City of Rockford Organization:

The City of Rockford is governed under a council-manager form of government.

Under the council-manager form of government, the Rockford City Council is responsible for the legislative function of the municipality such as establishing policy, passing local ordinances, voting appropriations, and developing an overall vision. The legislative body, which is voted into office by public elections, appoints a professional manager to oversee the administrative operations, implement its policies, and advise it.

The position of "mayor" is selected by the council from among its members.

The city manager position is similar to that of corporate CEO, providing professional management to the City Council. The City Council makes major decisions, and exercises representative power on behalf of the citizens. The city manager is, in turn, responsible for hiring a city staff to carry out implementation of city ordinances.

City Council meets the 2nd Monday of the month at 7:00pm at City Hall and is open to the public.

Water Utility Billing:

Water and sewer bills go out every other month (February, April, June, August, October and December) and are due on the last business day of the month.

Payments can be made at City Hall, either in person during business hours or use our drop box outside anytime. You also have the option to pay online at www.rockford.mi.us, online payments do have a small service fee. You can also sign up for auto payments. With auto payments, you will still get a bill in the mail and funds will be withdrawn on the bill due date.

If you ever have any questions about your water bill, please contact City Hall at 616-866-1537.

If you believe you have a water or sewer problem, do not hesitate to call the City offices. One of our staff will forward your information and concerns to our Public Services Department, who will arrive to assess the problem immediately. If the problem arises outside normal business hours, call the Rockford Public Safety Department at 616-866-9557.





Residential Refuse Services

Residents can use any refuse service they would like. However, the City of Rockford has a non-exclusive Residential Refuse Agreement with Arrow Waste and have a locked in rate for residents through 2023.

Trash Service: \$13.00 per month for a 96 gallon container

\$10.50 per month for a 64 gallon container

Recycle Service: \$3.12 per month for a 96 gallon container

For residents who have small amounts of refuse, a bag service is available for \$1.50 per bag, and are sold in packs of 10 bags for \$15.00 at City Hall.

Voter Registration

Registering to Vote

Residents can stop by City Hall or any Michigan Secretary of State's Office to register as a new voter in the City of Rockford. You must be a US Citizen at least 18 years of age by the date of the election to register to vote

Absentee Voting

All registered voters are now eligible to vote absentee if you have met the photo ID rule when you registered to vote. If you registered to vote in person at City Hall or Secretary of State office or have been voting at the polls since you registered to vote you have met the photo ID rule.

The absentee voting process can take place in person, by mail, or by using the drop box just outside the front door of City Hall.

If you would like to vote absentee in future elections, we can add you to a Permanent Voter List. For every election, we will then mail you a Michigan Absent Voter Ballot Application (required) for you to complete and return to us prior to each election. Requesting to vote by absentee for future elections doesn't prohibit you from voting in person the day of the election. If you choose to vote in person for a particular election, then you won't complete the Absentee Voter Ballot Application when it arrives in the mail.

In order to be placed on the Absentee Voter list, you may do one of the following:

Voting in Person on Election Day

The City of Rockford has two voting precincts. Precinct 1's polling location is at the Fire Station. Precinct 1 is any house east of the Rogue River. Precinct 2's polling location is at City Hall. Precinct 2 is any house west of the Rogue River. Both of these polling locations are at 7 S. Monroe St.

Yard Waste:

The City of Rockford provides a curbside yard waste collection program for our residents who live inside the city limits.

The program is conducted by the Department of Public Services (DPS) and runs throughout the "growing season"; or from roughly early April to early December.

The Yard Waste Collection Program is intended to provide taxpayers a means to dispose of normal yard waste.


Normal yard waste includes your grass clippings, leaves, weeds and brush trimmed from trees and shrubs from your yard.

Yard waste shall be placed in bio-degradable paper yard waste bags only.

Land clearing, large tree removal, or work done by a contractor does not qualify for the City's yard waste collection program.

In the fall, typically mid-October, DPS crews will start the leaf vacuum. During this time taxpayers are allowed to rake their leaves curbside.


This is the only time of the season that leaves do not need to be bagged.





DPS crews do branch chipping every Monday and follow a route starting on the northeast side of the city (Shaw Estates), and systematically move throughout the city finishing on the northwest side of the city (Heritage Park).

Brush must be placed curbside by 7am Monday to be picked up.



Important Local Ordinances:

Lawn Maintenance

Residents are required to maintain their lawn. Grass and/or weeds must be less than 12 inches tall. Do not leave any trash, litter, junk, rags, garbage, rubbish or anything of like nature and in or around your yard which flies, insects, rodents or vermin may exist, breed or multiply.

Fireworks

Consumer fireworks are only allowed to be ignited on the following days and times:

- New Years: December 31 after 11am until 1am on January 1.
- Memorial Day Weekend: Saturday and Sunday only (11am-11:45pm each day).
- Independence Day: June 29 to July 4 only (11am-11:45pm each day). If July 5 is on a Friday or Saturday it is permitted (11am-11:45pm).
- Labor Day Weekend: Saturday and Sunday only (11am-11:45pm each day).

