Commissioner Comments

Commissioner Thoman

Commissioner Thoman reported on the meetings she attended for the Joint Powers Water Board, Joint Combined Communications Elected Official orientation, Pulse Entertrpise, Dry Creek EIS Cooperative Group, Trona West Proponents, and the Sweetwater County Conservation District Board. Commissioner Thoman shared that she participated in two FFA contest presentations from the Cheyenne Chapter on endangered species and the corner crossings. Commissioner Thoman shared upcoming meetings for the week. Commissioner Thoman shared that Rocky Mountain Power has announced a rate increase of 21.6%.

Commissioner Slaughter

Commissioner Slaughter shared that he met with County Treasurer Mark Cowan and the CDC Board relative to the distribution of funding for their board, helped with the evaluation of the winter storm, and worked regular office hours. Commissioner Slaughter reported on the meetings he attended for the Hospital Finance and Audit Committee, Memorial Hospital Board of Trustees, Golden Hour Senior Center, and the Combined Communications Center elected official orientation. Commissioner Slaughter shared that he met with representatives from Ciner on the current state of Project West. Commissioner Slaughter shared that he spoke with Memorial Hospital CEO Irene Richardson and Public Works Director Gene Legerski. Commissioner Slaughter shared upcoming meetings for the week. Commissioner Slaughter read aloud the monthly report received from Public Works Director Gene Legerski.

Chairman West

Chairman West reported on the meetings he attended for the Board of Health, and the Mayor/Commission luncheon. Chairman West shared that he met with Deputy County Attorney John DeLeon as well as team members from Project West Solutions Mining. Chairman West shared that he participated with the Sheriff's Department during the Emergency Operations Center where the emergency declaration took place due to the winter storm and commended all those involved in assisting. Chairman West explained that applications are coming through for the Southwest Counseling Board and to look for an appointment to be placed on the agenda during an upcoming meeting. Chairman West explained that he has been approached on the Commission's desire to offer the Volunteer Separation Program (VSP) again this year. Following discussion relative to the reduction in staff throughout the years of offering the VSP, and explaining that departments and elected officials would have to replace the positions, the Commission concurred that it would not be beneficial to offer the VSP. Chairman West addressed the accumulation of snow, and to minimize flooding, requested Public Works Director Gene Legerski to work with the two cities to come up with a proactive approach. Chairman West explained that July 4, 2023, falls on the first Tuesday of the month and inquired what date the Commission would like to hold the meeting. Following discussion, *Commissioner Richards made a motion to move the meeting to July 5, 2023. Commissioner Slaughter seconded the motion.* Following a discussion relative to the procedures of moving the date, the motion carried.

Commissioner Richards

Commissioner Richards congratulated the WWCC men's wrestling team on taking the National Junior College Championship. Commissioner Richards reported on the meetings he attended for the Library Board, Fair Board, and Sweetwater County Combined Communications Joint Powers Board. Commissioner Richards announced that Board Chair Tom Jarvie will be resigning as he is retiring and moving and expressed appreciation for his service. Commissioner Richards shared that he met with Fire Warden Jim Zimmerman, and representatives on the current state of Project West. Commissioner Richards shared upcoming meetings for the next two weeks.

Chairman West addressed the workshop between the Fair Board and the Board of County Commissioners to be held at the Commission Chambers on March 13, 2023, at 3:00 p.m.

Commissioner Schoenfeld

Commissioner Schoenfeld expressed appreciation to the local legislators for all their work and for supporting Sweetwater County. Commissioner Schoenfeld shared her upcoming meetings for the next two weeks. Commissioner Schoenfeld expressed appreciation to the employees for their work during the winter storm. Chairman West requested an update on the Special Purpose Tax. Commissioner Schoenfeld shared that she has heard from everyone except for Superior and the two Special Districts.

Public Comment- continued

Due to being ahead of schedule, Chairman West re-opened public comments. Senator John Kolb expressed appreciation to the Commission for allowing him to give an update of the General Session. Senator Kolb shared the number of votes cast, addressed the

budget/revenue, ARPA funding, state shooting complex, and various senate file bills. Senator Kolb requested to coordinate with the Commission. Following discussion, the Commission suggested setting up a time, in an open forum, to allow everyone to move in the same direction on local issues for the benefit of Sweetwater County.

Representative Cody Wylie addressed the shooting complex opportunity and explained that community cooperation and commitment will make Sweetwater County very attractive. Representative Wylie addressed the state's general fund, various senate bills, and shared that they worked on local control issues for Sweetwater County.

Action/Presentation

Discussion on St. Christopher's Hwy

St. Christopher's Highway Coordinator Joyce Corcoran and Treasurer Reverend Steve Davis explained that St. Christopher's Highway is a travel assistance program initiated by Holy Communion Episcopal Church in 2019, and Mount Olives Lutheran Church, 1st Congregational Church, UCC Church, and St. John's Episcopal Church are involved in the program. Ms. Corcoran noted that Interstate 80 is a busy route and the need is great for travel assistance. Ms. Corcoran shared that Carbon County has also started the program due to the results of Sweetwater County. Ms. Corcoran and Reverend Davis addressed capital for St. Christopher's Highway and requested consideration for funding during the 2023-2024 budget and expressed that supporters and volunteers are needed. The Commission applauded St. Christopher's Highway for its service and recommended the organization submit its budget request to Accounting Manager Bonnie Berry to review during the budget process.

