### CHIEF'S MONTHLY REPORT JULY 24, 2020 - AUGUST 21, 2020

- € July 21<sup>st</sup> - Captain Jackson and I attended a Ribbon Cutting Ceremony at the Children's Hospital. The County Executive and the States Attorney were present.
- € July 27<sup>th</sup> - A citizen reports that he was beaten and robbed in the Starbucks parking lot at 11:00am. He received a large cut under his left eye. He refused treatment by the fire department. Follow-up by the county robbery suppression team.
- € July 28<sup>th</sup> - Meeting with Captain Jackson and Lieutenant Robinson to discuss the following topics: thefts from autos, stolen autos, projected date to hire a replacement officer for PFC Perez who is resigning effective August 10, 2020, Ms. Allen's office and neighborhood patrols.
- € July 29<sup>th</sup> - Members of the Glenarden, Prince George's and National Capital Park Police departments participated in a rally on Police Reform for the community at the Woodmore Towne Center Park, 9200 Ruby Lockhart Blvd. Councilwoman Jolen Ivey was present.
- € July 30<sup>th</sup> - A follow-up meeting with the Director and her assistant at the Glenarden Housing Authority. Topics of discussion included: a complaint from a resident that she called the police for the sounds of gunshots and there was no response. I checked our police records which revealed no calls were received by the 911 center.
- € July 31<sup>st</sup> - Meeting with the manager of the Woodmore Towne Center commercial area. Topics of discussion: most of the businesses have reopened, discussed the theft from autos at the hotel and the possibility of increased off-duty officers working at the shopping center.

- € Aug. 3<sup>rd</sup> – Conference call with the National Weather Service and the Prince George’s County Office of Emergency Management concerning the expectation of rainfall from 3 to 5 inches, and winds 40-55 mph, mid-morning power outages, falling trees, B.P.W. will be out. 311 will open at 6:00AM for non-emergency services, No COVID test on August 4<sup>th</sup> and county will be on liberal leave.
- € Aug. 3<sup>rd</sup> – Conference call with Maryland Chiefs of Police Association. Topics of discussion included Crime 2021 Legislative Session and the challenges ahead.
- € Aug 6<sup>th</sup> – Meeting with citizens in the 3600 block of Tyrol Drive because neighbors are concerned about commercial vehicles parked in the neighborhood and several homes have numerous cars parked in front. Police and Code Enforcement will address this issue.
- € Aug. 7<sup>th</sup> – Meeting with the owner of A-1 Liquor to discuss: business license, the establishment has closed its’ dancing area. Have several complaints of his landscapers blowing grass cuttings into the public space area. He states that will stop. He was also reminded to keep the lot clear during the daylight hours.
- € Aug. 8<sup>th</sup> – Officers gave special attention to the soft opening of Horace and Dickies, all went well.
- € Aug. 10<sup>th</sup> – Conference call with the manager of the Glenarden Housing Authority. This was a follow-up in reference to several issues that we have been working on, on the property. The manager asked if I would participate in a conference call with the Board of Directors in the near future and I replied yes.
- € Aug. 10<sup>th</sup> – Conference call with Dr. Carter, the Director of Prince George’s Public Health and Mr. Gill, the Director of Emergency Management Department. Dr. Carter stated that COVID 19 is still spreading, but at a slower pace. Cases are down to about 900 a-week. He also stated that people should practice social distancing and wear a mask. Cheverly’s testing site will be closed for several weeks. Dr. Carter asked that we cooperate with contact tracers. Contract traces will not ask for any form of financial information. The county is sending inspectors to check on all businesses and will cite those in violation.
