Disbursement of Excess 2013 SPT Monies

County Treasurer Joe Barbuto explained that in 2012, the voters approved two ballot propositions to be paid for with the 1% specific purpose and use excise tax and since then, Sweetwater County has received excess funds that vendors collected but not reported to the Wyoming Department of Revenue. Mr. Barbuto explained, that per Wyoming Statute and the original resolution, the funds will be disbursed and as of July 18, 2022, the total of these excess SPT funds is \$169,123.17; \$111,034.88 for municipalities and \$58,088.29 for the county, which includes Memorial Hospital and Castle Rock Hospital District. Mr. Barubto shared that to pay for any refund requests from the Department of Revenue, he will withhold \$10,000, leaving \$159,123.17 to be allocated. Mr. Barbuto explained that the withheld amount will be divided between the municipalities and the county in the same proportions as their share of the original resolution; 68.3721% (\$6,837.21) from municipalities and 31.6279% (\$3,162.79) from the county with the breakdown listed below. Following discussion expressing that the additional funds must go to the specified projects' operations and maintenance, *Commissioner Thoman moved to authorize the disbursement of checks to Memorial Hospital and Castle Rock Hospital in the amount as presented. Commissioner Schoenfeld seconded the motion.* Following discussion, the motion carried.

Resolution Authorizing SWCO to participate in the Wyoming Cooperative Liquid Assets Securities System (Wyoming CLASS) Investment Pool

Treasurer Joe Barbuto presented Resolution 22-08-CC-01, a resolution authorizing Sweetwater County to join with other political subdivisions of the State of Wyoming as a participant in the Wyoming Cooperative Liquid Assets Securities System to "Wyoming CLASS" to pool funds for investment. Following discussion, Commissioner Thoman moved to approve the Resolution authorizing Sweetwater County to participate in the Wyoming Cooperative Liquid Assets Securities System Investment Pool. Commissioner Lloyd seconded the motion. The motion carried.

RESOLUTION NO. 22-08-CC-01

A resolution authorizing Sweetwater County to join with other political subdivisions of the State of Wyoming as a Participant ("Participant") in the Wyoming Cooperative Liquid Assets Securities System "Wyoming CLASS" (the "Trust") to pool funds for investment.

WHEREAS, W.S. 9-4-831 authorizes political subdivisions of the state of Wyoming as defined therein under W.S. 9-4-831(a) ("Political Subdivisions") to invest in eligible securities as defined in W.S. 9-4-831 ("Legal Investments"); and

WHEREAS, W.S. 9-4-831(a)(viii) authorizes Political Subdivisions to invest jointly with other investors in a commingled fund of Legal Investments; and

WHEREAS, the Trust is a statutory trust formed under the laws of the state of Wyoming in accordance with W.S. 17-23-114 and it is the intent and purpose of the Trust to provide for the investment in only those Legal Investments for Political Subdivisions in accordance with W.S. 9-4-831; and

WHEREAS, U.S. Bank National Association is custodian for the Trust ("Custodian") and all eligible securities of the Trust are held

through the Custodian; and

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the Participants to permit their respective cash balances to be invested in the Trust; and

WHEREAS, Sweetwater County, a Political Subdivision, desires to become a Participant in the Trust.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby RESOLVED by the Governing Body of this Political Subdivision as follows:

- 1. The Sweetwater County Board of Commissioners hereby approves, adopts, and thereby joins as a Participant with other Political Subdivisions pursuant to the Wyoming CLASS Indenture of Trust dated May 29, 2020, as amended from time-to-time, the terms of which are incorporated herein by this reference and a copy of which shall be filed with the minutes of the meeting at which this Resolution was adopted; and
- 2. The Custodian, acting as a depository, is hereby designated as a depository for the funds of this Political Subdivision which shall be invested in the Trust on behalf of its general fund and all other accounts, and the Key Contact is directed and authorized to execute any and all depository forms and resolutions of said Custodian, and that said resolutions are adopted as reflected thereon. The application of U.S. Bank National Association to become a depository is hereby accepted.
- 3. The Key Contact and Authorized Signatories are those persons listed on the Trust Registration Form attached hereto and incorporated herein. The Authorized Signatories are authorized by the Participant to direct the investment of such Participants' investment funds and to take all such actions deemed necessary or desirable to carry out the activities otherwise authorized by this Resolution, subject to the Authorized Signatories' obligation to take such actions only in the name of and for the benefit of this Participant.
- 4. The Key Contact and Authorized Signatories may be changed from time-to-time by written notice to Wyoming CLASS.