Sweetwater County Combined Communication JPB 2022 Annual Report

Sweetwater Combined Communications Joint Powers Board Executive Director Rick Hawkins and IT Director David Halter presented the 2022 annual report outlining the services provided, projects that have been completed, are in progress, and are planned for FY24. Mr. Hawkins shared the number of phone calls from 2017-2022, radio usage, protocols for calls, and active user accounts. The Commission addressed upcoming needs and expenses for the Combined Communications Joint Powers Board. Mr. Halter addressed the needs for IT infrastructure, cyber control, HVAC, building needs, and the five-year capital plan. The Commission expressed appreciation for the elected official orientation, the update, and the services provided.

Sweetwater County Conservation District Annual Report and Discussion

Sweetwater County Conservation District Chair Tom Burris, Vice-Chair Larry Folks, Secretary Stephanie Anderson, and Administrative Assistant Karen Pecheny presented the 2022 annual report and 2023 plan of work. Chair Burris reported on the district operations, land planning, local workgroups, meetings and conventions, community enhancement grants, and the Bitter Creek Drop Structure. Chair Burris addressed the relationship with Little Snake River Conservation District. The Commission expressed its appreciation for the update and encouraged the District to have community outreach to educate the voters and shared their willingness to assist in the efforts.

Break

Chairman West called for a ten-minute break.

Ratification of Subdivision Improvements Agreement Extension for Lagoon Subdivision

Planning and Zoning Director Eric Bingham requested to ratify the Subdivision Improvements Agreement Extension for Lagoon Subdivision explaining that the developer ran into supply chain issues. Following discussion, Commissioner Richards moved to ratify the Subdivision Improvements Agreement Extension for Lagoon Subdivision. Commissioner Schoenfeld seconded the motion. The motion carried.

FY 2024 Emergency Fire Suppression Account

County Fire Warden Jim Zimmerman presented the FY2024 Emergency Fire Suppression Account explaining that the FY2024 premium is based on 2022 valuations and should the county wish to participate, the initial assessment of \$169,799.88 would be due July 15, 2023, with an annual premium of \$56,599.96. Rock Springs Fire District #1 Chief Scott Kitchner was present to answer questions relative to the participation in the Emergency Fire Suppression Account. Following discussion, Commissioner Thoman moved to join the Emergency Fire Suppression Account through the Wyoming State Forestry Division and authorize the Chairman to sign. Commissioner Slaughter seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Consider the 2023 Volunteer Fire Assistance Grant Agreement

Grants Manager Krisena Marchal and County Fire Warden Jim Zimmerman presented the 2023 Volunteer Fire Assistance Grant Agreement explaining that the VFA program provides grant funding through the Wyoming State Forestry Division to organize, equip, and train small, local fire departments in rural communities and require a 50 percent cash match on allowable project costs. Ms. Marchal noted that the required cash match was not approved in the grants project budget and by agreement, the City of Green River Fire Department provides fire protection services within specified areas in Sweetwater County that are reimbursed under a fee schedule and is not an eligible entity under the VFA program and recommended to not approve the agreement. *Commissioner Thoman moved to accept the VFA Agreement. Commissioner Richards seconded the motion.* Following discussion relative to county personnel circumventing the grant procedures, the motion was defeated with all Commissioners opposing.

County ATM Agreement

Sheriff Grossnickle presented a request to install an ATM to be located at the Justice Center lobby and presented an Agreement between Sweetwater County and The American Legion Tom Whitmore Post 28. Following discussion, Commissioner Schoenfeld moved to approve, and authorize the Chairman to sign, the ATM Location Agreement and for the ATM to be located at the Justice Center as presented. Commissioner Richards requested to amend the motion to allow for a duration of a two-year/two-year agreement. Commissioner Thoman seconded the amended motion. Commissioner Richards seconded the original motion. Both of the motions carried.

Modification of Grant or Agreement between the US Forest Service and Sweetwater County

Sheriff Grossnickle presented the modification of the Grant or Agreement between Sweetwater County and the US Forest Service, Ashley National Forest explaining that the modification is an increase in funding obligations by \$6,000.00 from \$33,544.90 to \$39,544.90. Following discussion, Commissioner Thoman moved to modify the Agreement between the US

Forest Service and Sweetwater County and authorize the Chairman to sign. Commissioner Slaughter seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Cooperative Agreement between WYDOT and Sweetwater County for Bridge ENX on CR#62 Clay Basin Road

Public Works Director Gene Legerski presented the Cooperative Agreement between WYDOT and Sweetwater County for Federal Project HI-BFP CN04114- Bridge over Red Creek Structure No. ENX, RM 5.80, Sweetwater County. Following discussion, Commissioner Slaughter moved to accept the Cooperative Agreement between WYDOT and Sweetwater County and authorize the Chairman to sign. Commissioner Thoman seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Approval of the Facility Use Agreement between Casper Electric and Sweetwater County

Public Works Director Gene Legerski presented the Facility Use Agreement between Casper Electric and Sweetwater County to utilize part of the yard located at 95 Unita Drive, Green River Wyoming for the WYDOT HSIP-190043 Green River Streets (Unita & 2nd/Riverview/Monroe). Following discussion, Chairman West entertained a motion to approve Casper Electric to use the Green River Road and Bridge shop grounds as a staging area for their WYDOT project and allow the Public Works Director to execute the Facility Use Agreement once all of the requirements have been met. *Commissioner Schoenfeld so moved. Commissioner Richards seconded the motion.* The motion carried.

