**ACTING CHIEF OF POLICE REPORT**  
**MARCH 18, 2022 - APRIL 21, 2022**

- ✓ Mar. 6<sup>th</sup> - GPD Cpl. Covington initiated a traffic stop at Martin Luther King, Jr. Highway at Hubbard Road. The field investigation revealed the driver had an open warrant through Virginia and with the assistance of GPD officers Buchanan and Knox, a 45 caliber fully loaded handgun and a revolver handgun were recovered from the inside the driver's vehicle, he was taken into custody.
- ✓ Mar. 10<sup>th</sup> - GPD Officer Harrison initiated a traffic stop in the 9000 block of McHugh Drive (Woodmore Towne Centre) and the field investigation revealed the driver had an open warrant through PG County. He was taken into custody and remanded to the Department of Corrections.
- ✓ Mar. 13<sup>th</sup> - GPD Officer Lee was dispatched by PG Communications to respond to the 8200 block of Martin Luther King, Jr. Highway for the report of a stolen vehicle. The field investigation revealed the victim drove the possible suspect and his friend home in D.C. and when the suspect asked the victim to drive him home and she refused, he took her keys and when she went to call the police, the suspect drove off in her vehicle.
- ✓ Mar. 18<sup>th</sup> - The Maryland Police Training Commission was sent Police Chief Bryant's completed background investigation filed for review for his Maryland Certification.
- ✓ Mar. 18<sup>th</sup> - GPD Officers were dispatched by PG Communications to respond to the 3100 block of Hubbard Road for a suspicious person. The field investigation revealed the victim found an unknown homeless male sleeping in his vehicle on the front passenger seat. The homeless male advised he didn't break the window and the owner of the vehicle advised upon checking, nothing was missing from his vehicle. A warrant check revealed the homeless male didn't have any open warrants.

- ✓ Mar. 18<sup>th</sup> - GPD Officers were dispatched by PG Communications to the 3100 block of Hubbard Road for the report of theft from auto. The field investigation revealed unknown suspect(s) had cut and stolen his catalytic coveter from his 2022 Ford pick-up truck. The victim's video footage revealed unknown suspect stealing the catalytic cover; however, no identity could be recognizable.
- ✓ Mar. 20<sup>th</sup> - GPD Officers responded to a call from A/Chief Jackson advising of a disorderly male who was inside the Hook-n- Reel and had attempted to assault him. The field investigation revealed upon stopping and detaining the suspect near Nandos, he appeared to be under the influence of CDS (PCP). Recovered from his jacket pockets were suspected CDS (marijuana) in two glass jars (40.2) grams and a small black scale. He was arrested and transported to Upper Marlboro.
- ✓ Mar. 20<sup>th</sup> - GPD Officers were dispatched by PG Communication to respond to the 1400 block of Wesley Street to assist PG Fire/EMS. The field investigation revealed the Fire/EMS personnel was attempting life saving measures and later pronounced the victim deceased at 8:56pm and declared this a natural death.
- ✓ Mar. 27<sup>th</sup> - GPD Officers were dispatched to respond to the 7900 block of Johnson Avenue (cleaners) for the report of a breaking and entering. The field investigation revealed upon the victim's arrival to work, he noticed that his front door glass had been broken. Upon further inspection he noticed the cash register that was on the front counter was missing and that approximately \$400.00 was in the cash draw. Victim advised he has no burglary alarm and his surveillance camera may have captured some footage.
- ✓ Mar. 30<sup>th</sup> - GPD Officer was dispatched to respond to the 9100 block Woodmore Centre Drive (Snipes) for the report of a theft. The field investigation revealed two (2) unknown suspects entered the store and immediately started grabbing random clothing merchandise and putting them in large black trash bags which they bought into the store with them and then exited the store. They were observed entering a grey Toyota Rav4, displaying a Maryland temporary tag. The look-out was provided to PGPD communication.
- ✓ Mar. 31<sup>st</sup> - Sent ten (10) GPD Officers to the Anne Arundel County Police Academy to get training (free) on using the E-tix device that prints out citations when they initiate traffic stops, accident exchange of information.

- ✓ Apr. 3<sup>rd</sup> – GPD Officers were dispatched to respond to the 8100 block of Martin Luther King, Jr. Highway (24/7 Tobacco Shop) for the report of a theft. The field investigation and surveillance video capture a male and female entering the store and the male grabbed four boxes of candy and both fled from the store without paying. They made good on their escape; however, the vehicle and tag number used were captured on the security cameras.
- ✓ Apr. 6<sup>th</sup> – GPD Officers assisted a Federal Agent Task Force in the 2500 block of Sir Michael Place to execute a search warrant. The home owner was arrested and taken into custody.
- ✓ Apr. 7<sup>th</sup> – GPD Officers were dispatched to respond to the 9300 block of Echols Avenue for a citizen robbery. The filed investigation reveals the victim was walking home when five (5) black males exited from a vehicle and approached him and started checking his pants pockets. They took his cell phone, Air Pods and demanded his sneakers. The victim advised that one suspect was armed and they were driving a gray colored Toyota and made good their escape.
- ✓ Apr. 8<sup>th</sup> – GPD Officers Sims and Harrison conducted a follow-up investigation regarding the theft from the 24/7 Tobacco Shop. They tracked down the owner of the vehicle used and revealed her grandson had the vehicle on the day of the theft. The merchandise was paid for (\$180.00) and grandson was barred from 8000 block of Martin Luther King, Jr. Highway.
- ✓ Apr. 14<sup>th</sup> – GPD Officers were dispatched to respond to the 9200 block of Woodmore Centre Drive (Snipes) for the report of a theft. The filed investigation revealed four suspects entered the store and started grabbing random merchandise and fled from the store. They made good their escape in a black Chevy Suburban. A follow-up investigation will be conducted. `
