**CHIEF OF POLICE REPORT**

**April 21, 2023- May 20, 2023**

April 21<sup>st</sup> GPD Officer was on proactive traffic enforcement. The Officer observed a black in color SUV make a right on Sir Michael Place from Glenarden Parkway without stopping at the Stop Sign. The Officer activated his emergency equipment and initiated a traffic stop at Smithview Place. The driver was identified by her District of Columbia Driver's License. The Officer requested a wanted person/registration check through Prince George's County Communications. The return revealed the driver had an open warrant through Metro Transit Police issued December 15, 2021, for Failure to Appear. The Defendant was placed under arrest and transported her to the Department of Corrections for processing. The vehicle was released to the passenger, who had a valid Driver's License.

April 22<sup>nd</sup> GPD Officer was dispatched to 2900 Block of Hobblebush Court, for a reported stolen vehicle. The Officer met the complainant who stated her 2012 Red Hyundai Sonata was stolen. The Officer canvassed the area for surveillance for cameras. He asked the complainant's neighbor to check her Ring Camera. The camera captured an unidentified male leaving the scene in her vehicle around 4:08 A.M. Prince George's County Communications confirmed there is no record of her vehicle being impounded or repossessed. Prince George's County Police Auto Theft Unit and Teletype were notified.

April 22<sup>nd</sup> GPD Officer was working secondary employment at (Wegmans) 9001 McHugh Drive. The Officer was notified by an Asset Protection Officer of a shopper who failed to scan the merchandise in her basket and walked past all working registers and all final point of sales exiting out of the store.

The Officer initiated an investigatory stop on the female outside the Café Entrance of the establishment. The female was escorted to the Asset Protection Office, where she identified herself by word of mouth. The Officer requested a warrant check through Prince George's County Police Communications, which revealed no active warrants. The defendant was then placed under arrest for the stolen merchandise, which totaled \$775.78. The defendant was transported to the Department of Correction for processing.

April 27<sup>th</sup> GPD Officers were dispatched to 8001 Martin Luther King Jr. Highway (24 Hour Tobacco) for a theft that just occurred. Upon arrival, they met with the complainant who advised an African American male wearing dark clothing entered the store and stole multiple bottles of laundry detergent. One Officer canvassed the area and observed a male fitting the description standing in front of 7926 Glenarden Parkway. The unknown male was seen standing next to a bag that was later identified to be the stolen laundry detergent. The suspect began walking away from the bag and was stopped by the

Officer. The Officer advised the suspect the reason for the stop and was given a name by word of mouth.

A warrant check through Prince George's County Police Communications revealed the suspect had 5 open warrants in Prince George's County for theft and other violations. The defendant was placed in custody and taken to Upper Marlboro Department of Corrections for processing.

May 4<sup>th</sup> Chief Bryant read books to students at Judge Sylvania Woods Elementary School.

May 7<sup>th</sup> GPD Officers were dispatched to the 1400 Block of 2nd Street for sounds of gunshots. Once Officers arrived on the scene, they found 11 spent shell casings on the street. Officers spoke with the homeowner who lives at one of the locations on 2nd Street. A second resident in the block advised a bullet struck her front door frame. A bullet fragment was found by Officers after speaking with the resident and checking her home.

Both residents had ring cameras but had no footage of the suspects or the actual crime. Officers canvassed the rest of the neighborhood for suspects, victims, and potential surveillance cameras but were unsuccessful. Prince George's County Detectives were notified and arrived on scene. The case was classified as vandalism by gunfire since there were no victims. The 11 spent shell casings were recovered as evidence.

May 9<sup>th</sup> GPD Officers were dispatched to 9450 Ruby Lockhart Boulevard (LA Fitness) for a stolen auto report. The complainant reported she had parked her 2016 Hyundai Sonata in the parking lot around 7:30 PM and upon her return at 8:00 PM, her vehicle was gone from the space where she parked it and she observed broken glass on the ground. The LA Fitness Representative stated the Manager is the only person that has access to any possible video. Shortly after responding home, the complainant contacted the Officer and reported her debit card left inside of her vehicle was attempted to be used at the Target Store in Bowie Maryland. Teletype and Prince Georges County Auto Theft Unit were notified.

May 16<sup>th</sup> GPD Command staff met with Mr. Anthony Bennett, Prince George's County Office of the Inspector General, to discuss the functions of the new Police Accountability Board, the Administrative Charging Committee, and the Office of the Inspector General.

May 18<sup>th</sup>, GPD Officers were dispatched to 9151 Ruby for a robbery suspect at 20706. Upon arrival, the Officers observed a subject fitting the description. During the interview, the suspect admitted he took money from the cash register at the Bo Jangles located at 1050 Largo Centre Drive. The suspect was detained and a warrant check through Prince George's County Communications revealed an open warrant for the suspect. He was arrested and transported to District 8 to be interviewed by PGPD Detectives.

May 18<sup>th</sup> while patrolling the ward, observed a male standing behind the A1 Liquors located at 7910 Martin Luther King Jr. Highway. The Officer knew the male by his nickname and knew he was a person of interest from a homicide that occurred in Prince George's County in 2021. The person was detained and transported to District 8 to be interviewed by Prince George's County Detectives.

May 19<sup>th</sup> GPD Officers were dispatched to the 3200 block of Hubbard Road for two suspicious teenagers walking through the parking lot looking into cars. Upon arrival, Officers contacted two juvenile males

that fit the description. While interviewing the juveniles, the Officer observed a screwdriver in one of the juveniles in his front left pocket. He stated he was going to help his grandfather change his tire.

During the interview with the juveniles, a person walked up and stated his driver's side rear window was broken and his ignition had been damaged on his 2017 Kia SUV. Officers checked the area to see if they could find a security camera with negative results. Officers could not prove that the juveniles vandalized the vehicle. Officers obtained their information, and they left the area. Officers made a report for the owner of the vehicle.

May 20<sup>th</sup>, GPD Officers were dispatched to 7900 block of Johnson Avenue for the sounds of gunshots. Officers responded to 7941 Johnson Avenue and discovered multiple shell casings. Further investigation revealed the front door of the apartment building, and two apartment patio doors were shattered. No suspect look out was given and no victims were located or responded to local hospitals. Prince George's County Detectives were notified and arrived on scene. The case was classified as vandalism by gunfire since there were no victims. The spent shell casings were recovered as evidence.