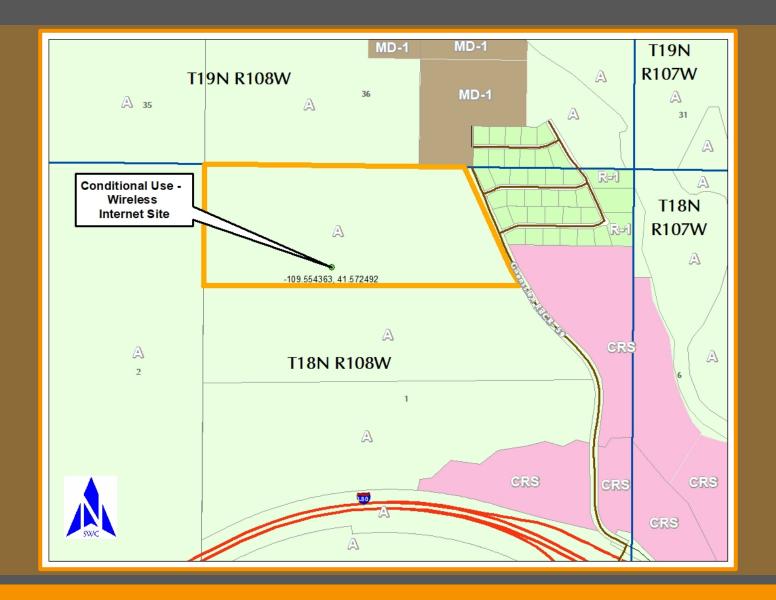

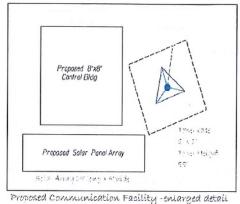

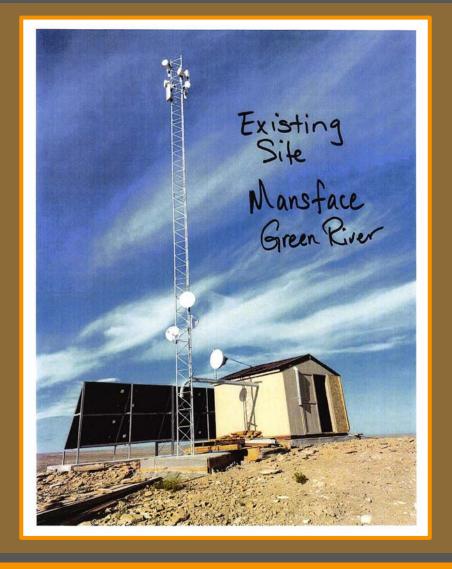

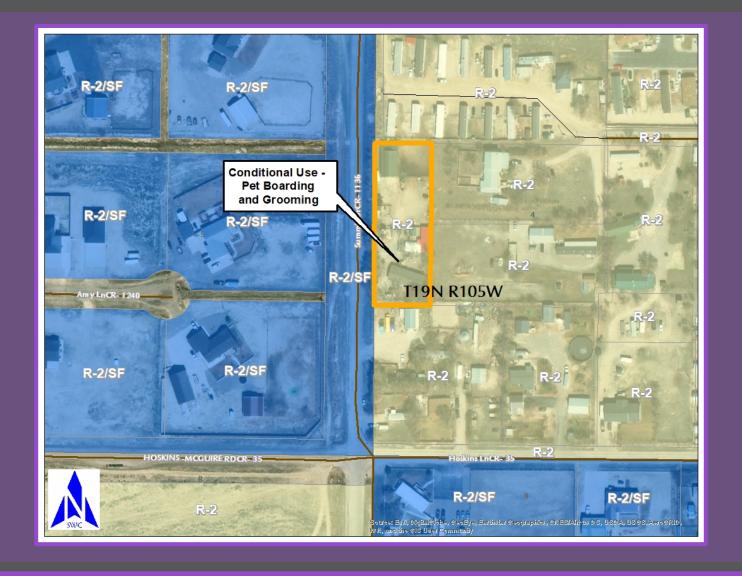

Land Use staff does not foresee this adversely affecting adjacent properties. Staff has not received any complaints concerning the kennels since Brenda has taken over in August 2017.

3. Compatible with existing or allowable uses of adjacent properties.

This property is primarily adjacent to R-2/SF (Single Family Residential) and other R-2 (Mixed Residential) properties. This property has been the location of a kennel for many years.



4. Has adequate public facilities.

Staff has reviewed the existing kennels to the specific criteria within the Zoning Resolution, and the existing and future use will continue to meet all setback, fencing, and sanitary requirements.

5. Adequate provisions for maintenance of the use & associated structures.

The request does have adequate provisions for the requested uses. Brenda has also applied for a construction permit to add a 24' x 12' shed to her property to be used for additional grooming space. This construction permit approval is contingent upon the CUP approval.

6. Minimum adverse effects on the natural environment.

Staff does not foresee any adverse effects on the natural environment.



7. Will not create undue traffic congestion.

Staff does not anticipate traffic congestion associated with these uses, nor have there been any traffic issues in the past.

8. Will not adversely affect public health, safety or welfare.

Staff does not foresee any health, safety or welfare issues. Kennel owners are required to adhere to stringent sanitary conditions and may be inspected at any future time to assure compliance.

9. Conforms to the Zoning Resolution.

The proposed uses conforms to Sweetwater County Zoning Resolution.

