



## **POLICE'S CHIEF REPORT**

### **September 17, 2020 - October 16, 2020**

- € Sept. 17<sup>th</sup> – Conference call with the management of the Glenarden Housing Authority and the Board of Directors. Topics of discussion included patrols on the complex, whereas our officers are instructed to patrol the property and make a report to the dispatcher so that it may be recorded. They requested the city to place cameras on the property and were advised as a Housing Authority, they could install their own cameras. Several other issues were discussed.
- € Sept. 19<sup>th</sup> – Members of the Glenarden Police Department assisted members of Masjid Ibn Taymiyyah Temple with a food give-away at their Temple located at 8000 Martin Luther King, Jr. Highway. Over 100 meals were given to the community. All went well
- € Sept. 22<sup>nd</sup> – The Police Department destroyed property that was confiscated from individuals and being held, not needed for evidence.
- € Sept. 22<sup>nd</sup> – Members of the Glenarden Police and the Code Enforcement Department shut down a business located in the 8000 block of Martin Luther King, Jr. Avenue; this is a “Hookah” shop. The owner was issued a \$100.00 citation and was advised how to obtain a business license.
- € Sept. 24<sup>th</sup> – Conference call with the Commander and Assistant Commander of District Three. The conversation was about a ceremony that is being talked about somewhere in the city or right outside of the city.
- € Sept. 26<sup>th</sup> - The ceremony has been moved to Whitfield Chapel Park handled by Park Police and County Police.

- € Sept. 29<sup>th</sup> – Conference call with the Chief of Homicide at the States Attorney’s Office along with the County Police Homicide Division and the Park Police. We went over all of our homicide cases over the past three years. All cases are closed but wanted suspects are in each case. The Park Police is making progress in the last shooting involving the young child.
- € Sept. 29<sup>th</sup> – Meeting with the manager of the Glenarden Housing Authority. The Glenarden Police provided her crime and calls for service information in order for them to apply for a grant to improve security.
- € Sept. 30<sup>th</sup> – Captain Jackson took a tour of the National Children’s Medical Center Building located in the Woodmore Town Center with several officers.
- € Oct. 6<sup>th</sup> – Update on gun violence on Fulton Avenue. One of our regulars on Fulton Street was shot and killed in the 5600 block of Duchaine Drive in Lanham. Officers have been advised to increase patrols in the Glenarden Housing Authority and management has been notified.
- € Oct. 6<sup>th</sup> – Captain Jackson, Lt. Robinson, Code Enforcement Officer Thomas and I had a meeting with several applicants of a proposed business in the 8000 block of Martin Luther King, Jr. Highway. Originally, the business was proposed to be a 24/7 Hooker Shop. That has been changed to a convenience store that will be opened from 7:00am until mid-night.
- € Oct. 6<sup>th</sup> – Officers from the Prince George’s County Police conducted a traffic stop at Martin Luther King Highway and Glenarden Parkway and as a result three (3) armed suspects were arrested and three (3) guns recovered.
- € Oct. 7<sup>th</sup> – Participated in the coffee circle meeting. The coffee circle meeting is a public forum for citizens, business owners, organizations and public officials. The meeting focuses on common concerns expressed by citizens.
- € Oct. 7<sup>th</sup> – County police made a traffic stop at Johnson Avenue and Glenarden Parkway and as a result they recovered a handgun and arrested the driver.
- € Oct. 16<sup>th</sup> – Officers have been giving special attention to the Fulton Street area in order to prevent crime.
- € Oct. 16<sup>th</sup> – Officers have developed a suspect in several thefts from autos. The suspect lives in the 2900 block of White Oak. So far he has been identified pertaining to one stolen and three different thefts from autos in and around the Glenarden area.