Request Approval of Resolution 23-03-CC-03- Withdrawing Approval of Infectious Disease Control and Emergency Leave Policy

Human Resource Director Garry McLean presented Resolution 23-03-CC-03, a resolution withdrawing approval of the infectious disease control and emergency leave policy. Following discussion, *Commissioner Schoenfeld moved to approve Resolution 23-03-CC-03*, and withdraw approval of the infectious disease control and emergency leave policy. Commissioner Richards seconded the motion. The motion carried.

WHEREAS, on June 17, 2022, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), gave first approval of the Covid-19 vaccination for children over the age of 6 months, and;

WHEREAS, on September 19, 2022, President Joe Biden announced that the pandemic was over, and;

WHEREAS, December 29, 2022, was the last date a County employee used the paid Emergency Leave Act (ELA) leave, as authorized in the Infectious Disease Control and Emergency Leave Policy, and;

WHEREAS, The Family First Corona Virus Response Act (FFCRA) has expired.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SWEETWATER COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS that the Board withdraws approval of the Infectious Disease Control and Emergency Leave Act Policy.

Contract Terms: Original Agreement for Professional Services by and between ST+B Engineering and Memorial Hospital of Sweetwater County (client) dated January 11th, 2021. All provisions of the referenced Agreement and/or Agreement for Professional Services shall remain in full force and effect except as modified herein.

Circumstances of Additional Services Request:

This proposal is to provide additional engineering services to address equipment determined to be overdutied as a result of the base scope of services short-circuit study. Utility data was taken at infinite values per the guidance of the IEEE white paper entitled "Impact of Available Fault Current Variations on Arc-Flash Calculations". The goal of this proposal is to obtain more precise utility data to re-evaluate the previously determined short circuit, coordination, and arc flash results; this will hopefully reduce or even eliminate some equipment currently designated as overdutied as well as lower the arc flash results for equipment closer to the point of service.

Scope of Work

- 1. Update utility available fault current contribution in the SKM model.
 - a. This will either involve additional modeling back to the Rocky Mountain Power (RMP) substation, or fault current values provided by RMP at the point of service for the hospital. For additional modeling, the following information will need to be determined:

- Size, length, quantity per phase, and material (copper or aluminum) of RMP's overhead wire starting at the point of service and going back to the RMP substation.
- ii. Nameplate data of transformer in RMP substation providing power to the circuit that feeds MHSC.
- iii. (Optional) overcurrent protective device (OCPD) information owned by RMP starting at the point of service and going back to the RMP substation. This includes all OCPD's to the point of the RMP transformer supplying power to this circuit.
- 2. (Optional) Extend study to include known areas / equipment in the facility not captured in the SKM model as detailed in the written report, Section 1.3 item 5.
- 3. (Optional) Evaluate potential code violations regarding the fire pumps in the facility as described in the written report, Section 1.3 item 6.
- 4. (Optional) Evaluate potential code violations regarding under-protected cables and under-protected transformers as shown in the written report, Section 1.3 Tables 1.3.1 and 1.3.2.
- 5. Rerun short circuit, equipment evaluation, coordination, and arc flash analysis utilizing SKM Power Tools software.







RE: Purchasing of a Used Pickup

The Sweetwater County Emergency Management Department was awarded an EMPG/ARPA Grant in the amount of \$25,100.00 and was a 50/50 match making the total grant of \$50,200.00 for the purchase of a vehicle to be used for the operations of the department.

As you all are aware of the supply chain issues in getting a new vehicle in a timely manner and by the deadline of the grant which is September 2023, we are asking the Board to approve the purchase of a used vehicle up to the maximum grant allowance.

The county's current purchasing policy does not address purchasing of used equipment, however there is a section within the drafted updated policy that isn't complete at this time that we would like the Board to consider for this purchase. They are as follows:

Purchase of Used Equipment

- The purchase of used equipment shall not be competitive unless it is possible to compare like attributes for a fair and open competitive process. Written justification as to why County would purchase used as opposed to new.
- Used mobile equipment and vehicles are to have fundamental basic specifications and must pass inspection by the County's Fleet Department for mechanical defects and condition of the equipment.
- Specifications must pass both requisitioner and purchasing approval for objectivity.
- Under no circumstances shall an unauthorized employee offer to purchase used equipment from an individual, including an employee of the County.
- Purchase of used equipment over the threshold amount of competitive bids must have Board Approval before solicitation and the Board shall approve maximum amount allowed to enter into purchase agreement.

The Purchasing Department will work with Sheriff Department (Emergency Management) to compile a basic specifications of the vehicle and then will silicate quotes from the vehicle dealerships. Award will be based on price, condition of vehicle and inspection by the Fleet Department.

Once vehicle has been purchased an update will be present to the Board at your regular schedule meeting following the purchase.





A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR GROUP CAMPING

WHEREAS, W.S. § 18-2-101(a)(iv) provides that Sweetwater County ("COUNTY") may make contracts and perform other acts relating to the property of the county. W.S. §§ 18-3-504(a)(i), (a)(v) provide that each board of county commissioners may make such orders concerning the property of the county as they deem expedient and care for the county property;

WHEREAS, certain Sweetwater County Parks are managed by the Sweetwater County Public Works Department, Facilities Parks Division effective, July 1, 2019 pursuant to Resolution No. 19-07-CC-01;

WHEREAS, Sweetwater County Parks operational support includes, but is not limited to services from payroll, accounting/auditing, HR, legal, the Engineering Department, the Purchasing Department, the County's Road and Bridge Department, and the Vehicle Maintenance Department. Equipment support includes, but is not limited to tractors, mowers, pressure washers, trucks, snowplows, tools, etc.;

WHEREAS, the Sweetater County Public Works Department manage the County's eleven separate park complexes, which include:

- 1. Mesa Park,
- 2. Pioneer Trails Picnic Grounds,
- 3. Archery Range,
- 4. Shooting Range,
- 5. Trap Club,
- 6. Crossroads West Park,
- 7. Arrowhead Springs Park,
- 8. Reliance Park,
- 9. Sweetwater County Park,
- 10. Big Sandy Park, and
- 11. Bicentiennial Park;

WHEREAS, the Sweetwater County Board of County Commissioners has determined that the unique characteristics of Pioneer Trails Picnic Grounds including, but not limited to the pavilions, location near the Green River, and size provide an opportunity

for group camping in addition to the various group camping sites in Sweetwater County; and

WHEREAS, management of Pioneer Trails Picnic Grounds can be accomplished by and is rationally related to establishing a deposit, fee, insurance requirements, a maximum number of overnights allowed, a reservation requirement, fire regulations, and that reservations be subject to availablity and force majeure.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF SWEETWATER, STATE OF WYOMING:

- 1. Effective June 1, 2023 through May 31, 2024, public recreational use of Pioneer Trails Picnic Grounds shall include group (more than 10 people) overnight camping subject to first obtaining a reservation/permit through the Sweetwater County Public Works Department. Said reservation shall require completing the Sweetwater County Facility Use Agreement and will be considered on a first come, first serve basis.
- 2. A deposit in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) shall be required in the event of damage or cleaning is required for each reservation. USERS shall remain responsible for damages or cleaning in excess of the deposit amount.
- 3. A fee in the amount of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) per stay shall be required as reasonable recovery of costs for the services provided.
- 4. At all times during the use of Pioneer Trails Picnic Grounds, USER will be required to have a policy of comprehensive liability insurance including public liability, body injury, and property damage written by a company licensed to do business in the State of Wyoming, covering the use contemplated by this agreement with combined single limits of no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$3,000,000 aggregate. The USER shall name the COUNTY, including its elected officials, officers, agents, volunteers and employees as Additional Insureds for that purpose and use of this Agreement, including related expenses and actual attorney fees in any way sustained or alleged to have been sustained, directly or indirectly. USER agrees that the insurance will be primary coverage and will contain no terms allowing the insurer to be subrogated to the rights of any injured or damaged person or entity insofar as the person or entity may have claims against the COUNTY. The USER may also be required to maintain worker's compensation insurance to meet the requirements of the Wyoming Worker's Disability Compensation Act where applicable. Certificates of

Insurance evidencing such insurance coverage shall be provided to the COUNTY.

- 5. Overnights shall be limited to a maximum of three consecutive (3) overnights per reservation;
- 6. Group camping shall abide by and be subject to the Bureau of Land Management fire restrictions at the time of the reservation. There shall be absolutely no gathering of firewood from the grounds. All fuel must be provided by the campers. Fires may only be in the County provided and designated fire ring.
- 7. All permitees and participants must comply with the Civil Rights Act of 1964 as modified or amended. Permitees and participants cannot prohibit or restrict, directly or indirectly, the use of any part of the property or any of the facilities thereon by any person because of such person's race, creed, color, sex or national origin.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN SWEETWATER COUNTY AND CONTRACTOR

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AGREEMENT BETWEEN CONTRACTOR AND SWEETWATER COUNTY

This agreement is dated as of the 21st day of March in the year 2023 between Sweetwater County, Wyoming (hereinafter called the Owner) and R&D Sweeping & Asphalt Maintenance, LC (hereinafter called the Contractor).

Article 1 Scope of Work

The Contractor shall complete all Work as specified and as indicated in the Contract Documents. The Work is generally described as follows:

Crack sealant to be applied on all cracks greater than 1/8" in width on 10.8 miles of Various County Roads.

All work shall be completed as per the 2010 Edition of the Wyoming Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction.

Article 2 Director of Public Works

The project has been designed by:

Sweetwater County Director of Public Works 80 West Flaming Gorge Way, Suite 23 Green River, WY 82935

Who is hereafter called the Director of Public Works and who is to act as the Owner's representative, assume all duties and responsibilities and have the rights and authority assigned to the Director of Public Works in the Contract Documents in connection with completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents.

Article 3 Contract Time

- 3.1 All Work shall be completed and ready for final payment by December 1st, 2023.
- 3.2 <u>Liquidated Damages:</u> The Owner and the Contractor recognize that time is of the essence for this Agreement and that the Owner will suffer financial loss if the Work is not completed within the times specified in paragraph 3.1 above plus any extensions thereof allowed or as specified in the General Conditions. They also recognize that the delays, expense, and difficulties involved in proving in a legal or arbitration preceding the actual loss suffered by the Owner if the Work is not completed on time. Accordingly, instead of requiring any such proof, the Owner and the Contractor agree that as liquidated damages for delay (but not as a penalty) the contractor shall pay the Owner \$250.00 for each day that expires after the time specified in paragraph 3.1 for completion until the Work is complete to the satisfaction of the Owner / Director of Public Works.

Article 4 Contract Price

The Owner shall pay the Contractor for completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents and the unit prices stated in the bid form.

Article 5 Payment Procedures

The Contractor shall submit Applications for Payment in accordance with the Specifications. The Director of Public Works will process Applications for Payment as provided in the Specifications.

5.1 <u>Progress Payments:</u> The Owner shall make progress payments based on the Contract Price on the basis of the Contractor's Application for Payment. All progress payments will be on the basis of the progress of the Work, measured in the field, and in conformance with the unit prices stated in the Bid Form.