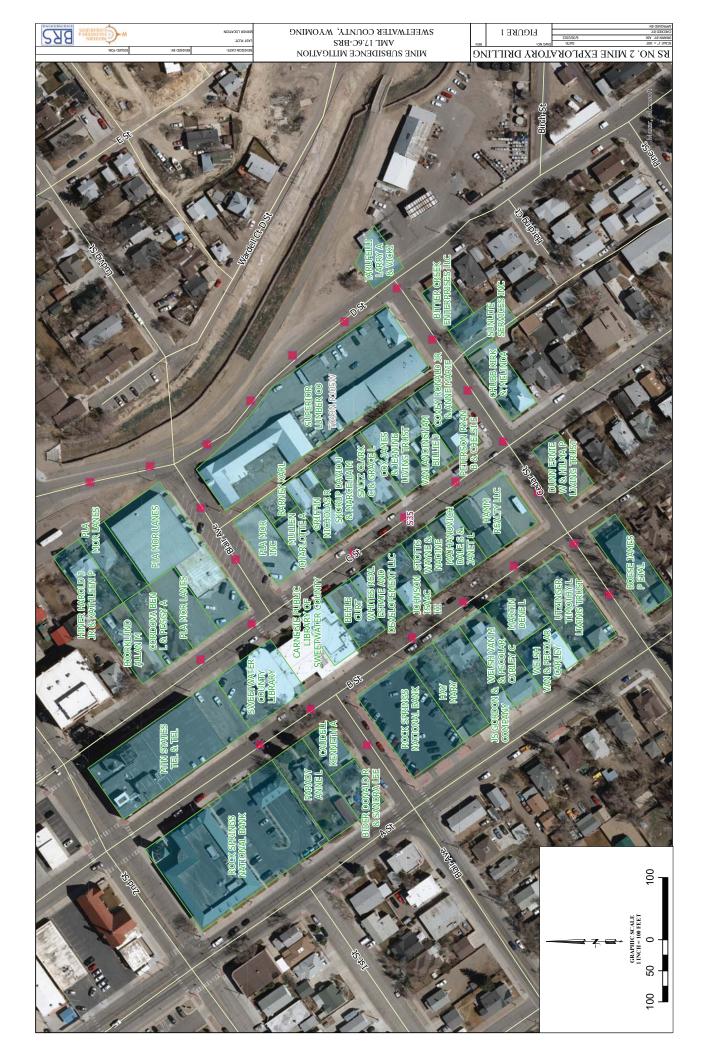

CITY OF ROCK SPRINGS, WYOMING CITY OF GREEN RIVER, WYOMING SWEETWATER COUNTY, WYOMING AMENDED COMBINED COMMUNICATIONS JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into on this day of day of 2022 by and between the City of Rock Springs, Wyoming, a Wyoming Municipal Corporation (hereinafter "Rock Springs"); the City of Green River, Wyoming, a Wyoming Municipal Corporation (hereinafter "Green River") and Sweetwater County, Wyoming, a body corporate and politic of the State of Wyoming (hereinafter "Sweetwater County");

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Rock Springs, Green River and Sweetwater County, each constitute an "agency" as defined in the Wyoming Joint Powers Act, Wyo. Stat. §16-1-102 through §16-1-110 (hereinafter referred to as "The Act"), and are sometimes referred to in the singular as "Participating Agency" and collectively as "Participating Agencies"; and,

WHEREAS, the Act [§ 16-1-104(a)] provides that any power, privilege or authority exercised or capable of being exercised by an agency may be exercised and enjoyed jointly with any other agency having a similar power, privilege or authority; and,

WHEREAS, the Act further provides that a county may enter into and operate under a joint powers agreement with one or more agencies for the performance of any function that the agency is authorized to perform; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Wyo. Stat. §18-2-108(a) counties and municipalities have the authority to enter into joint agreements for the establishment and operation of police protection agencies; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Wyo. Stat. §15-1-103(xxxiv) Rock Springs and Green River have the authority to establish and regulate police departments; and,

WHEREAS, telephone and radio communications are a necessary component of all law enforcement agencies, established and regulated by the Participating Agencies, as well as a necessity for preservation of public health, safety and welfare; and,

WHEREAS, the Participating Agencies have determined that the best interests of the citizens of the Participating Agencies would be served by the establishment of a Combined Communications Center for the Purpose of maximizing efficiency and coordination in communications and dispatching between the Sweetwater County Sheriff's Department, the Rock Springs Police Department, the Green River Police Department, and other law enforcement agencies; and,

