This is in reference to the Southampton County Board of Supervisor's request to restrict through truck traffic on Route 650 (Shady Brook Trail) from Route 58 (Southampton Parkway) to Route 671 (General Thomas Highway), a distance of 2.54 miles

The Virginia Department of Transportation has conducted a review and engineering study of the request per the requirements of VA Section 46.2-809, the CTB Guidelines set forth in 24VAC30-580 and VDOT's established process and procedures and determined it meets the criteria established by the CTB for a through truck restriction.

Based on the above information and pursuant to the provisions of Section 46.2-809 of the Code of Virginia and the authority granted to me by the Commonwealth Transportation Board, Route 650 (Shady Brook Trail) from Route 58 (Southampton Parkway) to Route 671 (General Thomas Highway), a distance of 2.54 miles is therefore prohibited to any through truck or truck and trailer or semitrailer combinations, except a pickup or panel truck.

Such closure shall apply only to through traffic of such trucks and not such vehicles with points of origin or destination along the affected routes. By copy of this letter, I am directing the Virginia Department of Transportation, Hampton Roads District to erect the proper signs to notify the traveling public of this restriction along Route 650.

AN ORDINANCE TO REQUEST


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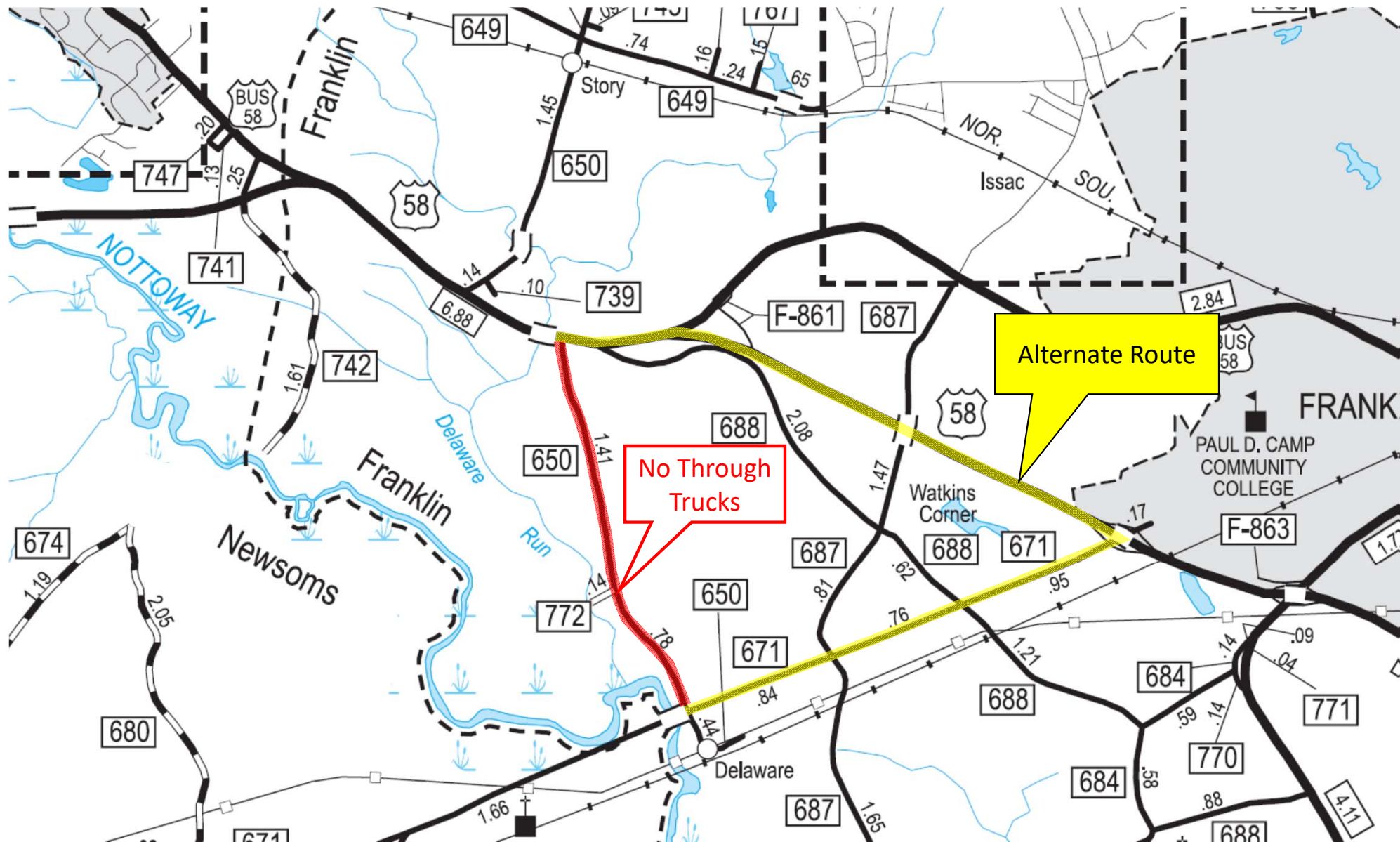
BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of Southampton County, Virginia that the VDOT Commissioner is hereby requested to restrict through-truck traffic on Shady Brook Trail (State Route 650) from Southampton Parkway (U.S. Route 58) to General Thomas Highway (S.R. 671). It is requested that such restriction shall apply to any truck, or truck and trailer/semitrailer combination except pickups, panel trucks, farm tractors or farm utility vehicles, with a registered gross weight in excess of 7,500 pounds.

