Housing Assistance

- Weatherization
- Home modifications such as wheel chair ramp or items to improve accessibility, can be rental or owner-occupied
- Ordinary repairs that reduce the risk of falling or improve general safety, accessibility,

functional abilities and independence



Permitted

- Exterior lighting
- Addressing safety hazards
- Ramps
- $\bullet \, Handrails$
- Sidewalks
- Electrical outlets
- •HVAC
- Roofs

Not Permitted

- Improvements, modifications, replacements, renovations or alterations that materially increase value or useful life
- Capital improvement projects



Timeline for Funds

- Application is open as of today <u>RPC website</u>
- Application due date is January 5, 2024 at noon
- Funding recommendations will be presented to the Board of Stark County Commissioners during a work session on January 29 or 30, 2024 (tentative)
- Funding recommendations will be presented to the RPC Board on February 6, 2024 at 7:00pm
- Contracts will be distributed to subrecipients for signature on or around February 12, 2024
- 50% of the total grant must be obligated by March 31, 2024 or funds will be recaptured by the State
- 100% of the grant must be expended by September 19, 2024