WHEREAS, the participating agencies have determined that the Combined Communications Center shall be located in the City of Green River; and,

WHEREAS, the Participating Agencies have determined that a joint and cooperative telecommunications system will result in substantial economic savings; and,

WHEREAS, the participating Agencies have determined and agreed that it is necessary and proper to create and organize a Joint Powers Board under said Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants and agreements contained herein it is understood and agreed between the Participating Agencies as follows:

SECTION I PURPOSE

The purpose of this Agreement is to provide an efficient, orderly and economically feasible method of planning, financing, constructing, operating, and maintaining a Combined Communications Center that will serve and be of benefit to the Participating Agencies and their citizens. Said Combined Communications Center shall be located in the City of Green River.

SECTION II DURATION

This Agreement and the Joint Powers Board shall be of perpetual duration; however, this Agreement and the Joint Powers Board may be dissolved and terminated by action of a majority of the Board of County Commissioners of Sweetwater County and the governing bodies of Rock Springs and Green River; provided, that this Agreement and the Joint Powers Board shall not be dissolved or terminated so long as outstanding financial obligations of the Joint Powers Board exist or provision for their payment or other satisfaction has not been made.

SECTION III CREATION, ORGANIZATION AND COMPOSITION OF JOINT POWERS BOARD

There is hereby created, pursuant to the Act (§ 16-1-106), the "Rock Springs, Green River, Sweetwater County, Combined Communications Joint Powers Board," (hereinafter referred to as the "Joint Powers Board").

1. The Joint Powers Board shall consist of nine (9) members, all of whom shall be qualified electors of Sweetwater County, Pursuant to the Act (§16-1-106), it is not incompatible office-holding for an officer or legal representative of a county, municipal corporation, school district, special district, public institution, agency, board, commission or political subdivision to be a member of the Joint Powers Board.