Burning Ordinance

The City of Rockford does not allow the burning of brush or rubbish. Recreational fires shall not be conducted within 25 feet of a structure or combustible matter. Conditions which could cause a fire to spread within 25 feet of a structure shall be eliminated prior to ignition. Bonfires or recreational fires shall be constantly attended until the fire is extinguished. And must be in a portable firepit. Permanent firepits are not allowed inside the city limits.

Pets/Animals

We love pets and consider ourselves a dog friendly city. Please keep your pet on a leash when not in your yard and clean up after them. The keeping of household pets, including dogs, cats, fish, birds, hamsters and other animals generally regarded as household pets is permitted as an accessory use in any Residential District. However, no more than three (3) dogs or cats, six (6) months of age or older, in any combination thereof, shall be kept or housed in or at one (1) dwelling unit.

The keeping of animals not normally considered household pets, including, but not limited to, horses, pigs, sheep, and cattle is prohibited in all zoning districts.

Any area where such permitted animals are kept shall be maintained in a safe and sanitary condition



Important Local Ordinances:

Noise

Please be mindful of your neighbors and observe the quiet hours of 11pm-7am. If you have pets, you are responsible for making sure they aren't making excessive noise at any time. And please be thoughtful of your neighbors when listening to music or gathering with friends outside.

Recreational Equipment Storage

Recreation equipment (Campers, RV's, boats, etc...) can only be parked or stored in back of your house. They are only allowed to be parked in the front of your house for a maximum of 48 hours in a week for loading, unloading and cleaning purposes and cannot be parked in the street. Recreation equipment cannot be used for living or housekeeping purposes.

Snow Removal

Residents are required to have snow removed from city sidewalks within 24 hours from when the snow stops falling. In addition, snow removed from private property is not to be placed in the public way – streets, alleys, parking lots, driveways, or any other public areas. It is also forbidden to place snow or ice onto the property of another person without prior approval. City crews clear the public streets after each snowfall. Heavily traveled roads are first priority.

Seasonal Parking Ban

From November 15th until April 1st of each year there is a seasonal parking ban on all public streets from 2 am until 6 am. This restriction is in place to accommodate snow removal during the early hours of the morning. Please note, that the ban is in force for the months indicated above and is not lifted due to a lack of snowfall.

Rockford Dam Overlook

The Rockford Dam Overlook is one of the highlights of Rockford and provides a spectacular view of the Rogue River. Ideal for picnicking and watching the fishermen, this park is a gem of downtown Rockford. There is direct access to the river. The Rockford Dam Overlook is located on Bridge Street downtown.





Peppler Park

Peppler Memorial Park is on the Rogue River west of the Rockford Dam. It has a fishing platform, picnicking, and provides for a walk across the dam. Peppler Park has a new overlook, railings, access ramp, landscaping, flowers, stairs to Bridge Street, and hosts the Rockford Area Community Endowment "Recognition Plaza".

Garden Club Park

Come relax in downtown Rockford. On the banks of the Rogue River, the White Pine Trail State Park winds through for bicycling and walking. Just northeast of the dam, Garden Club Park includes new leveling, picnic tables, lighting, and a concert deck. This is the scene for the popular summer music series, the "Rogue River Blues".

Rogue River Nature Trail

The Rogue River Nature Trail is a boardwalk along the Rogue River. It begins in Peppler Park, west of the Rockford Dam. The trail encompasses 4.5 acres, and the boardwalk winds a quarter mile north along the river bank, offering scenic views of wooded areas, the Rogue River, and downtown Rockford.

White Pine Trail State Park

A turn-of-the-century railroad line is now a linear Park, and an area favorite. The trail provides a direct paved link from Grand Rapids, with access to Fifth Third Park and the West River area. It runs through Rockford along the scenic Rogue River and provides wonderful opportunities for walking, bicycling and rollerblading.





Memorial Park

Featuring the Rum Creek Nature and Fitness Trail. Rum Creek is a pristine, cold water trout stream. View incredible wetlands and a beautiful creek. Memorial Park is home to the popular Community Cabin and one of the finest wooden playground structures in the area, Pachyderm Park, at 220 N. Monroe.

Glen Park

Glen Park is Rockford's newest park. A boardwalk, playground and nature trail make this a great place to relax with family and friends. An array of playground equipment, picnic tables and benches in a shady wooded setting provide plenty of room and enjoyment. Glen Park is on Glen Park Drive, just west of Highland Drive.

Richardson-Sowerby Park and Dog Park

This is one of Rockford's great finds! On both the east and west banks of the Rogue River. The east bank has a covered pavilion for picnicking, BBQ grills, a playground, fishing opportunities and restrooms. Across the pedestrian bridge, on the west bank, there is a fitness course and softball field and our dog park. Easily accessible from the White Pine State Trail or off Main St. behind the Rogue Valley Towers.






Pickett Park




