspend an entertainment permit if the board reasonably believes that the permit holder or a contracted promoter violated the requirements of the entertainment permit or other county requirements, as specified.

Prince George's County Public Bill Hearing held February 19, 2023, I testified on PG502-23 // HB1079 - Prince George's County - Board of Education and School System Revisions and Local Public Campaign Financing for Board of Education Members altering the duties and responsibilities of the Prince George's County Board of Education and certain officers of the county board; altering the voting authority of the student board member; renaming and altering the duties of the County Superintendent of Schools; establishing an Office of Accountability and Compliance to be headed by an Inspector General in the county government.


Concerning HB0576 (SB0629) Primary and Secondary Education - Policies on Bullying, Harassment, or Intimidation - Revisions supported testimony February 22, 2022 which

seeks to alter certain requirements for a model policy prohibiting bullying, harassment, or intimidation in public and nonpublic schools; requiring that if the act of bullying, harassment, or intimidation is determined to be motivated by the alleged victim's actual or perceived sex, sexual orientation, or gender identity, notification to the parent or guardian of the alleged victim shall be at the discretion of the alleged victim; and requiring the State Board of Education and each nonpublic school to update the model policy by September 1, 2023. Everyone should be free to learn in peace. Revenues are not affected though vigilance and proper reporting by the school administration is imperative.

Through the work-life transitioning period those (18-24) years old) with free life skills preparation training. The City of Glenarden is STILL on the move. With a new African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA) uniting 54 nations into the world's largest trade bloc, a burgeoning population set to double by 2050, and the AfCFTA set to grow Africa's GDP by \$450 billion, President Joe Biden hosted this second U.S.-Africa Leaders' Summit in Washington, D.C.- the first head of state gathering of African leaders and a U.S. president since August 2014 when President Barack Obama hosted. This event crafted a Memorandum of Agreement regarding partnerships in the fashion and entertainment industries. Of note, as a city, Glenarden has had some of the DMV's and nation's brightest talent and artists come from right here and more movie stars, singers, podcasters, DJs (sound engineers), models are coming!

The target for 2022 was mental health and wellness and remains my priority in 2023. Mayor Cross under invitation from UN Ambassadors and Drug Free World Americas President brief the United Nations February 10, 2023, asking the world leaders to help address the global drug problem. It's time to take back our communities and ensure our kids have the knowledge about the dangers posed from use period, and especially long term drug use and even more the potential for serious harm or death. Watch Mayor speak on the floor of the United Nations here: https://media.un.org/en/asset/klw/klwxnjdgqu Also watch the three concert series coming this spring and summer addressing gun violence and mental health awareness with "It's Okay to Not Be Okay" Celebrities are coming to DC for mental health

program hosted by Anthony Anderson, The Rosa Parks Project (DMV) with cinematologist Mr. Travis Mays and Mr. Eddie LeVert, Jr., and "Take back Our Neighborhoods" organization with Dr Sesil Jenkins the last protégé of Marvin Gaye who was the lead choreographer for the Grammy Award win-



ner. Equally I am expanding my mental health and wellness target to also include Diversity and Inclusion as a community development awareness program. Prepare for a community Easter EGGtravaganza April 8th, 2023, come join me at the Glenarden Community Center with the brothers of Omega Psi Phi (LGG) providing Glenarden and district residents a "Supercalifragilisticexpialidocious day of family fun!" Come gather for an opportunity filled with prizes, laughter, and joy. A City on the Move is a "City that plays together and will stay together!" I intend to keep fun and community involvement as a primary development strategy in my diversity and community inclusion efforts. We are greater together May 13th, 2023, in Multicultural Diversity and Inclusion Day as we celebrate our uniqueness and beauty at the Glenarden Community Center. Traveling on to JSWES May 25th, 2023, to rekindle the flames of mental health and wellness in support of their annual Health Expo. And much, much more stay tuned in because this summer brings a few amazing opportunities for employment for youth, Empowerment Training and field trip, and the annual Back to school (K-12) Transitional Youth Extravaganza!

Various community members are helping to build up community strengths across the wards and this is a progressively positive approach as citizens are stepping up to help define the partnering influence of the community. The following concerns: Carjacking, Juvenile Crime, Gun Violence, Drugs, and New Marijuana Legislation builds a surge of anxiety that presents a public safety conundrum that led the State's Attorney Office (SAO) and the Prince George's County Sheriff John Carr to lay the foundation to open a Justice Academy addressing youth and violence as a matter of community and family care. The executive office of the Mayor supports every responce to municipal leadership safety concerns, to better partner to build a stronger Glenarden and Prince George's overall way of supporting returning citizen community training session, reintegration seminars, expungements, and recidivism prevention programming. As well as supporting voter registration as we prepare for the national elections.

In emergence preparedness in leveraging The Prince George's County Office of Homeland Security/Emergency Management Division (OHS/EMD) trainers for a local preparedness training in collaboration with the Prince George's Chapter of the NAACP and NAACP WIN program April 1-2, 2022. I continue to stress every citizen to please sign up for the citywide emergency notification tool, the Code Red emergency awareness program. Code Red will alert all registered citizens by chosen method of contact relative to impeding environmental disasters. The website and quarterly newsletter will continue to carry the message of the program to keep all citizens aware and build the repository beyond 15% of the population. Sign up and keep spreading the word. The Prince George's County Office of Homeland Security/Emergency Management Division (OHS/EMD) is in the process of updating the County Hazard Mitigation Plan (HMP). By third quarter in collaboration with the Department of Environment, OHS/EMD provided overview of the updated 2023 Glenarden Draft Hazard Mitigation Plan. Collaborative community efforts on going to build a tailored emergency preparedness session in the coming quarter with OHS/EMD disaster preparedness training in the City of Glenarden.