- 2. Each Participating Agency shall appoint three (3) members to the Joint Powers Board. In the case of the City of Rock Springs and the City of Green River, one of the members appointed shall be the chief of police and in the case of Sweetwater County, one of the members appointed shall be the County Sheriff. Each Participating Agency shall make its initial appointments for staggering terms of one (1), two (2) and three (3) years. Following the initial appointments, all appointments shall be for terms of three (3) years.
- 3. Said members shall be appointed within five (5) days of the approval of this Agreement by the Wyoming Attorney General and the Participating Agencies. Within fifteen (15) days after their appointment, the members of the Joint Powers Board shall hold an organizational meeting. All vacancies in the Joint Powers Board shall be made by the governing bodies of the retiring or vacating member, except as hereinafter described. Vacancies caused by disability, death, termination, or any other reason prior to the expiration of a full term shall be filled, for the remainder of the term, by the appointment of a suitable and qualified replacement by the governing body of the Participating Agency that made the Original appointment.
- 4. At the organizational meeting, the members of the Joint Powers Board shall also elect from the membership a Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer. The Secretary of the Joint Powers Board shall notify the Participating Agencies of the Joint Powers Board's organization and shall file a certificate showing its organization with the County Clerk of Sweetwater County and the Wyoming Secretary of State.
- 5. The Joint Powers Board shall meet at the call of the chairman, upon oral or written request of the majority of the Joint Powers Board members, within five (5) days after the request is given by any Participating Agency, or in any event not less than once every three (3) months.

SECTION IV POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE JOINT POWERS BOARD

- 1. The Joint Powers Board may employ technical, legal, administrative and clerical assistance as necessary, and engage the services of research and consulting agencies within the limits of its authorized and available funds, as may be agreed upon from time to time.
- 2. The Joint Powers Board shall adopt policies, by-laws, and regulations not inconsistent with this Agreement or the Act, as it deems necessary to carry out the business of the Joint Powers Board.

3. The Joint Powers Board shall:

- Keep minutes of all meetings during which official action is taken, as well as financial records. Such minutes and records shall be public records. Copies of all minutes shall be forwarded to the governing bodies of the Participating Agencies;
- b. Fix the time and place of regular meetings; provided, that a regular meeting shall be held at least once each month;
- c. Cooperate and solicit the advice, counsel, and recommendations of the governing bodies of Rock Springs, Green River and Sweetwater County;
- d. Report in writing annually to each Participating Agency regarding the condition of the Combined Communications Center, the results of the annual financial audit, forecasts regarding future Combined Communication Center capital needs, and potential for rate adjustments for the upcoming year. Said report shall be filed no later than January 31 in any given year. Updates to the report shall be filed each and every July, no later than July 31.
- e. Provide emergency communications to all citizens of Sweetwater County at a prorated cost to the Participating Agencies, as follows: City of Rock Springs, 37.5%; City of Green River, 25%; and, Sweetwater County, 37.5%. These percentage costs shall be for any and all costs necessary for the construction, operation, and maintenance of the Combined Communications Center, to include, but not be limited to the following: personnel salaries and benefits; operation and maintenance expenses; cash balance carryovers; insurance premiums; litigation expenses; professional services; fees for the establishment of a capital contingency or center modification and; any other expense necessary to operate, maintain and preserve the Combined Communications Center;
 - i. Salaries, wages and benefits of personnel employed by the Joint Powers Board shall be based upon the prevailing wage rates in Rock Springs, Green River, and Sweetwater County for comparable positions, and shall be comparable to the compensation and benefits received by similarly-skilled employee classifications in Rock Springs, Green River, and Sweetwater County.
- f. Promulgate rules in accordance with the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act, Wyo. Stat. § 16-3-101 et. seq.;
- g. Have all other powers and duties enumerated in or reasonably implied from the Act or the Wyoming Statutes.