The proposed alternate route for through-trucks shall be Southampton Parkway (U.S. Route 58) to General Thomas Highway (State Route 671).

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of Southampton County, Virginia that it will use the Southampton County Sheriff's Office for enforcement of the proposed restriction.

For state law authority, please see §46.2-809 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended.

Notice of Public Hearing**

Notice is hereby given pursuant to Section 15.2-1427, Section 15.2-2204 and Section 46.2-809 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended that the Southampton County Board of Supervisors will conduct a public hearing on **Tuesday, November 24, 2020, at 6:00 p.m.**, or as soon thereafter as may be heard, at ~~Southampton High School, 23350 Southampton Parkway, Courtland, Virginia~~ to consider the following matters:

1) An ordinance restricting through-truck traffic on Shady Brook Trail (State Route 650) from Southampton Parkway (U.S. Route 58) to General Thomas Highway (State Route 671). The restriction may apply to any truck or truck and trailer or semitrailer combination, except a pickup or panel truck, as may be necessary to promote the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the Commonwealth. The alternate route for through-trucks shall be Southampton Parkway (U.S. Route 58) to General Thomas Highway (State Route 671).

2) An ordinance to amend and reordain Section 1-13.1 of the Southampton County Code which, if adopted, would increase the assessment against a convicted defendant as part of the costs in a criminal or traffic case in district or circuit court from \$10 to \$20. This assessment shall be used solely for the funding of courthouse security personnel, or, if requested by the sheriff, for equipment and other personal property used in connection with courthouse security.

3) An ordinance to amend and reordain Section 15-79 of the Southampton County Code which, if adopted, would allow individuals to "file by exception," eliminating the need for the annual filing of personal property tax forms by individuals. Filing by exception will not be made available to businesses or farmers, as these groups own property that is not maintained by DMV or prorated.

4) An ordinance to amend and reordain Section 15-94 of the Southampton County Code which, if adopted, would extend the three-year filing cycle for elderly and handicapped exemptions by one year only. The full filing requirement would resume in January 2022 and each three years thereafter.

Southampton County intends to follow all current Executive Orders associated with temporary restrictions due to the novel coronavirus (COVID-19), including best practices related to physical distancing, and the use of face coverings.

This hearing will be held at a public facility designed to be accessible to persons with disabilities.