The Contractor will submit progress or final payment invoice and voucher based on the approved and accepted quantities in the bid proposal minus five percent (5%) retainage amount 12 days before the regular County Commissioner's meeting held on the 1st or 3rd Tuesday of the month.

Payments to the Contractor will be made within ten (10) days after the County Commissioner's meeting following the receipt by the Owner of the Engineer's approval of payment thereof or as soon thereafter as the applicable grant monies are received by the Owner.

- 5.2 The retainage payment of five percent (5%) will be submitted to the Board of County Commissioners at their next regularly scheduled meeting 41 days after the first notice of completion and acceptance of the work has been advertised in the newspaper, provided the following conditions have been met:
- Completion of Punch List Items
- Submission of Warranties (quarantees) and similar provisions of contract documents.
- Final cleaning of the work.
- Submission of lien waivers from contractor, subcontractors, and suppliers.
- Submission of proof, satisfactory to the owner, that all taxes, fees, and similar obligations of the contractors have been paid.
- Removal of surplus materials, rubbish, and similar elements.

Article 6 Interest

All monies not paid when due as provided for in the Specifications shall bear interest at the maximum rate allowed by law at the place of the Project.

Article 7 Contractor's Representations

In order to induce the Owner to enter in this Agreement, the Contractor makes the following representations:

7.1 The Contractor has familiarized itself with the nature and extent of the Contract Documents, Work, site, locality, and all local conditions and laws and Regulations that in any manner may affect cost, progress, performance or furnishing of the Work.

- 7.2 The Contractor has obtained and carefully studied or assumes responsibility for obtaining and carefully studying all such examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, reports, and studies (in addition to or to supplement those referred to in paragraph 7.1 above) which pertain to the subsurface or physical conditions at or contiguous to the site or otherwise may affect the cost, progress, performance, or furnishing of the Work at the contract Price, within the Contract Price, within the Contract Time, and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the contract Documents; and no additional examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, reports, studies, or similar information or data are or will be required by the Contractor for such purposes.
- 7.3 The Contractor has reviewed and checked all information and data shown or indicated on the Contract documents with respect to existing Underground Facilities at or contiguous to the site and assumes responsibility for the accurate location of said Underground Facilities. No additional examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, reports, studies, or similar information or data in respect of said Underground Facilities are or will be required by the Contractor in order to perform and furnish the Work at the Contract Price, within the Contract Time and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract Documents, including the provisions in the Specifications.
- 7.4 The Contractor has correlated the results of all such observations, examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, reports, and studies with the terms and conditions of the Contract Documents.
- 7.5 The Contractor has given the Director of Public Works written notice of all conflicts, errors, or discrepancies that he has discovered in the Contract Documents and the written resolution thereof by the Director of Public Works is acceptable to the Contractor.

- 1. A right-of-way is hereby granted pursuant to Title V of the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of October 21, 1976 (90 Stat. 2776; 43 U.S.C. 1761).
- 2. Nature of Interest:
 - a. By this instrument, the holder:

Sweetwater County 80 West Flaming Gorge Way, Suite 23 Green River, Wyoming 82935

receives a right to construct, operate, maintain, and terminate an existing access road previously authorized under grant of right-of-way approved on November 16, 1982, and renewed on November 16, 2002, on public lands described as follows:

Sixth Principal Meridian, Lincoln County, Wyoming T. 20 N., R. 101 W., sec. 28, NE1/4SE1/4.

- b. The right-of-way or permit area granted herein is 150 feet wide, 670 feet long and contains 2.31 acres, more or less.
- c. This instrument shall terminate on December 31, 2043, 20 years, more or less, from its effective date unless, prior thereto, it is relinquished, abandoned, terminated, or modified pursuant to the terms and conditions of this instrument or of any applicable Federal law or regulation.
- d. This instrument may be renewed. If renewed, the right-of-way or permit shall be subject to the regulations existing at the time of the renewal and any other terms and conditions that the authorized officer deems necessary to protect the public interest.
- e. Notwithstanding the expiration of this instrument or any renewal thereof, early relinquishment, abandonment, or termination, the provisions of this instrument, to the extent applicable, shall continue in effect and shall be binding on the holder, its successors, or assigns, until they have fully satisfied the obligations and/or liabilities accruing herein before or on account of the expiration, or prior termination, of the grant.

3. Rental

For and in consideration of the rights granted, the holder agrees to pay the Bureau of Land Management fair market value rental as determined by the authorized officer unless specifically exempted from such payment by regulation. Provided, however, that the rental may be adjusted by the authorized officer, whenever necessary, to reflect changes in the fair market rental value as determined by the application of sound business management principles, and so far as practicable and feasible, in accordance with comparable commercial practices.