4. The Joint Powers Board may:

- a. Sue and be sued in the name of the Joint Powers Board;
- b. Incur expenses;

- c. Acquire, hold, convey, lease, rent and manage property, real and personal, for the benefit of the participating agencies, either alone or jointly with public or private agencies, institutions, persons, or corporations;
- d. Employ legal counsel;
- e. Accept or reject any federal, state, or private gift, grant, bequest, or devise, money, property, or services;
- f. Utilize the services of any officer or employee of the Participating agencies with the approval of their respective governing bodies.
- g. Insure against loss of property, and obtain and hold liability insurance as necessary to protect the Combined Communications Center, employees, and members of the Joint Powers Board;
- h. Enter into financing agreements for the purchase of future capital improvements as necessary;
- i. Employ an Executive Director who will oversee and employ a necessary workforce to operate the Combined Communications Center in an appropriate, professional manner, and assure continued training and adequate staffing levels;
- j. Employ such persons as may be necessary to carry out the purpose of this Agreement;
- k. Maintain Wyoming Peace Officers Standards and Training (POST) Certified Communications Officers;

SECTION V PROJECT FINANCING

The Joint Powers Board may formulate any plan or plans for financing, purchasing and/or rehabilitating the Combined Communications Center as it may deem appropriate. The Board may solicit and obtain funds from the following, or any other legitimate and allowable sources:

- 1. The contribution of funds from one (1) or more of the participating agencies which would be available to each agency if proceeding individually;
- 2. Gifts, donations or grants of federal money;
- 3. Loans and/or grants of the State of Wyoming; and,
- 4. The issuance by the Board of its revenue bonds under the authority of Wyo. Stat. § 16-1-107(a)(iii).

SECTION VI OWNERSHIP OF THE PROJECT

Ownership of the Combined Communications Center, and all property, whether real or personal, tangible or intangible, including all contract rights in connection therewith, and any improvements to be made thereto, will be held by the Joint Powers Board and will not be further set over or alienated in any manner while bonds or any other obligation of the Joint Powers Board issued in connection therewith are outstanding, except as security payment of the principal of, premium (if

any), and interest on, such revenue bonds. The Joint Powers Board shall have 100% ownership of the Combined Communications Center project. Each participating agency shall have an interest in the services of the Combined Communications Center that is directly proportional to their respective contributions to the project, as set forth in Paragraph 3.e. of Section IV.

SECTION VII DEFINITION OF COMBINED COMMUNICATIONS CENTER AND ASSIGNMENT OF COSTS

- 1. Definition of the project for purposes of this Agreement shall be consistent with the provisions set forth herein and in accordance with any legal description and/or survey provided at such time as the permanent location for the project is established.
- 2. Any new agency joining the Joint Powers Board at a future date must bear all costs associated with joining the system and incur its pro rata share of financial responsibility in the Project, its operating costs and its incurred debt.

SECTION VIII TERMINATION DISSOLUTION AND DISTRIBUTION

Further, after satisfaction of all debts and obligations and prior to or upon termination and dissolution, the Joint Powers Board shall provide for the distribution, set over, transfer, conveyance or assignment of any facilities, improvements, betterments or other property owned or leased by the Joint Powers Board to the Participating Agencies in direct proportion to their respective contributions.

SECTION IX RESTRICTIONS

It is clearly understood that this Agreement expressly limits the Joint Powers Board to purchase, finance, rehabilitate, and operate a Combined Communications Center located in Sweetwater County, Wyoming and to provide equipment and services relative to the purchase, financing, rehabilitation, and operation of the Combined Communications Center.

SECTION X SEVERABILITY

THE TERMS, PROVISIONS AND CONDITIONS OF THIS Agreement are severable. If any term or provision of this Agreement or its application to any person or circumstance is determined by a

court of proper jurisdiction to be invalid, such invalidity shall be limited to such person, circumstance, term, or provision and shall not affect other persons, circumstances, terms or provisions which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application.

