**CHIEF OF POLICE REPORT**

**February 21, 2023-March 20, 2023**

February 23<sup>rd</sup> GPD Officers were dispatched to 2700 Block of Red Oak Lane, for a Breaking and Entering in progress. Upon our arrival officers, they were advised by Prince George's County Communications the defendant entered the residence by using a metal chair to shatter the upstairs patio door. The residence was occupied by 2 adult females and 2 female children, (ages of 4 and 8 years old).

Officers were notified by Prince George's County Communication's advising the victim was landline and stated the defendant also entered the room and barricaded the victims in the room by placing a dresser behind the door.

Officers were then advised the defendant did not have any weapons. Officers then made a command decision to enter the house. Multiple commands were given for the defendant to come out of the room, but the defendant did not comply with the demands. Officers then kicked in the door and found the defendant hiding underneath a mattress. The family was removed from the room unharmed, and the defendant was placed under arrest.

The defendant was transported to Prince George's Police Division, where he was interviewed and confessed to crime. The defendant was the transported to Upper Marlboro DOC to be processed.

February 27<sup>th</sup> GPD Officers were dispatched to 2700 Block of Red Oak Lane, for a Domestic Dispute between a husband and wife (Husband is the victim). Once officers arrived on scene, they observed a black male bleeding heavily from his for arm where he suffered a deep gash that was caused by a pocketknife. He stated he was cut by his wife after an argument. The wife left the scene before Police arrived. The husband was transported to Doctor's Hospital for stitches. Charges were placed against the wife by the husband.

February 28<sup>th</sup> GPD Officers were dispatched to 9450 Ruby Lockhart Boulevard (LA Fitness) for a stolen auto report. The complainant advised after playing volleyball, he discovered his gym bag was opened and his car keys were missing from the bag. He went outside to discover his vehicle (Burgundy 2011 Nissan Altima; Bearing MD tag) was not parked where he previously parked it. Prince George's Communications advised that the vehicle was NOT impounded or repossessed. The Officer was not able to view the security cameras because the general manager was on day off.

February 28<sup>th</sup> GPD Officer was proactively patrolling on Glenarden Parkway, when he observed a vehicle driving in a reckless manner. A traffic stop was initiated. The driver appeared to be under the influence of alcohol and stated he was drinking. A Standardized Field Sobriety Tests was performed. The driver was arrested was taken into custody, and transported to Prince George's Police District III, where he

submitted to a breathalyzer test. The driver was arrested and transported to the Department of Corrections.

March 5<sup>th</sup> GPD Officers were dispatched to the 8400 Block of Decatur Trotter Place for a check the welfare of a 2-year-old toddler walking in the street. Officers arrived on the scene and interviewed the caller. She stated when she arrived home, she observed a female toddler walking in the middle of the street wearing no shoes or pants. Officers began a door-to-door knock. Officers discovered an open door at 8421 Decatur Trotter Place and contacted the resident. He stated he was unaware his daughter was gone. He was reunited with his daughter, and she was not harmed. Child Protective Services was contacted. Agent Shantell Parady was advised of the incident and stated they would be conducting an interview and follow-up investigation.

March 13<sup>th</sup> GPD Officer was proactively patrolling at Glenarden Parkway and 5th Street, when he observed a silver in color Volkswagen passing him without a front registration plate and heavy tinted windows. After conducting a traffic stop and an investigation, the Virginia registration on the rear of the vehicle belonged to a different vehicle. The driver stated that he took the old registration off the rear because it was expired as of 2022. The Officer also observed a large 3 and half foot sword in the vehicle on the passenger side of the vehicle. The sword was recovered, and the vehicle was impounded after the driver was given several citations.

March 18<sup>th</sup> GPD Officer was proactively patrolling in the 8000 block of Martin Luther King Jr. Highway. The Officer observed an older model silver in color Honda pass him without a front registration plate. Once he got behind the vehicle, he observed an Arkansas registration attached to the back of the vehicle. After a traffic stop was initiated and revealed the vehicle was found to be unregistered and uninsured. The registration on the vehicle did not come back to any listed vehicle. The driver was released after receiving several citations. An inventory search of the vehicle revealed two fraudulent Texas buyer tags inside the vehicle with the vehicle's information on it. The tags were recovered and the vehicle was impounded by the tow company.