4. Terms and Conditions:

- a. This grant or permit is issued subject to the holder's compliance with all applicable regulations contained in Title 43 Code of Federal Regulations part 2800 and 2880.
- b. Upon grant termination by the authorized officer, all improvements shall be removed from the public lands within 90 days, or otherwise disposed of as provided in paragraph (4)(d) or as directed by the authorized officer.
- c. Each grant issued for a term of 20 years or more shall, at a minimum, be reviewed by the authorized officer at the end of the 20th year and at regular intervals thereafter not to exceed 10 years. Provided, however, that a right-of-way or permit granted herein may be reviewed at any time deemed necessary by the authorized officer.
- d. The stipulations, plans, maps, or designs set forth in Exhibit A dated, May 9, 2022, attached hereto, are incorporated into, and made a part of this grant instrument as fully and effectively as if they were set forth herein in their entirety.
- e. Failure of the holder to comply with applicable law or any provision of this right-of-way grant or permit shall constitute grounds for suspension or termination thereof.
- f. The holder shall perform all operations in a good and workmanlike manner so as to ensure protection of the environment and the health and safety of the public.
- g. The holder shall contact the authorized officer at least <u>FIVE</u> days prior to the anticipated start of construction and/or any surface disturbing activities. The authorized officer may require and schedule a preconstruction conference with the holder prior to the holder's commencing construction and/or surface disturbing activities on the right-of-way. The holder and/or his representative shall attend this conference. The holder's contractor, or agents involved with construction and/or any surface disturbing activities associated with the right-of-way, shall also attend this conference to review the stipulations of the grant including the plan of development.
- h. In the event that the public land underlying the right-of-way encompassed in this grant, or a portion thereof, is conveyed out of Federal ownership and administration of the right-of-way or the land underlying the right-of-way is not being reserved to the United States in the patent/deed and/or the right-of-way is not within a right-of-way corridor being reserved to the United States in the patent/deed, the United States waives any right it has to administer the

right-of-way, or portion thereof, within the conveyed land under Federal laws, statutes, and regulations, including the regulations at 43 CFR Part 2800, including any rights to have the holder apply to BLM for amendments, modifications, or assignments and for BLM to approve or recognize such amendments, modifications, or assignments. At the time of conveyance, the patentee/grantee, and their successors and assigns, shall succeed to the interests of the United States in all matters relating to the right-of-way, or portion thereof, within the conveyed land and shall be subject to applicable State and local government laws, statutes, and ordinances. After conveyance, any disputes concerning compliance with the use and the terms and conditions of the right-of-way shall be considered a civil matter between the patentee/grantee and the right-of-way Holder.

- i. A bond, acceptable to the authorized officer, shall be furnished by the holder before execution of the grant or at such earlier date as may be specified by the authorized officer. The amount of this bond shall be determined by a Reclamation Cost Estimate submitted by the holder and approved by the authorized officer. This bond must be maintained in effect until removal of improvements and restoration of the right-of-way have been accepted by the authorized officer.
- j. The holder agrees that all monies deposited with the authorized officer as security for holder's performance of the terms and conditions of this grant may, upon failure on the holder's part to fulfill any of the requirements herein set forth or made a part hereof, be retained by the United States to be applied as far as may be needed to satisfaction of the holder's obligations assumed hereunder, without prejudice whatever to any other rights and remedies of the United States.
- k. Should the bond delivered under this grant become unsatisfactory to the authorized officer, the holder shall, within 30 days of demand, furnish a new bond.
- 1. The United States, its officers and employees shall be held harmless from and indemnified against any damage, injury, or liability resulting from the construction, operation, or maintenance of the facility being authorized by this right-of-way grant, including but not limited to any liability which the United States may have as owner of the land which is the subject of the right-of-way grant.
- m. Construction activity and surface disturbance will be prohibited during the period of February 1 through July 31 for the protection of raptor nesting. Any exceptions to this requirement must have prior written approval from the authorized officer.
- n. Construction activity and surface disturbance will be prohibited during the period of November 15 through April 30 for the protection of big game crucial winter range. Any exceptions to this requirement must have prior written approval from the authorized officer.
- o. Seed shall be planted using a drill equipped with a depth regulator to ensure proper depth of planting where drilling is possible. The seed mixture shall be evenly and uniformly planted over the disturbed area (smaller/heavier seeds have a tendency to drop to the bottom of the drill and are planted first.) The holder shall take appropriate measures to ensure this does not

occur. Where drilling is not possible, seed shall be broadcast and the area shall be raked or chained to cover the seed. When broadcasting the seed, the pounds per acre noted below are to be doubled. The seeding will be repeated until a satisfactory stand is established as determined by the authorized officer. Evaluation of growth will not be made before completion of the first growing season after seeding. The authorized officer is to be notified a minimum of 5 working days prior to seeding of the project.

- p. The holder shall construct, operate, and maintain the facilities, improvements, and structures within this right-of-way in strict conformity with the plan of development which was approved and made part of the grant on November 16, 1982. Any relocation, additional construction, or use that is not in accord with the approved plan of development, shall not be initiated without the prior written approval of the authorized officer. A copy of the complete right-of-way grant, including all stipulations and approved plan of development, shall be made available on the right-of-way area during construction, operation, and termination to the authorized officer. Noncompliance with the above will be grounds for an immediate temporary suspension of activities if it constitutes a threat to public health and safety or the environment.
- q. The holder shall designate a representative who shall have the authority to act upon and to implement instructions from the authorized officer. The holder's representative shall be available for communication with the authorized officer within a reasonable time when construction or other surface disturbing activities are underway.
- r. Any cultural and/or paleontological resource (historic or prehistoric site or object) discovered by the holder, or any person working on his behalf, on public or Federal land shall be

immediately reported to the authorized officer. Holder shall suspend all operations in the immediate area of such discovery until written authorization to proceed is issued by the authorized officer. An evaluation of the discovery will be made by the authorized officer to determine appropriate actions to prevent the loss of significant cultural or scientific values. The holder will be responsible for the cost of evaluation and any decision as to proper mitigation measures will be made by the authorized officer after consulting with the holder.