- c. Cooperate and solicit the advice, counsel, and recommendations of the governing bodies of Rock Springs, Green River and Sweetwater County;

Report in writing annually to each Participating Agency regarding the condition of the Combined Communications Center, the results of the annual financial audit, forecasts regarding future Combined Communication Center capital needs, and potential for rate adjustments for the upcoming year. Said report shall be filed no later than January 31 in any given year. Updates to the report shall be filed each and every July, no later than July 31.
- e. Provide emergency communications to all citizens of Sweetwater County at a prorated cost to the Participating Agencies, as follows: City of Rock Springs, 37.5%; City of Green River, 25%; and, Sweetwater County, 37.5%. These percentage costs shall be for any and all costs necessary for the construction, operation, and maintenance of the Combined Communications Center, to include, but not be limited to the following: personnel salaries and benefits; operation and maintenance expenses; cash balance carryovers; insurance premiums; litigation expenses; professional services; fees for the establishment of a capital contingency or center modification and; any other expense necessary to operate, maintain and preserve the Combined Communications Center;
 - i. All vacancies in the Joint Powers Board shall be made by the governing bodies of the retiring or vacating member, except as hereinafter described. Vacancies caused by disability, death, termination, or any other reason prior to the expiration of a full term shall be filled, for the remainder of the term, by the appointment of a suitable and qualified replacement by the governing body of the Participating Agency that made the Original appointment.
- 4. At the organizational meeting, the members of the Joint Powers Board shall also elect from the membership a Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer. The Secretary of the Joint Powers Board shall notify the Participating Agencies of the Joint Powers Board's organization and shall file a certificate showing its organization with the County Clerk of Sweetwater County and the Wyoming Secretary of State.
- 5. The Joint Powers Board shall meet at the call of the chairman, upon oral or written request of the majority of the Joint Powers Board members, within five (5) days after the request is given by any Participating Agency, or in any event not less than once every three (3) months.

SECTION IV POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE JOINT POWERS BOARD

- 1. The Joint Powers Board may employ technical, legal, administrative and clerical assistance as necessary, and engage the services of research and consulting agencies within the limits of its authorized and available funds, as may be agreed upon from time to time.
- 2. The Joint Powers Board shall adopt policies, by-laws, and regulations not inconsistent with this Agreement or the Act, as it deems necessary to carry out the business of the Joint Powers Board.

3. The Joint Powers Board shall:

- a. Keep minutes of all meetings during which official action is taken, as well as financial records. Such minutes and records shall be public records. Copies of all minutes shall be forwarded to the governing bodies of the Participating Agencies;
- b. Fix the time and place of regular meetings; provided, that a regular meeting shall be held at least once each month;
- c. Cooperate and solicit the advice, counsel, and recommendations of the governing bodies of Rock Springs, Green River and Sweetwater County;
- d. Report in writing annually to each Participating Agency regarding the condition of the Combined Communications Center, the results of the annual financial audit, forecasts regarding future Combined Communication Center capital needs, and potential for rate adjustments for the upcoming year. Said report shall be filed no later than January 31 in any given year. Updates to the report shall be filed each and every July, no later than July 31.
- e. Provide emergency communications to all citizens of Sweetwater County at a prorated cost to the Participating Agencies, as follows: City of Rock Springs, 37.5%; City of Green River, 25%; and, Sweetwater County, 37.5%. These percentage costs shall be for any and all costs necessary for the construction, operation, and maintenance of the Combined Communications Center, to include, but not be limited to the following: personnel salaries and benefits; operation and maintenance expenses; cash balance carryovers; insurance premiums; litigation expenses; professional services; fees for the establishment of a capital contingency or center modification and; any other expense necessary to operate, maintain and preserve the Combined Communications Center;
 - i. Salaries, wages and benefits of personnel employed by the Joint Powers Board shall be based upon the prevailing wage rates in Rock Springs, Green River, and Sweetwater County for comparable positions, and shall be comparable to the compensation and benefits received by similarly-skilled employee classifications in Rock Springs, Green River, and Sweetwater County.
- f. Promulgate rules in accordance with the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act, Wyo. Stat. § 16-3-101 et. seq.;
- g. Have all other powers and duties enumerated in or reasonably implied from the Act or the Wyoming Statutes.

