



## ACTING CHIEF'S REPORT

October 22, 2021 through November 22, 2021

- Oct. 23<sup>rd</sup> - Glenarden police provided extra police presence for the Expungement Event by assisting with vehicular traffic and participants entering the Gold Room.
- Oct. 30<sup>th</sup> - Glenarden police were assigned to coordinate traffic control for the Shedd Day Event on the parking lot of the Municipal building.
- Oct. 30<sup>th</sup> - Glenarden police hosted our "First Trunk or Treat" on the Municipal building parking lot from 4PM - 5:30PM. Sargent Richardson coordinated this event with the vendors and administrative staff; the event was very well attended with the councilmembers and mayor showing their support.
- Nov. 2<sup>nd</sup> - Sent out notification to all Glenarden city officials advising them of GPD officers responded to the area of the Hayes Street and Johnson Avenue for the sounds of "shots fired". Responding officers didn't find any noticeable evidence while on the scene.
- Nov. 3<sup>rd</sup> - Resident called Glenarden police to report her parked vehicle (Hayes Street) had been damaged by two bullet holes (driver & passenger doors); no other calls for damaged vehicles.
- Nov. 3<sup>rd</sup> - Sent out notification to all Glenarden city officials advising them of Glenarden officers' response to the area of the 9100 block of Glenarden Parkway for a citizen armed robbery. Victim advised suspects drove up as he was walking home and demanded him to give them his food and money at gun point. The victim gave unknown suspect \$700.00 but kept his food.
- Nov. 5<sup>th</sup> - PGPD Robbery detectives reached out to Lt. Robinson to advise him that upon further investigation, this incident didn't occur in our city limits.

- Nov. 6<sup>th</sup> - I and several officers were present at the "Harvest Day Event" in the Gold Room. Cpl. Covington and PFC Lanier assisted with passing our turkeys.
- Nov. 9<sup>th</sup> - through Nov. 12<sup>th</sup> - PFC Taylor attended Radar & Lidar training at PGPD SOD (traffic division) to become certified in utilizing these devices.
- Nov. 9<sup>th</sup> - Received letter of "Thanks" from a resident on West Glen Reed Court expressing his thanks for extra patrol and police presence in their community pertaining to a few issues of concern.
- Nov. 9<sup>th</sup> - Sent out an e-mail to the PG Municipal Chief's Association advising of the memorial ceremony to be held for the late Chief O'Donnell.
- Nov. 11<sup>th</sup> - I, Lt. Robinson and Officers Knox and Thompson were present for the Veterans Memorial Celebration which was held at the memorial park.
- Nov. 15<sup>th</sup> - through Nov. 17<sup>th</sup> - PFC. Buchanan and Glenarden Officer Whyllie will be attending their required 2021 annual in-service training at PG Community College. Upon their completion, all of our officers will have received their required 2021 annual classroom and firearms training.
- Nov. 16<sup>th</sup> - Lt. Robinson and I met with Glenarden Hills Management to discuss some property concerns and to request and plan a meeting with the tenants residing in the seniors' apartments.
- Nov. 16<sup>th</sup> - Members from PGPD Auto Theft and Carjacking Units executed a search warrant in the 3600 block of Jeff Road. They were attempting to locate a 16 year old female for carjacking and attempt murder, she wasn't located.
- Nov. 19<sup>th</sup> - I met with all GPD Officers to advise them that the substation at the Woodmore Towne Centre revised process has been completed, furniture set up, Wi-Fi, computers, and printers set-up and operational.

- Oct. 25<sup>th</sup> - Sent an e-mail to all Administration Staff advising of a mandatory meeting, also included was Public Works and Code Enforcement, Council Clerk wasn't included.
- Oct. 28<sup>th</sup> - advised Council President Curtis that the meeting with the staff went well and topic of discussion was to improve moral and create a better working environment relationship.
- Nov. 1<sup>st</sup> - Spoke with Councilman Herring about getting an update on the paperwork status for the permit for the demolition of the MLK Recreation Center.
- Nov. 3<sup>rd</sup> - Spoke with Howard (PW) about cutting down the bushes in Hayes Park and picking up the trash.
- Nov. 5<sup>th</sup> - Received an e-mail from Councilman Herring just to remind me to ensure PW have the chairs and tents set up for the Veteran's Day Memorial event.