- s. Use of pesticides shall comply with the applicable Federal and state laws. Pesticides shall be used only in accordance with their registered uses and within limitations imposed by the Secretary of the Interior. Prior to the use of pesticides, the holder shall obtain from the authorized officer written approval of a plan showing the type and quantity of material to be used, pests to be controlled, method of application, location of storage and disposal of containers, and any other information deemed necessary by the authorized officer. Emergency use of pesticides shall be approved in writing by the authorized officer prior to such use.
- t. The holder shall be responsible for weed control on disturbed areas within the limits of the right-of-way. The holder is responsible for consultation with the authorized officer and/or local authorities for acceptable weed control methods (within limits imposed in the grant stipulations).
- The holder shall protect all survey monuments found within the right-of-way. Survey u. monuments include, but are not limited to, General Land Office and Bureau of Land Management Cadastral Survey Corners, reference corners, witness points, U.S. Coastal and Geodetic benchmarks and triangulation stations, military control monuments, and recognizable civil (both public and private) survey monuments. In the event of obliteration or disturbance of any of the above, the holder shall immediately report the incident, in writing, to the authorized office and the respective installing authority if known. Where General Land Office or Bureau of Land Management right-of-way monuments or references are obliterated during operations, the holder shall secure the services of a registered land surveyor or a Bureau cadastral surveyor to restore the disturbed monuments and reference using surveying procedures found in the Manual of Surveying Instructions for the Survey of the Public Lands in the United States, latest edition. The holder shall record such survey in the appropriate county and send a copy to the authorized officer. If the Bureau cadastral surveyors or other Federal surveyors are used to restore the disturbed survey monument, the holder shall by responsible for the survey cost.
- v. No construction or routine maintenance activities shall be performed during periods when the soil is too wet to adequately support construction equipment or when watershed damage is likely to occur. If such equipment creates ruts in excess of four inches deep, the soil shall be deemed too wet to adequately support construction equipment. Frozen soil or soil mixed with snow will not be used in construction.
- w. The holder shall meet Federal, State, and local emission standards for air quality.
- x. Construction-related traffic shall be restricted to routes approved by the authorized officer. New access roads or cross-country vehicle travel will not be permitted unless prior written approval is given by the authorized officer. Authorized roads used by the holder shall be

rehabilitated or maintained when construction activities are complete as approved by the authorized officer.

- y Except rights-of-way expressly authorizing a road after construction of the facility is completed, the holder shall not use the right-of-way as a road for purposes other than routine maintenance as determined necessary by the authorized officer in consultation with the holder.
- z. Prior to termination of the right-of-way, the holder shall contact the authorized officer to arrange a joint inspection of the right-of-way. This inspection will be held to agree to an acceptable termination (and rehabilitation) plan. This plan shall include, but is not limited to, removal of facilities, drainage structures, or surface material, recontouring, topsoiling, or seeding. The authorized officer must approve the plan in writing prior to the holder's commencement of any termination activities.



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Funding for County funded entities.

History;

In the past County entities have presented to the BOCC and requested funding. Once an amount of funding was agreed upon there was a calculation made that took into account vehicle registration fees and a mil percentage to attempt to fund the entity for the amount approved. This mil amount was then entered into the system and as the mills were collected they were distributed by the Treasurer's Office each month.

Current policies;

Currently the County has two different policies for paying these entities. The first follows the previous historical payments. The second is an MOU the BOCC made with the Fair Board to fund a specific amount regardless of the mil levy.

Potential issues with each method;

There are potential issues that have been identified with both issues. They are;

- Entities with a mill levy may receive more or less funding then requested if tax revenues are higher or lower than projections.
- Entities with an MOU fixed amount may receive more funding than they otherwise would have if revenues were lower than expected.

Suggested Resolution;

In order to resolve these issues the Treasurer is suggesting the following;

- The County collect all 12 Mils.
- Each entity requesting funding will be designated a specified amount to be funded during each budget season.
- The amount funded will be divided into 12 equal payments and distributed monthly to each entity.
- In the case of lower than expected County revenue receipts the County Treasurer shall determine the percentage the revenues are short on a quarterly basis, and future payments to the funded entities will be lowered by the percentage determined.

Sweetwater County requests to participate as a cooperating agency with respect to the Bureau of Land Management's ("BLM") Programmatic Environmental Impact Statement to Evaluate Utility-Scale Solar Energy Planning and Amend Resource Management Plans ("RMPs") for Renewable Energy Development. The County received the BLM's letter requesting County's interest and eligibility to participate as a cooperating agency on March 7, 2023. Pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 1501.8, the County requests to participate as a cooperating agency and provides the following information to support its request.

I. Cooperating Agency Criteria

The proposal to amend RMPs for updated utility-scale solar energy development will be evaluated according to the National Environmental Policy Act ("NEPA"). The Council on Environmental Quality ("CEQ") regulations and guidance requires the inclusion of non-federal government agents when they have "jurisdiction by law and or special expertise with respect to reasonable alternatives or significant environmental, social or economic impacts associat[ed] with a proposed action." CEQ Memorandum, *Designation of Non-Federal Agencies to be Cooperating Agencies in Implementing the Procedure of the NEPA*, at 1 (July 28, 1999); 40 C.F.R. §§ 1501.8(a), 1508.1(e). The regulations addressing cooperating agencies status implement the NEPA mandate that federal agencies conduct the NEPA process "in cooperation with State and local governments." 42 U.S.C. §§ 4331(a), 4332(2); CEQ Memorandum, *Cooperating Agencies in Implementing the Procedural Requirements of the NEPA*, at 1 (Jan. 30, 2002). Sweetwater County meets the criteria set out in the CEQ rules and explained in the 2002 CEQ Memorandum.