The massive spirt to address gun violence and bullying drives an even greater span of attention towards the health of our youth, and the resistance to depression, disenfranchisement, and vindictive violence whose gas like flames to a fire have caused the entire county to be place on a curfew for all youth underage through the fall of 2022. The need to formulate a more perfect union between Glenarden's wards and even stronger bond with

our County and state are key priority for 2023 as I serve on the Countywide Hope in Action Task Force.

City of Glenarden under this mayoral leadership has made seven national level and three international positive news reports, and an international United Nations (New York, NY) presentation supporting a Drug Free World educating our youth about the decisions they will be making with changes in the state laws placing a progressively positive light on the city and the work done in supporting community, volunteerism, public safety, and community integration. The second year has already shaped up in a most progressively strong way with bond bills and actions against additional liquor stores and healthcare evolutions to support across the senior community, residents keep their homes and remain prospectively financially secure in the after mass of COVID19. Citizens of Glenarden together we will continue to "Move the Mission Forward."

Greetings Citizens, Our partners in government, as this new season of the year approaches the Council continues to "Spring Forward" in its endeavor to continue to be a *City on the Move*.

On March 8, 2023, Maryland Elected Officials to the Senate, House of Representatives, Governor Wes Moore, and Prince George's County Executive Angela Alsobrooks presented their case to GSA and the FBI, concerning the relocation of the FBI to the State of Maryland, specifically Prince George's County. The suggested location are in Greenbelt, and the Old Landover Mall site. This has been a closely watched negotiation by citizens.

On March 15, 2023, at 11:00 a.m. the ground-breaking celebration was held for Phase Ill of the Glenarden Hills property. Glenarden Phase 3 is a 158-unit, mixed-income project. A City on the Move. Glenarden continues to be a vibrant thriving community!

Council President Derek Curtis ll attended a March 20, 2023 discussion with our County Executive Angela Alsobrooks. We look forward to hear information shared with the municipalities.

The decision of the Prince George's County Liquor Board concerning another liquor store in our community will be made at the March 28, 2023 meeting.

The Council has identified a Project Manager for the America Rescue Plan Act. This will allow the various resolution passed pertaining to the funds be utilized.

The Council has awarded a contract to Municipal Grant Services. The award provides for; grant services pertaining to local, state, and federal grants. Additionally, foundation funds opportunities are to be identified. The contract scope includes advice, drafting, and contract compliance. Our Glenarden Police Department is expected to be a beneficiary of these services to enhance Public Safety. This contract also provides a Project Manager who will ensure the funds associated with said grants are properly disbursed and accounted for.

The Council through consensus has hired a vendor to provide Parliamentary Services to our

meetings. This will provide education, to include order to our meetings, and councilmembers.

Councilwomen Erika L. Fareed and Kathleen J. Guillaume have presented a resolution to establish and preserve a Community Garden Program. This is still a work in progress as we identify areas, and develop Community Garden Guidelines. Please reach out to any Councilmember and share your thoughts on this exciting endeavor to create community unity.

The Charter Review Committee continues to meet to update our Charter and Codes.

As the weather is continuing to break forth, we will see the sidewalks and street renovations begin.

Pertaining to 7th Street Park Councilwoman Fareed and team are working diligently to present another environment for our children to enjoy.

There is dialog within the Council to host another expungement clinic and of course our bi-annual Shred Day!

Treasury Department Assessment for Real Property Tax Rate

The Treasury Department of the City of Glenarden is in the process of preparing the FY 2024 budget. With this, the City will be reviewing and assessing the Real Property Tax Rate for that period. Recently, the Maryland Department of Assessment and Taxation provided the City with its Constant Yield Rate for FY 2024. This stands at 0.03273 per ever \$100 of assessment on your property. The State of Maryland, Department of Assessment and Taxes has reported that there was an increase of 1.9987% on assessment of properties in the City of Glenarden.

Constant Yield Rate is defined as the rate at which the same amount of property tax revenue is generated as the previous year (FY2023). However, as the administration continues to search for other means of revenue for its improved initiatives for FY 2024 and beyond the possibility that the Real Property

Tax Rate maybe increased above the Constant Yield is probable. Before any increase in rate, the city and council will meet with the citizens to discuss the budget and provide reasons for rate increases.

The meetings to discuss the budget and any unavoidable increase of rates should be held between April 10 – 24th. For additional information please call 301-773-2100.

Thieves across the United States and locally are stealing Hyundai and Kia models as easy targets, thanks in part to viral social media posts. Essentially, if it's a modern car from one of those automakers that doesn't utilize pushbutton start, they can fire up the car and drive away in less than a minute. The only tool required is something that can be found in just about every vehicle: a USB charger for your cell phone.

Videos reveal exactly how they're going about it, and it involves peeling back the steering column cover and dis-

mantling the key slot. A USB cable can then be used to turn the ignition tumbler, start the vehicle, and release the steering lock.



Department of Public Works News & Updates

The City's Public Works is dedicated to providing friendly and professional service while maintaining the City's roads, parks, and lots, as well as, taking a lead role in many City initiatives, such as managing critical processes like Winter Storm Operations.

The Public Works Department is the second largest department in the City of Glenarden and is also probably the department with the most diverse areas of responsibility. These responsibilities mostly involve providing public services on items such as trash and debris pick-up, landscape and building maintenance, and work associated with improving and maintaining the City's assets and infrastructure like its roads, parks, lots, and green space. The City of Glenarden's Public Works Department has a staff of 7 dedicated technical, professional and operational employees that perform the work related to these areas.

As the new Director of Public Works for the City of Glenarden, I am pleased to bring over 25 years of physical asset management and construction experience, with the last 4 years working in a neighboring municipality. 


