CHIEF OF POLICE REPORT

August 21, 2023-September 20, 2023

August 22nd GPD Officer was dispatched to the 7900 Block of Echols Avenue for a suspicious auto. Upon arrival, the Officer observed a 2008 Chevrolet Silverado with Maryland registration 6BW5573 and a trailer attached at the location. A registration check through Prince George's County Communications revealed the vehicle was reported stolen the day before from the 10000 Block of Martin Luther King Jr. Highway.

The reporting person, an employee of Express Business Services, responded to the scene and recovered the vehicle and trailer. Teletype was notified.

August 22nd GPD Officer was dispatched to the 2900 Block of Buckthorn Court for a theft from auto. Upon arrival, the complainant stated she discovered the rear driver's side window and steering column had been broken. She further advised she had \$500 of U.S. Currency inside a pink wallet inside of the glove compartment inside of the vehicle the wallet was left behind, but the money had been taken.

There was no working nearby ring cameras in the area that had possibly witnessed the incident.

August 26th GPD Officer was dispatched to the 2700 Block of Red Oak Lane for reported vandalism. Upon arrival, the complainant stated she parked her White Hyundai Elantra in her designated parking on August 21, 2023, because of a dead battery. On this date, she noticed the ignition was broken. The door was unlocked but nothing was taken from the vehicle. No surveillance footage discovered by the Officer.

August 29th GPD Officer was dispatched to 9100 McCue Drive. (Bank Of America ATM) for an attempt break-in of the ATM. The caller stated 4 suspects pulled up to the ATM in a white sedan and attempted to gain entry to the ATM using miscellaneous tools. As the Officer approached the scene, the vehicle fled towards Five Lees Lane and proceeded to make a right turn onto Ruby Lockhart Blvd. The Officer notified Prince Georges County Communications and gave a description of the white Infiniti and registration number. The registration came back as a stolen vehicle. The vehicle started to drive recklessly heading onto 495 northbound. The officer ended the pursuit and returned to the scene. The tools were recovered, and suspects were unable to break into the ATM.

Prince Georges County Detective notified and responded to the scene.

August 30th GPD Officer was dispatched to 2700 Campus Way North, (Bath & Body Works) for a Theft. Upon arrival, the stated manager stated that 3 separate thefts took place totaling \$1,347.50. She reported multiple female suspects entered the location and began placing miscellaneous lotions, perfumes, and candles in a shopping cart. They exited the store with the unpaid merchandise and fled in a white 2012 Chevrolet Camaro bearing a Virginia Registration Plate in an unknown direction.

She also stated the same females have shoplifted from the store in the past and fled in a black Infiniti SUV bearing VA tags.

August 30th GPD Officers assisted Prince George's Police Department with an arrest search warrant in the 3100 Block of Polk Court in reference to an Armed Carjacking that occurred in Montgomery County on August 6, 2023. Upon arrival, the suspect was observed leaving the house and was captured after a brief foot chase. A search of the residence discovered a weapon and other evidence.

September 2nd GPD Officer was on proactive patrol in the 8000 block of Martin Luther King Jr. when he observed 4 juvenile males, who are known through previous acts of disturbing behavior and crimes, walking northbound towards Glenarden Parkway wearing black hoodies, jackets, ski masks. Two juveniles were carrying black backpacks on. As the Officer made a U-turn on Martin Luther King Jr. Highway and James Fletcher Way, he observed one juvenile pass off the backpack to another juvenile. The juvenile with the backpack took off running towards the 8100 block of Martin Luther King Jr. Highway towards the Glens At Arden apartment complex. The Officer was able to catch up to him before he tried to enter his apartment. The Officer gave verbal loud commands for him to drop the backpack. The juvenile dropped the backpack and yelled, "It's just a BB-GUN!"

His mother heard him yelling and came outside the apartment. When the Officer opened the black backpack, he observed a black semi-automatic style BB-Gun. When the Officer asked him why he was carrying a black backpack with a BB-Gun, He stated he was going in the woods to shoot it. With the full cooperation of his mother, the Officer confiscated the BB Gun and released the juvenile into the custody of his mother.

September 5th GPD Officers were dispatched to 8200 Martin Luther King Jr. Highway (7-11) for a theft. Upon arrival, the Officers noticed the front door to the establishment leaning off the doorframe and a crack in the lower glass of the door. The storeowner stated two juvenile males entered the store and took several miscellaneous items with paying for them. The juveniles then re-entered the store to remove more items. Upon exiting, forcefully pushed the door causing the damage. The owner was able to produce surveillance footage and a photo of one of the suspects. These are the same juveniles involved in the above listed incident.

September 5th GPD Officers were dispatched to the 3300 Block of Brightseat Road for a reported suspicious occupied auto. Upon arrival, Officers observed a Gray 2023 Toyota occupied by an undressed male and a female. The Officers had them dress and identify themselves. The Officers requested a warrant check through Prince Georges County Communications on both individuals. The check revealed the female had an active warrant since June 30, 2022.

She was placed under arrest and transported to Upper Marlboro Department of Corrections for processing. The male was released.

GPD Officer was working secondary employment at Woodmore Town Center. He was advised of a fist fight in front of 2830 Campus Way North. (Vision Works). Upon arrival, the Officer observed a male leaned over at the waist standing over top of another male who was lying on his back. The male standing over the other attempted to explain his version of what had occurred. While conducting a pat down for weapons, the subject attempted to flee on foot in the direction of 9200 block of Woodmore Center Drive. He was apprehended in front of Snipes Store.

The Officers were able to review the surveillance video of the incident. The defendant was placed under arrest and transported to Upper Marlboro Department of Corrections for processing.

The victim was treated for injuries to the mouth and head by Prince George's County EMS.

September 13th GPD Officer was working secondary employment at the Wegmans located at 9001 McHugh Drive. The Officer was notified by Wegman Management of an individual attempting to purchase items using a counterfeit \$50.00 dollar bill. Management stated the individual in question was advised that he was in possession of a fraudulent bill he became irate. Management also advised that they checked the authenticity of the bill will a "Fraudulent Pen." The individual was escorted back to the Asset Protection Office.

The Officer conducted a warrant check through Prince George's County Police Communications, the return revealed an active warrant through the Prince George's County Office of The Sheriffs. The suspect was placed into custody without further incident.

A search incident to arrest was performed on the suspect. The Officer recovered six (6) \$100 dollar bills from his left pants pocket. The Fraudulent Pen confirmed the bills were counterfeit. The United Secret Service was notified, and the suspect was transported to Upper Marlboro Department of Corrections for processing.

September 13th GPD Officer was dispatched to (7-Eleven) located at 8200 Martin Luther King Jr. Highway for a vandalism. Upon arrival on the scene, the Officer spoke with the store employee who stated three men dressed in all black with ski-masks came inside the store and attempted to break into the Automated Teller Machine (ATM). After an unsuccessful attempt, they fled in a dark color unknown make and model vehicle.

September 16th GPD attended and participated in Glenarden Day.