A. Jurisdiction by law: 40 C.F.R. § 1508.1(n)

The CEQ regulations define jurisdiction by law to mean "agency authority to approve, veto, or finance all or part of the proposal." 40 C.F.R. §1508.1(n); CEQ Memorandum, Cooperating Agencies in Implementing the Procedural Requirements of the NEPA, at 4 (Jan. 30, 2002).

Sweetwater County enjoys a broad range of planning authority including "[t]o promote the public health, safety, morals and general welfare of the county [and] each board of county commissioners may regulate . . .the use, condition of use or occupancy of lands for residence, recreation, agriculture, industry, commerce, public use and other purposes in the unincorporated area of the county." Wyo. Stat. § 18-5-201. Sweetwater County implements this authority through its comprehensive land use plan.

The RMP amendments to designate certain solar energy zones that are suitable for utility-scale solar energy development and identifying exclusion areas will affect the County's economy, other resource development, and multiple uses within Sweetwater County. BLM land use plans and decisions dictate major economic drivers in Sweetwater County, including energy and mineral resource development, renewable development, livestock grazing, transportation across public lands, and recreation. Sweetwater County will support renewable energy so long as it conforms to County zoning (see Sweetwater County Zoning Resolution Section 7 and 17) and the BLM fully discloses and analyzes the environmental impacts. Sweetwater County Federal Lands and Resources Plan at 7.2.6.6. Thus, Sweetwater County has jurisdiction over many of the impacts of any RMP amendment for utility-scale solar energy development and meets the requirements for cooperating agency status.

B. Special Expertise: 40 C.F.R. § 1508.1(ee)

The CEQ regulations define special expertise as a "statutory responsibility, agency mission, or related program experience." 40 C.F.R. §1508.1(ee). The CEQ guidance also looks to whether a non-federal agency has expertise as to the alternatives in the EIS or the significant environmental, social, or economic impacts associated with the proposed action. CEQ Memorandum, *Cooperating Agencies in Implementing the Procedural Requirements of the NEPA*, at 2, 4 (Jan. 30, 2002). A non-federal agency that has "expertise regarding the proposed actions' relationship to the objectives of regional, State and local land use plans, policies, and controls (1502.16(c))" would be allowed cooperating agency status. *Id.* at 4.

Under Wyoming law, "a board of county commissioners shall be deemed to have special expertise on all subject matters for which it has statutory responsibility, including but not limited to, all subject matters directly or indirectly related to the health, safety, welfare, custom, culture

and socio-economic viability of a county." Wyo. Stat. § 18-5-208(a)(emphasis added). Because Sweetwater County has officially adopted a comprehensive plan and a federal lands and resources plan pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 18-5-202(b), Sweetwater County "may participate in efforts to coordinate the plan[s] with federal agencies as provided in [FLPMA], . . . [NFMA] and any other federal statute which provides for coordination with local governments and federal regulations adopted pursuant to those acts." Wyo. Stat. § 18-5-208(b).

As mentioned above, Sweetwater County will directly feel the impacts of decisions that may influence the timing, amount, and general nature of renewable and nonrenewable development in Sweetwater County and adjacent counties. Not only are county residents energy industry employees and contractors, but Sweetwater County has worked with BLM on various federal projects dealing with resource development.

Sweetwater County has also been a cooperating agency on a number of projects for the Bureau of Land Management, including various instances where the RMPs were amended. It has clear interest in ensuring that the BLM complies with federal laws and policies, and that the proposed action is consistent with Sweetwater County's comprehensive plan and its federal lands and resources plan.

Sweetwater County is well-versed in the rules and process, and is prepared to directly address the relevant factual and policy issues. See CEQ Memorandum, Cooperating Agencies in Implementing the Procedural Requirements of the NEPA, at 4-5 (Jan. 30, 2002). The County will only strengthen the BLM's analysis of the impacts of designating solar energy zones or exclusions areas, and will do so within the NEPA framework.

We look forward to receipt of the MOU for Sweetwater County. The primary contact for this project will be Sweetwater County Commissioner Mary E. Thoman, Planning & Zoning Director Eric Bingham, and Counsel Danielle Bettencourt.

Board Chairman and Commissioners on the Agriculture, Water, State and Public Lands Committee,

Attached is an invitation from the BLM regarding its programmatic environmental impact statement (PEIS) and resource management plan amendments for utility-scale solar on public lands. The letter is dated February 24, 2023, but many counties received it on March 6th, today, or not at all. Since the BLM has requested that an email be sent **by March 10, 2023**, I believed it would be important to bring it to your attention if your county would like to participate. However, it is my understanding that should your county determine it wants to participate as a cooperating agency after this deadline you should still be able to do so.

For those wishing to participate, the response requires counties provide three things in the email to solar@blm.gov

- 1. A description of how you have jurisdiction by law. Your authority stems from Wyoming Statute § 18-5-208.
- 2. The invitation requests that counties provide the BLM a "description of your desired level of involvement." I am not entirely sure what level of involvement means, and the letter does not clarify any "levels". If counties want to participate, I would recommend that counties request to be involved to the fullest extent authorized under the laws governing cooperating agencies.
- 3. Finally, the BLM requests you provide a primary representative/contact for the project. While I understand that managing a multi-state EIS has practical concerns for the BLM, relying solely on a single individual to receive and disseminate information also poses

practical challenges for elected county officials. You may wish to add a backup/secondary contact for this project.

Not every county will feel compelled to participate in this process. For those that choose to participate, I will do my best to serve as a resource. If you have any questions, feel free to reach out. I hope you all had a great commissioner day.