4. The Joint Powers Board may:

- a. Sue and be sued in the name of the Joint Powers Board;
- b. Incur expenses;

- c. Acquire, hold, convey, lease, rent and manage property, real and personal, for the benefit of the participating agencies, either alone or jointly with public or private agencies, institutions, persons, or corporations;
- d. Employ legal counsel;
- e. Accept or reject any federal, state, or private gift, grant, bequest, or devise, money, property, or services;
- f. Utilize the services of any officer or employee of the Participating agencies with the approval of their respective governing bodies.
- g. Insure against loss of property, and obtain and hold liability insurance as necessary to protect the Combined Communications Center, employees, and members of the Joint Powers Board;
- h. Enter into financing agreements for the purchase of future capital improvements as necessary;
- i. Employ an Executive Director who will oversee and employ a necessary workforce to operate the Combined Communications Center in an appropriate, professional manner, and assure continued training and adequate staffing levels;
- j. Employ such persons as may be necessary to carry out the purpose of this Agreement;
- k. Maintain Wyoming Peace Officers Standards and Training (POST) Certified Communications Officers;

SECTION V PROJECT FINANCING

The Joint Powers Board may formulate any plan or plans for financing, purchasing and/or rehabilitating the Combined Communications Center as it may deem appropriate. The Board may solicit and obtain funds from the following, or any other legitimate and allowable sources:

- 1. The contribution of funds from one (1) or more of the participating agencies which would be available to each agency if proceeding individually;
- 2. Gifts, donations or grants of federal money;
- 3. Loans and/or grants of the State of Wyoming; and,
- 4. The issuance by the Board of its revenue bonds under the authority of Wyo. Stat. § 16-1-107(a)(iii).

SECTION VI OWNERSHIP OF THE PROJECT

Ownership of the Combined Communications Center, and all property, whether real or personal, tangible or intangible, including all contract rights in connection therewith, and any improvements to be made thereto, will be held by the Joint Powers Board and will not be further set over or alienated in any manner while bonds or any other obligation of the Joint Powers Board issued in connection therewith are outstanding, except as security payment of the principal of, premium (if

any), and interest on, such revenue bonds. The Joint Powers Board shall have 100% ownership of the Combined Communications Center project. Each participating agency shall have an interest in the services of the Combined Communications Center that is directly proportional to their respective contributions to the project, as set forth in Paragraph 3.e. of Section IV.

SECTION VII DEFINITION OF COMBINED COMMUNICATIONS CENTER AND ASSIGNMENT OF COSTS

- 1. Definition of the project for purposes of this Agreement shall be consistent with the provisions set forth herein and in accordance with any legal description and/or survey provided at such time as the permanent location for the project is established.
- 2. Any new agency joining the Joint Powers Board at a future date must bear all costs associated with joining the system and incur its pro rata share of financial responsibility in the Project, its operating costs and its incurred debt.

SECTION VIII TERMINATION DISSOLUTION AND DISTRIBUTION

The Joint Powers Board shall continue in existence until terminated as provided above. However, the Joint Powers Board and this Agreement shall not be terminated, and shall continue in existence until all outstanding obligations of the Joint Powers Board shall have been fully paid and satisfied or provision for such payment shall have been made. Further, after satisfaction of all debts and obligations and prior to or upon termination and dissolution, the Joint Powers Board shall provide for the distribution, set over, transfer, conveyance or assignment of any facilities, improvements, betterments or other property owned or leased by the Joint Powers Board to the Participating Agencies in direct proportion to their respective contributions.

SECTION IX RESTRICTIONS

It is clearly understood that this Agreement expressly limits the Joint Powers Board to purchase, finance, rehabilitate, and operate a Combined Communications Center located in Sweetwater County, Wyoming and to provide equipment and services relative to the purchase, financing, rehabilitation, and operation of the Combined Communications Center.

SECTION X SEVERABILITY

THE TERMS, PROVISIONS AND CONDITIONS OF THIS Agreement are severable. If any term or provision of this Agreement or its application to any person or circumstance is determined by a
